The Conference Committee Amendment for SB 2506-E, relating to Fuel Taxes, conforms statutes to funding decisions related to Fuel Taxes in the General Appropriations Act (GAA) for Fiscal Year 2026-2027. The proposed amendment revises the distribution of “fuel sales tax” proceeds. Specifically, the proposed amendment redirects revenues from the State Transportation Trust Fund within the Department of Transportation to the following trust funds:

- Agricultural Emergency Eradication Trust Fund within the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services by \$8.6 million.
- Marine Resources Conservation Trust Fund within the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission by \$10.7 million.
- State Game Trust Fund within the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission by \$1.7 million.
- Invasive Plant Trust Fund within the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission by \$4.2 million.
