A bill to be entitled
An act relating to developmental disabilities;
amending s. 393.063, F.S.; revising the definition of
the term "developmental disability"; defining the term
"Tatton-Brown-Rahman syndrome"; providing an effective
date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Subsections (46) and (47) of section 393.063, Florida Statutes, are renumbered as subsections (47) and (48), respectively, subsection (11) is amended, and a new subsection (46) is added to that section, to read:

393.063 Definitions.—For the purposes of this chapter, the term:

(11) "Developmental disability" means a disorder or syndrome that is attributable to intellectual disability, cerebral palsy, autism, spina bifida, Down syndrome, Phelan-McDermid syndrome, or Prader-Willi syndrome, or Tatton-Brown-Rahman syndrome; that manifests before the age of 18; and that constitutes a substantial handicap that can reasonably be expected to continue indefinitely.

(46) "Tatton-Brown-Rahman syndrome" means a disorder caused by a mutation in the DNMT3A gene typified by mild to severe intellectual disability, macrocephaly, stature and weight

27 above the mean for the person's age and sex, and any of the
28 following features presenting in infancy, childhood, or
29 adolescence:

- 30 (a) Mild facial dysmorphism.
- 31 (b) Joint hypermobility.
- 32 (c) Hypotonia.
- 33 (d) Kyphoscoliosis.
- 34 (e) Seizures.
- 35 (f) Cryptorchidism.
- 36 (g) Deficits in behavior.
- 37 (h) Hematologic malignancies.

38 **Section 2.** This act shall take effect July 1, 2026.
