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A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the Task Force on Artificial Intelligence in Public Postsecondary Education; creating the Task Force on Artificial Intelligence in Public Postsecondary Education; requiring the task force to convene by a specified date; providing the purpose of the task force; providing for the membership of the task force; providing duties of the task force; requiring the task force to provide a report to the Governor and Legislature by a specified date; providing for the future termination of the task force; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. (1) The Task Force on Artificial Intelligence in Public Postsecondary Education, a task force as defined in s. 20.03(5), Florida Statutes, is created adjunct to the Department of Education. The task force shall convene no later than August 1, 2026, to review and make recommendations on the opportunities, risks, and best practices presented by artificial intelligence in academic instruction, research, and student conduct within the State University System and Florida College System.

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(2) The task force shall consist of the following members:

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20	(a) raculty members appointed by the presidents of state

13	(3) The task force shall:
14	(a) Examine the impact of artificial intelligence on
15	academic integrity, including plagiarism, contract cheating, and
16	the verification of student work.
17	(b) Review potential applications of artificial
18	intelligence in teaching, learning support, advising, grading,
19	accessibility, and research.
50	(c) Assess implications for privacy, intellectual

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property, and data security when artificial intelligence tools
are used by faculty and students.

- (d) Consider safeguards to protect academic freedom while maintaining clear expectations for student conduct.
- (e) Identify professional development, resources, and training needs for faculty and staff to address the responsible use of artificial intelligence in the classroom.
- (f) Review national and international best practices in higher education regarding artificial intelligence governance and adoption.
- (g) Recommend model policies for institutions to adopt regarding the ethical and effective use of artificial intelligence.
- (h) Solicit input from faculty senates, student governments, accrediting bodies, and industry representatives with expertise in artificial intelligence and workforce development.
- (4) By December 1, 2026, the task force shall submit a report to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives with its findings and recommendations, including model policies and any proposed legislation. The task force shall terminate upon submission of the report.
  - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2026.
