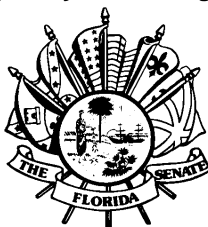

# BILLS ON THE CALENDAR

## BILLS ON THIRD READING

### **CS/SB 82 by the Committee on Transportation, Senator Brown-Waite and others**

**Road & Bridge Designations;** codesignates portion of SR 54 in Pasco Co. as "State Trooper James Crooks Hwy."; designates Fla. Highway Patrol substation on SR 52 in Land O'Lakes as "State Trooper James Crooks Substation"; directs DOT to erect two additional markers for "Purple Heart Highway" on SR 54; designates portion of SR 9 from NW 58th St. in Dade Co. to Broward County Line Road as "Carrie P. Meek Boulevard"; names Destin Bridge at East Pass "William T. Marler Bridge", etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Read the second time and amended on March 30, 1999*

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### **CS/SB 1494 by the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator Saunders**

**Water & Wastewater Systems;** redefines term "governmental authority"; provides for additional exemption; authorizes specified transactions before Public Service Commission approval. Amends 367.021,.022,.071. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Read the second time on March 30, 1999*

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### **CS/SB 1424 by the Committee on Natural Resources and Senator Latvala**

**Sewage Treatment Facility Discharges;** prohibits new discharges, or increased pollutant loadings from existing sewage treatment facilities into coastal waters within Pasco County or waters tributary thereto; requires elimination of existing discharges into coastal waters within Pasco County or waters tributary thereto; authorizes DEP to grant exceptions under certain circumstances. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Read the second time and amended on March 30, 1999*

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### **CS/CS/HB 19 by the Committees on Governmental Operations (PRC), Judiciary (CJC), Representative Futch and others**

**Skateboarding & Inline Skating;** provides limitations on liability re governmental entities & public employees re persons who participate in skateboarding, inline skating, or freestyle bicycling on property owned or leased by governmental entity; provides for liability of independent concessionaires or other persons or organizations for certain injuries or damages; provides for assumption of certain risks; provides for effect of certain insurance, etc. Creates 316.0085. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Substituted for SB 112 (Kurth) and read the second time on March 30, 1999*

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### **HB 67 by Representative Fuller and others**

**Sport Shooting Ranges;** provides definitions; provides exemption from civil liability & criminal prosecution for owners & users of

sport shooting ranges re noise pollution resulting from operation of range under certain circumstances; exempts said ranges from specified rules; prohibits certain nuisance actions against such ranges; provides for continued operation of sport shooting ranges under specified circumstances. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Substituted for SB 776 (Bronson) and read the second time on March 30, 1999*

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### **SB 996 by the Committee on Transportation**

**Low-speed Vehicles/Speed Bumps;** provides certain pavement undulations are exempt from certain prohibitions concerning uniform traffic control devices; authorizes use of low-speed vehicles on certain public roads; provides restrictions for such operation; provides speed restriction for golf carts; defines term "low-speed vehicle"; prescribes license tax for such vehicles; exempts golf carts & utility vehicles from inspection requirements, etc. Amends Chs. 316, 320, 325.203. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Read the second time and amended on March 30, 1999*

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### **SB 954 by Senator Bronson and others**

**Weapons & Firearms/Nonresidents;** provides that nonresident who is U.S. citizen may carry concealed weapon or firearm in this state if nonresident has attained specified age & holds valid license to carry concealed weapon or firearm issued in another state; provides that nonresident is subject to same laws & restrictions as licensee in Florida; specifies how legal residence is established; provides applicability, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

*Read the second time and amended on March 30, 1999*

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### **CS/CS/SB 888 by the Committees on Commerce and Economic Opportunities, Fiscal Resource and Senator Horne**

**Tax Administration;** discontinues use of unnecessary estate tax returns for small estates that owe no tax; grants credit against documentary stamp tax for identical tax paid in another state; provides additional exemption to facilitate investment in education & job training; amends exemption for electricity & steam used for manufacturing; provides procedures for purchasers to obtain refund of or credit for public service taxes collected in error, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/1999 except as otherwise expressly provided.

*Read the second time and amended on March 30, 1999*

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### **SB 134 by Senator Klein**

**Controlled Substances/Child Care;** corrects misplaced statutory provision re unlawful sale or possession of controlled substance within specified area surrounding child care facility; provides that certain enhanced penalties do not apply unless owner or operator of facility posts sign identifying facility as child care facility. Amends 893.13. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Read the second time on March 30, 1999*

**CS/CS/SB 150 by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, Banking and Insurance, Senator Horne and others**

**State Financial Matters;** specifies certain powers of Comptroller & Banking & Finance Dept.; specifies procedures, rights, & requirements for enforcing compliance with certain subpoenas; provides for payment of retirement benefits by direct deposit; exempts dept. from certain organizational requirements; deletes divisions of dept.; creates Office of Financial Investigations; amends provisions to conform, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 10/01/1999.

*Read the second time on March 30, 1999*

**CS/SB 170 by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Bronson**

**Children's Protection Act of 1999;** creates said act; creates offenses of "lewd or lascivious battery," "lewd or lascivious molestation," "lewd or lascivious conduct," & "lewd or lascivious exhibition"; precludes consent from being raised as defense if victim is under specified age; precludes ignorance or belief of age from being raised as defense; provides exception for maternal breastfeeding; ranks offenses created in act in Criminal Punishment Code, etc. Amends & reenacts FS. Effective Date: 10/01/1999.

*Read the second time on March 30, 1999*

**CS/SB 312 by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Lee**

**Health Insurance;** revises notice requirements for cancellation or nonrenewal of group health insurance policy; specifies conditions under which insurer may retroactively cancel coverage due to nonpayment of premium; revises time limits for employee or group member to apply for individual converted policy when termination of group coverage is due to failure of employer to pay premium, etc. Amends Chs. 627, 641. Effective Date: 10/01/1999.

*Read the second time and amended on March 30, 1999*

**CS/CS/SB 2 by the Committees on Children and Families, Judiciary, Senator Campbell and others**

**Adoption;** removes provisions authorizing licensed child-placing agencies to file actions to terminate parental rights; provides additional requirements for petition for adoption; prohibits filing such petition until order terminating parental rights is final; provides duties of adoption entity to prospective adoptive parents; provides for placement of minor pending adoption, etc. Amends Chs. 39, 63, 984.03, 985.03. Effective Date: 10/01/1999.

*Read the second time and amended on March 30, 1999*

**CS/SB 728 by the Committee on Natural Resources and Senator Sullivan**

**Watersports/Parasails;** provides safety rules for towing parasails from vessels; prescribes safety regulations for persons engaged in waterskiing, parasailing, aquaplaning, or similar activities; prohibits parasailing or operating a boat towing a parasail in specified waters; provides that certain violations re parasailing constitute noncriminal infraction; reenacts provisions to

incorporate said amendment in references thereto. Amends Ch. 327. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

*Read the second time on March 30, 1999*

**CS/SB 986 by the Committee on Fiscal Resource and Senator Rossin**

**Property/Tax Certificates;** prohibits holders of tax certificates from contacting owner of property upon which tax certificate is issued until expiration of specified time; provides penalty; provides for date to begin timing limitation on tax certificate. Amends 197.432, 482. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

*Read the second time on March 30, 1999*

**SB 816 by Senator Saunders**

**Motor Vehicle Registration/MADD;** provides that form for motor vehicle registration & renewal must include language permitting voluntary contribution to Florida Mothers Against Drunk Driving, Inc.; provides for distribution of such contributions. Amends 320.02. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

*Read the second time on March 30, 1999*

**CS/SB 154 by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Sebesta**

**Trespass/School Grounds or Facility;** provides for offense of trespass upon grounds or facilities of school to apply to trespass upon grounds or facilities of nonpublic school; defines term "school property." Amends 228.091. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

*Read the second time on March 24, 1999*

**SB 8 by Senator Jones**

**Relief/Jose & Johammes Pena/Hialeah;** provides for relief of Jose Pena, as Personal Representative of Estate of Carmen Pena, deceased, & individually, as surviving father of Katherine Pena & Richard Pena, minor children of Carmen Pena & Jose Pena, deceased; provides for relief of Johammes Pena, surviving son of Carmen Pena; compensates them for death of Carmen Pena, Katherine Pena, & Richard Pena as result of negligence of City of Hialeah. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Read the second time and amended on March 9, 1999*

**SPECIAL ORDER CALENDAR AS DETERMINED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES AND CALENDAR FOR TUESDAY, APRIL 6, 1999**

**CS/CS/SB 304 by the Committee on Fiscal Policy, the Committee on Ethics and Elections and others**

**Ethics/Financial Interests;** redefines terms "gift" & "liability"; revises reporting requirements for full & public disclosure of financial interests; transfers filing administration from Secretary of State to Ethics Comm.; requires former officers & employees to file final disclosure of financial interests no later than 60 days following departure; authorizes Technology Research &

Development Authority to make certain gifts under certain circumstances, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 01/01/2000.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Ethics and Elections, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

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### **SB 710 by the Committee on Ethics and Elections and others**

**Primary Elections;** allows all voters to vote in certain primary election contests; conforms provisions. Creates 100.065; amends 101.021, .251, .5606. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Ethics and Elections*

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### **CS/SB 752 by the Committee on Ethics and Elections and others**

**Elections/Lieutenant Governor;** provides for designation of candidates for Lieutenant Governor; provides for ballot language on primary election ballots if candidate for Lieutenant Governor has not been designated by time certain; allows candidate who has qualified for public office who has withdrawn or been eliminated to be designated as candidate for Lieutenant Governor, etc. Amends Ch. 99, 100.111, 101.62, 102.112. Effective Date: 01/01/2000.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Ethics and Elections*

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### **SB 754 by the Committee on Ethics and Elections and others**

**Elections;** modifies requirements for alternative method of qualifying; modifies requirements for candidate with no party affiliation & for minor party candidate to obtain ballot position; modifies petition requirements in year of apportionment; modifies requirements for certain minor parties to have names of their candidates for President & Vice President printed on ballot, etc. Amends Chs. 99, 100, 101, 103, 105, 106. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Ethics and Elections*

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### **SB 756 by the Committee on Ethics and Elections and others**

**Elections;** provides for election of school bd. members in nonpartisan election; provides for qualifying for nonpartisan office & alternative method of qualifying for nonpartisan candidates; provides for electors that are eligible to vote for said candidates; provides for reporting of contributions & expenditures for said candidates; repeals provisions re endorsement of judicial candidates by partisan organizations, etc. Amends Chs. 99, 101, 105, 228, 230. Effective Date: 01/01/2000.

*Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Ethics and Elections*

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### **SB 866 by Senator Lee**

**Candidates for Public Office;** requires subordinate officer, deputy sheriff, or police officer seeking public office to resign or take leave of absence, depending on certain circumstances re

office sought. Amends 99.012. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Ethics and Elections*

*Identical to **HB 125** in the Committee on Ethics and Elections*

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### **SB 2200 by Senator Laurent**

**Elections/State Agencies/Soliciting;** prohibits state agencies from soliciting pledges or authorizing or conducting polls or surveys re candidacies for public office; exempts polls or surveys conducted by institutions of higher learning for research purposes. Effective Date: 10/01/1999.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Ethics and Elections*

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### **SB 280 by Senator Sullivan**

**Share the Road License Plate;** creates Share the Road license plate; provides for distribution of annual use fees received from sale of such plates. Amends 320.08056, .08058. Effective Date: 07/01/1999 if enacted by at least 3/5ths vote of membership of each house of Legislature.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation*

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### **SB 1018 by Senator Latvala**

**Purple Heart License Plate;** permits unremarried spouse of deceased recipient of Purple Heart medal to continue receiving license plate which is stamped with words "Purple Heart" under certain circumstances. Amends 320.089. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation*

*Similar to **HB 267** in the Committee on Transportation*

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### **SB 1266 by Senator Sebesta**

**Tampa Bay Estuary License Plate;** creates Tampa Bay Estuary license plate; provides fee; provides for distribution of annual use fees. Amends 320.08056, .08058. Effective Date: 07/01/1999 if enacted by 3/5ths vote of membership of each house of Legislature.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation and withdrawn from the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

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### **SB 282 by Senator Sullivan**

**US Marine Corps License Plate;** provides for United States Marine Corps specialty license plate; provides fees & for disposition of fees. Amends 320.08056, .08058. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation*

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### **SB 1538 by Senator Dawson-White**

**Fla. Memorial College License Plate;** creates said plate; provides for distribution of annual use fees received from sale of such plates. Amends 320.08056, .08058. Effective Date:

07/01/1999 if enacted by at least 3/5ths vote of membership of each house of Legislature.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation and withdrawn from the Committee on Fiscal Resource*

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### **SB 2018 by Senator Kirkpatrick**

**Fla. Wildflower License Plate;** creates said license plate; provides for distribution of annual use fees received from sale of such plates. Amends 320.08056,.08058. Effective Date: 07/01/1999 if enacted by 3/5ths vote of membership of each house of Legislature.

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### **SB 1816 by Senator Thomas**

**State Lotteries/Lottery Dept.;** authorizes assignment of certain prizes pursuant to court order & provides requirements therefor; provides for securing of funds offset for child-support payments or debts owed to state agency; exempts Lottery Dept. from liability upon payment of assigned prize; authorizes fee to defray administrative expenses associated with such assignments, etc. Creates 24.1153; amends 24.115,.118. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Resource*

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### **SB 148 by Senator Cowin**

**School-entry Health & Vision Exams;** requires children who enter public or nonpublic schools in this state to present evidence of having received comprehensive vision examination; provides exemption; deletes provisions re rulemaking authority re medical examinations. Amends 232.0315. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

*Reported favorably, with two amendments, by the Committee on Education*

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### **CS/SB 276 by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care and Senator Brown-Waite**

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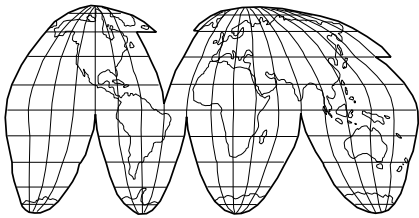

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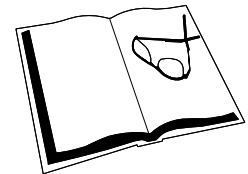
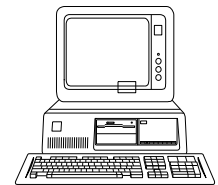
