House Resolution

A resolution designating the week of April 6-12, 2026,
as "Vein Week" in Florida.

WHEREAS, venous and lymphatic diseases, including venous thromboembolism defined as deep vein thrombosis or pulmonary embolism, represent a serious and often under recognized public health threat, and

WHEREAS, venous thromboembolism is a leading cause of preventable illness and death and affects tens of thousands of Floridians each year, and

WHEREAS, venous thromboembolism is the leading cause of preventable hospital death, and

WHEREAS, early identification of risk factors, public education, and appropriate clinical screening can significantly reduce preventable complications and deaths related to blood clots and other venous disorders, and

WHEREAS, Vein Week is an internationally recognized public health awareness initiative held annually in April to promote education and prevention related to venous and lymphatic disease among both the public and health care professionals worldwide, and

WHEREAS, the goals of Vein Week align with Florida's ongoing efforts to improve patient safety, strengthen prevention
