An act relating to cost-sharing requirements for insulin and diabetes supplies; creating s. 627.42398, F.S.; defining the term "cost-sharing requirement"; providing applicability; prohibiting health insurance policies from imposing cost-sharing requirements that exceed a specified amount for 30 days of insulin and diabetes supplies; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 627.42398, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

- 627.42398 Caps on cost-sharing requirements for insulin and diabetes supplies .-
- As used in this section, the term "cost-sharing requirement" means an insured's deductible, coinsurance, copayment, or similar out-of-pocket expense.
- This section applies to all health insurance policies delivered, issued, renewed, or amended in this state on or after January 1, 2027, including policies provided by group, blanket, or franchise health insurers; prepaid limited health service organizations and discount plan organizations; and health maintenance organizations.

(4) A health insurance policy may not impose a costsharing requirement that exceeds \$100 for 30 days of diabetes
supplies, including blood-glucose test strips, glucometers,
continuous glucometers, lancets, lancing devices, or insulin
syringes, which are used to cure, diagnose, mitigate, prevent,
or treat diabetes or low blood sugar for any insured, regardless
of the quantity or type of supplies prescribed.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2026.
