A bill to be entitled

An act relating to living organ donation; creating s. 110.1185, F.S.; defining the term "living organ donor"; requiring state agencies to grant administrative leave, not to exceed a specified number of days, to allow an employee to serve as a living organ donor; specifying that such leave is in addition to other leave authorized by law; creating s. 381.865, F.S.; defining the terms "employer" and "living organ donor"; requiring employers to grant an unpaid leave of absence to allow an employee to serve as a living organ donor under certain circumstances; specifying the length of such leave of absence; authorizing employers to grant paid or unpaid leave for a period longer than the required period of time; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 110.1185, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

110.1185 Administrative leave for living organ donation.

- (1) As used in this section, the term "living organ donor" means a person who donates all or part of a human organ while he or she is alive for transplantation into another person.
- (2) Each state agency shall grant administrative leave, with pay, not to exceed 30 working days, to allow an employee to serve as a living organ donor. Administrative leave granted under this section is in addition to any medical, personal, or

other leave otherwise authorized by law.

Section 2. Section 381.865, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

- 381.865 Leave for living organ donation by employees of private employers and local governments.—
  - (1) As used in this section, the term:
- (a) "Employer" means a private employer, including a sole proprietor, partnership, corporation, limited liability company, or other entity, or a political subdivision of the state, that employs one or more employees.
- (b) "Living organ donor" means a person who donates all or part of a human organ while he or she is alive for transplantation into another person.
- (2) (a) In addition to any medical, personal, or other paid leave provided by the employer, an employer shall grant an employee an unpaid leave of absence to allow the employee to serve as a living organ donor if the employee submits a written request for such leave.
- (b) The length of the leave of absence must be equal to the time requested by the employee or 30 working days, whichever is less.
- (c) An employer may grant paid or unpaid leave for a period longer than 30 working days.
  - Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2026.
