A bill to be entitled
An act relating to prohibited sex-reassignment prescriptions and procedures; amending s. 456.52, F.S.; prohibiting a health care practitioner from aiding or abetting another in a specified violation; amending s. 766.318, F.S.; authorizing the Attorney General to conduct an investigation and bring a civil action against a health care practitioner under certain circumstances; providing for damages, injunctive relief, and civil penalties; providing that any damages collected shall accrue to the injured minor; providing applicability; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Paragraph (b) of subsection (5) of section 456.52, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

456.52 Sex-reassignment prescriptions and procedures; prohibitions; informed consent.—

(5)

(b) Any health care practitioner who willfully or actively participates, or who aids or abets another health care practitioner to participate, in a violation of subsection (1) commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in

27 **Section 2. Subsection (5) is added to section 766.318,**
28 **Florida Statutes, to read:**

29 766.318 Civil liability for provision of sex-reassignment
30 prescriptions or procedures to minors.—

31 (5) (a) The Attorney General may conduct an investigation
32 and bring a civil action in any court of competent jurisdiction
33 against a health care practitioner, as defined in s. 456.001,
34 for damages, injunctive relief, and civil penalties of up to
35 \$100,000 for each violation of s. 456.52(1), and each violation
36 of s. 1014.04(e) and (f) or s. 1014.06 related to providing sex-
37 reassignment prescriptions and procedures to a minor.

38 (b) Any damages collected under this subsection must
39 accrue to the benefit of the injured minor.

40 (c) This subsection does not apply to:

41 1. Treatment with sex-reassignment prescriptions if such
42 treatment is consistent with s. 456.001(9)(a)1. or 2. and was
43 commenced on or before, and is still active on, May 17, 2023.

44 2. Sex-reassignment prescriptions or procedures that were
45 ceased or completed on or before May 17, 2023.

46 **Section 3.** This act shall take effect July 1, 2026.
