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Representative Woodson offered the following:

**Amendment (with schedule, ballot and title amendments)**

Remove lines 181-190 and insert:

SECTION 7. Funding requirements.—Beginning with the 2027-2028 local fiscal year:

(a) The total funding provided by each local government for services provided by law enforcement, firefighters, and other first responders, as provided by general law, may not be less than such jurisdiction's total budgeted amount for such services in either the 2025-2026 or 2026-2027 local fiscal year, whichever was higher, notwithstanding any reduction in ad

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13 valorem revenue that may result from the amendment to Article  
14 VII, approved by voters on November 3, 2026.

15 (b) The legislature shall create a fund to replace any  
16 reduction in ad valorem revenue that a local government  
17 experiences as a result of the amendment to Article VII approved  
18 by voters on November 3, 2026.

23 Remove lines 195-203 and insert:  
24 valorem taxes other than school levies; local government funding  
25 requirements.-This section, the amendment to Section 6 of  
26 Article VII increasing the exemption for homestead property from  
27 ad valorem taxes other than school levies by \$100,000 each year  
28 for ten years and making homestead property exempt from ad  
29 valorem taxes other than school levies beginning January 1,  
30 2037, and the creation of Section 7 of Article VIII prohibiting  
31 local governments from reducing first responder funding below a  
32 specified level and requiring the legislature to create a fund  
33 to replace certain reductions in ad valorem revenue shall take  
34 effect January 1,

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**B A L L O T A M E N D M E N T**

Remove lines 212-220 and insert:

REDUCTION OF HOMESTEAD PROPERTY TAXES; LOCAL GOVERNMENT  
FUNDING REQUIREMENT.—Beginning January 1, 2027, non-school  
homestead property taxes are reduced by annually increasing the  
homestead exemption by \$100,000 each year for ten years, then  
making such properties fully exempt from non-school property  
taxes beginning January 1, 2037. Local governments are  
prohibited from reducing first responder funding below the  
amount budgeted in local fiscal year 2025-2026 or 2026-2027,  
whichever was greater. The Legislature is required to replace  
revenue lost as a result of the amendment.
