409.14512, F.S.; creating the People's Relief Program within the Department of Children and Families; providing a purpose for the program; providing legislative intent; requiring the program to provide assistance in the form of grants to certain residents under specified conditions; providing program eligibility requirements for individuals; requiring the department to adopt specified rules; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 409.14512, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

409.14512 People's Relief Program.

- (1) The People's Relief Program is created within the department. The purpose of the program is to provide residents of this state who are experiencing economic hardship with assistance for everyday expenses, such as housing, childcare, and health care.
- (2) It is the intent of the Legislature that this program ensure long-term financial stability for individuals and families who reside in this state by offering grants to assist residents experiencing economic hardship.
- (3) Subject to appropriation by the Legislature, the program shall provide assistance in the form of grants to residents experiencing economic hardship. Such grants must be

available to residents if any of the following occurs:

- (a) Utility costs rise above a specified percentage of average household income.
- (b) Property insurance premiums rise above a specified threshold.
- (c) Statewide unemployment rises above a specified percentage.
 - (d) An economic decline causes widespread hardship.
- (e) A natural disaster leads to the declaration of a state of emergency.
- (4) To be eligible for assistance under the program, an individual must:
- (a) Have been a resident of this state for at least 1 year before applying;
- (b) Provide evidence of a change in circumstances which hinders or prohibits the individual from being able to fulfill pending financial obligations related to utility, property insurance, childcare, or health care expenses; and
- (c) Provide documentation of utility costs, property insurance premiums, childcare expenses, or health care expenses.
- (5) The department shall adopt rules to implement this section. The rules must, at a minimum, include all of the following:
- (a) An application that must be available on the department's website.
- (b) The specified thresholds for the conditions in paragraphs (3)(a)-(d).
 - (c) The procedures for awarding and disbursing the grants.
 - (d) Restrictions on the use of grant funds.
