Section 1. Section 366.16, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

- 366.16 Public utility earnings transfers by a municipality; percentage of transfers; prohibition; disclosure requirement.-
- (1) A municipality or an agency thereof that is regulated by this chapter pursuant to s. 366.04 may transfer a portion of its public utility earnings to the general fund of the municipality for public utility purposes.
- (2) If the public utilities are supplied to customers located within the municipality, the percentage of transfers authorized by subsection (1) shall be in a fixed amount not to exceed 10 percent of the municipality's or agency's general fund. The amount shall be stated as a percentage of the municipality's or agency's general fund that may be supported by transfers.
- (3) If the public utilities are supplied to customers located outside the municipality, the percentage of transfers authorized by subsection (1) shall be in a variable amount not to exceed 10 percent of the municipality's or agency's general fund. The amount shall be based on the percentage of customers located outside the municipal boundaries and shall decrease as the percentage of customers located outside the municipal boundaries increases.
 - (4) The amount of percentage of transfers authorized by

subsection (1) shall be established or reestablished by local referendum, subject to a majority vote of customers located within and outside a municipality voting in the referendum.

(5) The restriction of 10 percent in subsection (2) and

- subsection (3) does not apply in the event of a disaster or emergency such that a state of emergency is declared by the Governor pursuant to chapter 252. In such instances, the governing body of a municipality may, by passage of a resolution by four-fifths vote, adopt the amount of percentage of transfers. Any such amount of percentage of transfers adopted that exceeds the restriction of 10 percent in subsection (2) and subsection (3) shall be repaid to the general fund within 3 fiscal years.
- (6) A municipality or an agency thereof that is regulated by this chapter pursuant to s. 366.04 may not transfer a portion of its public utility earnings to the general fund of the municipality or agency thereof for nonpublic utility purposes, including, but not limited to:
 - (a) Any restricted revenues.
- (b) Grant funds designated for specific capital or operational purposes.
 - (c) Any revenues from impact fees.
- (d) Any proceeds from debt, including bonds, notes, or loans.
