Remove everything after the enacting clause and insert:

Section 1. Paragraphs (c) and (d) are added to subsection
(10) of section 212.12, Florida Statutes, to read:

212.12 Dealer's credit for collecting tax; penalties for
noncompliance; powers of Department of Revenue in dealing with
delinquents; rounding; records required.—

(10)

(c) If the 1-cent piece is no longer in production, an in-
person cash transaction may be rounded to the nearest nickel
using the following methodology:

1. If the final digit of a cash transaction ends in 1 or 2
cents, it must be rounded down to zero.

2. If the final digit of a cash transaction ends in 3 or 4 cents, it must be rounded up to 5 cents.

3. If the final digit of a cash transaction ends in 6 or 7 cents, it must be rounded down to 5 cents.

4. If the final digit of a cash transaction ends in 8 or 9 cents, it must be rounded up to 10 cents.

5. Cash transactions ending in 0 or 5 cents are not rounded.

(d)1. Paragraph (c) applies only to cash transactions. For mixed-tender transactions, any portion of the transaction paid by a customer in cash shall be applied to the sale price, and any remaining amount, including taxes imposed by this chapter, shall be paid using electronic or other noncash payment methods.

2. Paragraph (c) does not alter the sales price, the amount of tax collected under this chapter, or any surcharges, assessments, or fees imposed on the sale.

3. Paragraph (c) applies to the sales price of the transaction or to the amount of change tendered to the purchaser.

4. Paragraph (c) does not alter or affect the exact amounts authorized, cleared, or settled through any non-cash payment system or electronic transaction.

Section 2. Subsection (8) is added to section 501.212, Florida Statutes, to read:

501.212 Application.—This part does not apply to:
