 $\frac{7.(h)}{}$ Is identified as a criminal gang member by an informant of previously untested reliability and such identification is corroborated by independent information.

- 8.(i) Is identified as a criminal gang member by physical evidence.
- 9.(j) Has been observed in the company of one or more known criminal gang members two four or more times. Observation in a custodial setting requires a willful association. It is the intent of the Legislature to allow this criterion to be used to identify gang members who recruit and organize in jails, prisons, and other detention settings.
- 10.(k) Has authored any communication indicating <u>criminal</u> gang affiliation, criminal gang-related activity, or acceptance of responsibility for the commission of any crime by the criminal gang.
- 11. Has used criminal gang-related language on social media, including language used in a post, caption, comment, reply, thread, direct message, private message, meme, reel, username, screen name, handle, or e-mail address.
- 12. Participates in any recording that promotes or describes criminal gang activity, regardless of whether the activity actually took place.

Where a single act or factual transaction satisfies the
