- Section 1. This act may be cited as the "Marine and Aquatic Native Threatened Animal Protection Act."
- Section 2. Section 379.24312, Florida Statutes, is created to read:
- 379.24312 Marine and aquatic native threatened animal protections.—
  - (1) As used in this section, the term:
- (a) "Aquatic animal" means any vertebrate or invertebrate animal species, subspecies, or distinct population segment that inhabits state waters.
- (b) "Endangered, threatened, or vulnerable species" means any species included on the official Florida list of endangered and threatened species maintained by the commission or

classified as endangered or vulnerable in the International
Union for Conservation of Nature's Red List of Threatened
Species.

- (c) "Exhibition or educational purposes" means the holding, displaying, transporting, or maintaining of specimens for public display, exhibition, research, or education, including activities authorized under a special activity license issued by the commission.
- (2) A person may not take, attempt to take, possess, transport, or export any endangered, threatened, or vulnerable aquatic animal species from state waters for exhibition or educational purposes.
- (3) The commission may not issue, renew, or approve a special activity license or other authorization that would allow the taking of any endangered, threatened, or vulnerable aquatic animal species from state waters for purposes prohibited in subsection (2).
- (4) A person who violates this section commits a Level Four violation under s. 379.401. Each individual animal taken or exported in violation of this section constitutes a separate offense.
- (5) (a) This section does not prohibit or restrict the rescue, rehabilitation, or scientific study of aquatic animal species when such activities are conducted under state or federal authorization consistent with the Endangered Species Act and applicable commission rules.
- (b) Nothing in this section shall be construed to limit federal authority under the Endangered Species Act, the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act, or the

Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora.

Section 3. Paragraph (a) of subsection (4) of section 379.401, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

379.401 Penalties and violations; civil penalties for noncriminal infractions; criminal penalties; suspension and forfeiture of licenses and permits.—

- (4) LEVEL FOUR VIOLATIONS.-
- (a) A person commits a Level Four violation if he or she violates any of the following provisions:
- 1. Section 379.24312, prohibiting the taking, attempted taking, possession, transport, or export of certain aquatic animals for exhibition or educational purposes.
- 2.1. Section 379.354(16), prohibiting the making, forging, counterfeiting, or reproduction of a recreational license or the possession of same without authorization from the commission.
- 3.2. Section 379.365(2)(c), prohibiting criminal activities relating to the taking of stone crabs.
- $\underline{4.3.}$  Section 379.366(4)(c), prohibiting criminal activities relating to the taking and harvesting of blue crabs.
- 5.4. Section 379.367(4), prohibiting the willful molestation of spiny lobster gear.
- $\underline{6.5.}$  Section 379.3671(2)(c)5., prohibiting the unlawful reproduction, possession, sale, trade, or barter of spiny lobster trap tags or certificates.
- 7.6. Section 379.404(5), prohibiting the sale of illegally taken deer or wild turkey.
- 8.7. Section 379.4041(2), prohibiting the sale of illegally taken bears.

- $\underline{10.9.}$  Section 379.409, prohibiting the unlawful killing, injuring, possessing, or capturing of alligators or other crocodilia or their eggs.
- $\underline{11.10.}$  Section 379.411, prohibiting the intentional killing or wounding of any species designated as endangered, threatened, or of special concern.
- $\underline{12.11.}$  Section 379.4115, prohibiting the killing of any Florida or wild panther.
  - Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2026.
