- (15) PARENTAL NOTIFICATION OF STUDENT CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATIONAL OPTIONS.—Before the end of grade 5 and each school year thereafter, each student and his or her parent must be provided a list of schools within the school district that offer career and technical education programs and a description of each program.
- registration for students entering grade 9, each district school board must require each middle school to hold a career and academic planning meeting for grade 8 students and their parents. The meeting must include the following information:
- (a) A list of schools within the school district that offer career and technical education programs and a description of each program.
- (b) Information relating to career and postsecondary planning.
- (c) The eligibility requirements for federal and state grants and scholarships, including the requirements for each Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program award.
- (d) Information obtained from the Department of Commerce, local workforce boards, and CareerSource Florida, Inc., about career and academic jobs available in the region of the school district, including starting salaries.

with public and private postsecondary educational institutions in the region for high school students, including admission requirements. For purposes of this paragraph, "region" means the Florida College System service area in which the school district is located.

(f) A demonstration of Florida's online career planning and work-based learning coordination system and how to access the student's personalized academic and career plan.

Section 2. Paragraph (e) of subsection (1) of section 1003.4156, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

1003.4156 General requirements for middle grades promotion; student personalized academic and career plan requirements.—

- (1) In order for a student to be promoted to high school from a school that includes middle grades 6, 7, and 8, the student must successfully complete the following courses:
- (e) 1. One course in career and education planning to be completed in grades 6, 7, or 8, which may be taught by any member of the instructional staff. The course must be Internet-based, customizable to each student, and include research-based assessments to assist students in determining educational and career options and goals. In addition, the course must result in a completed personalized academic and career plan for the student, which must use, when available, Florida's online career planning and work-based learning coordination system. The course

must teach each student how to access and update the plan and encourage the student to access and update the plan at least annually as the student progresses through middle school and high school. The personalized academic and career plan must emphasize the importance of entrepreneurship and employability skills and must include information from the Department of Commerce's economic security report under s. 445.07 and other state career planning resources. The required personalized academic and career plan must inform students of high school graduation requirements, including a detailed explanation of the requirements for earning a high school diploma designation under s. 1003.4285 and the career and technical education pathway to earn a standard high school diploma under s. 1003.4282(10); the requirements for each scholarship in the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program; state university and Florida College System institution admission requirements; available opportunities to earn college credit in high school, including Advanced Placement courses; the International Baccalaureate Program; the Advanced International Certificate of Education Program; dual enrollment, including career dual enrollment; career and technical education programs available within the school district; work-based learning opportunities, including internships and preapprenticeship and apprenticeship programs; and career education courses, including career-themed courses and course sequences that lead to industry certification pursuant to s.
