6            Remove everything after the enacting clause and insert:

7            **Section 1. Paragraph (c) of subsection (9) of section**  
8 **460.403, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:**

9            460.403 Definitions.—As used in this chapter, the term:

11            (c)1. Chiropractic physicians may adjust, manipulate, or  
12 treat the human body by manual, mechanical, electrical, or  
13 natural methods; by the use of physical means or physiotherapy,  
14 including light, heat, water, or exercise; by the use of  
15 acupuncture; by the use of monofilament intramuscular  
16 stimulation treatment, also known as dry needling, for trigger

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17 points or myofascial pain; or by the administration of foods,  
18 food concentrates, food extracts, and items for which a  
19 prescription is not required and may apply first aid and  
20 hygiene, but chiropractic physicians are expressly prohibited  
21 from prescribing or administering to any person any legend drug  
22 except as authorized under subparagraph 2., from performing any  
23 surgery except as stated herein, or from practicing obstetrics.

24 2. Notwithstanding the prohibition against prescribing and  
25 administering legend drugs under subparagraph 1. or s.  
26 499.83(2)(c), pursuant to board rule chiropractic physicians  
27 may:

28 a. Order, store, possess, prescribe, and administer, by  
29 means of injection only at the chiropractic physician's office  
30 or place of business, sterile substances, including vitamins,  
31 minerals, and nutritional supplements.

32 b. Order~~order~~, store, possess, and administer, for  
33 emergency purposes only at the chiropractic physician's office  
34 or place of business, prescription medical oxygen.

35 c. Order ~~and may also order~~, store, possess, and  
36 administer any solution in aerosol form ~~the following topical~~  
37 ~~anesthetics in aerosol form:~~

38 ~~— a. Any solution consisting of 25 percent ethyl chloride~~  
39 ~~ethylehloride and 75 percent dichlorodifluoromethane.~~

40 ~~d.b.~~ Order, store, possess, and administer any ~~Any~~  
41 solution in aerosol form consisting of 15 percent

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42 dichlorodifluoromethane and 85 percent

45 However, this paragraph does not authorize a chiropractic  
46 physician to prescribe medical oxygen as defined in s.  
47 499.82(10) or to administer any substance through intravenous  
48 therapy.

49 **Section 2. Section 460.4086, Florida Statutes, is created**  
50 **to read:**

51 460.4086 Administration of sterile substance by  
52 chiropractic physicians.—

53 (1) A chiropractic physician must be certified prior to  
54 administering sterile substances by means of injection to a  
55 patient.

56 (2) The board shall establish minimum standards of  
57 practice for the administration of sterile substances by means  
58 of injection by chiropractic physicians, including, at a  
59 minimum:

60 (a) Completion of 36 hours of continuing education  
61 consisting of didactic lectures and laboratory training on the  
62 safe and effective administration of vitamins, minerals, and  
63 nutritional supplements, including, but not limited to,  
64 protocols, indications, and contraindications.

65 (b) Passage of a written and practical examination.

110 | that he or she is authorized to administer certain  
111 | sterile substances, only by means of injection, if the  
112 | chiropractic physician submits certain documentation  
113 | to the board;
