21 (3) CRITERIA FOR REGISTRATION AS A CAREER OFFENDER.—

22 (a) A career offender released on or after July 1, 2002,
23 from a sanction imposed in this state must register as required
24 under this section subsection (4) and is subject to community
25 and public notification as provided under subsection (11) (5).
26 If no sanction is imposed, the person is deemed to be released
27 upon conviction. For purposes of this section, a sanction
28 imposed in this state means includes, but is not limited to, a
29 fine, probation, community control, parole, conditional release,
30 control release, or incarceration in a state prison, federal
31 prison, contractor-operated correctional facility, or local
32 detention facility, and:

33 1. The career offender has not received a pardon for any
34 felony or other qualified offense that is necessary for the
35 operation of this paragraph; or

36 2. A conviction of a felony or other qualified offense
37 necessary to the operation of this paragraph has not been set
38 aside in any postconviction proceeding.

39 (b) This section does not apply to any person who has been
40 designated as a sexual predator and who is required to register
41 under s. 775.21 or who is required to register as a sexual

42 offender under s. 943.0435 or s. 944.607. However, if a person
43 is no longer required to register as a sexual predator under s.
44 775.21 or as a sexual offender under s. 943.0435 or s. 944.607,
45 the person must register as a career offender under this section
46 if the person is otherwise designated as a career offender as
47 provided in this section.

48 (c) A person subject to registration as a career offender
49 is not subject to registration as a convicted felon under s.
50 775.13. However, if the person is no longer required to register
51 as a career offender under this section, the person must
52 register under s. 775.13 if required to do so under that
53 section.

54 (d) If a career offender is not sentenced to a term of
55 imprisonment, the clerk of the court shall ensure that the
56 career offender's fingerprints are taken and forwarded to the
57 department within 48 hours after the court renders its finding
58 that an offender is a career offender. The fingerprints shall be
59 clearly marked, "Career Offender Registration."

195 (a) ~~(d)~~ Each time a career offender's driver license or
196 identification card is subject to renewal, and, without regard
197 to the status of the career offender's driver license or
198 identification card, within 48 hours 2 working days after any
199 ~~change of the career offender's residence or change in the~~
200 career offender's name by reason of marriage or other legal
201 process, the career offender must report in person to a driver
202 license office, and shall be subject to the requirements
203 specified in paragraph (4) (d) ~~(e)~~. The Department of Highway
204 Safety and Motor Vehicles shall forward to the department and to
205 the Department of Corrections all photographs and information
206 provided by career offenders. Notwithstanding the restrictions
207 set forth in s. 322.142, the Department of Highway Safety and
208 Motor Vehicles may release a reproduction of a color-photograph
209 or digital-image license to the department for purposes of
210 public notification of career offenders as provided in this
211 section and ss. 775.26 and 944.609. A career offender who is
212 unable to secure or update a driver license or an identification
213 card with the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles as
214 provided in paragraph (4) (d) and this subsection shall report
215 any change in the career offender's name by reason of marriage

220 offender to obtain a Florida driver license or an identification
221 card as required in this section.

222 (b) A career offender shall report in person to the
223 sheriff's office within 48 hours after any change in vehicles
224 owned to report those vehicle information changes.

225 (c) A career offender shall register all changes to home
226 telephone numbers and cellular telephone numbers, including
227 added and deleted numbers, and all changes to employment
228 information, including the creation of a new business if self-
229 employed, in person at the sheriff's office, or in person at the
230 Department of Corrections if the career offender is in the
231 custody or control, or under the supervision, of the Department
232 of Corrections. All changes required to be reported under this
233 paragraph must be reported within 48 hours after the change.
