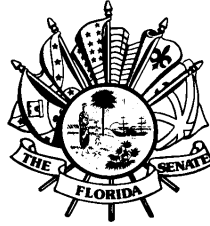

BILLS ON THE CALENDAR

BILLS ON THIRD READING

CS/SB 2282 by the Committee on Natural Resources and Senator Laurent

Florida Watershed Restoration Act; defines term "total maximum daily load"; requires DEP to periodically submit to U.S. Environmental Protection Agency list of surface waters or segments for which total maximum daily load assessments will be conducted; requires DEP to adopt methodology for determining those water bodies which are impaired by rule; provides for removal of surface waters or segments under certain conditions, etc. Amends 403.031, .805; creates 403.067. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 26, 1999

CS/SB 1250 by the Committee on Natural Resources

Dept. of Environmental Protection; deletes Office of Youth Corps; directs NFWFMD & DEP to adopt plan to implement environmental resource permitting program within jurisdiction of district by specified date; defines term "total maximum daily load"; requires DEP to periodically submit to U.S. EPA list of surface water or segments for which total maximum daily load assessments will be conducted; provides that DEP must submit report by February 1, 2001, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Read the second time and amended on April 26, 1999, and read the third time and amended on April 27, 1999

CS/SB 1148 by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs and Senator Clary

Florida Building Code; provides for continuing validation of certifications of certain building inspectors & plans examiners for certain period of time; recognizes that rule adopting Fla. Building

Code may not become final by 2000 Legislative Session if challenged pursuant to specific provision; clarifies effect on local govts. of adopting & updating said code; provides for certain rules of AHCA to be adopted as standards for electrical & alarm systems, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on April 26, 1999

CS/CS/SB 356 by the Committee on Fiscal Policy and the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity

FRS/Optional Retirement Program; creates optional retirement program for employees who are regular members of FRS; provides that employees may participate in said program in lieu of participating in FRS; provides for retention of retirement service credits; prescribes vesting requirements; excludes participants from eligibility for certain health insurance subsidies; modifies definitions to provide for 6-year graded vesting for all members, etc. Amends Chs. 121, 112, 216. Effective Date: 07/01/2001 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on April 23, 1999

SB 8 by Senator Jones

Relief/Jose & Johammes Pena/Hialeah; provides for relief of Jose Pena, as Personal Representative of Estate of Carmen Pena, deceased, & individually, as surviving father of Katherine Pena & Richard Pena, minor children of Carmen Pena & Jose Pena, deceased; provides for relief of Johammes Pena, surviving son of Carmen Pena; compensates them for death of Carmen Pena, Katherine Pena, & Richard Pena as result of negligence of City of Hialeah. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on March 9, 1999, and with pending amendment # 1 by Senator Jones, and pending substitute amendment # 2 by Senator Casas (April 27, 1999)

CS/CS/HB 17 by the Committees on Water & Resource Management (RLC), Community Affairs (PRC), Representatives Constantine, Bradley and others

Community Revitalization; creates Growth Policy Act; authorizes counties & municipalities to designate urban infill & redevelopment areas based on specified criteria; provides for amendment of local comprehensive plan to delineate area boundaries; authorizes exemptions from transportation facilities concurrency requirement for developments located in urban infill & redevelopment area; creates State Housing Tax Credit Program, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

*Substituted for **CS/SB'S 1078 & 1438** (Carlton), read the second time and amended on April 27, 1999*

CS/SB 682 by the Committee on Fiscal Resource and Senator Webster

Tax/Skyboxes & Other Box Seats; provides exemption for charges for renting, leasing, or granting of license for use of certain skyboxes, luxury boxes, or other box seats during specified activities in high-tourism-impact county under certain conditions by not-for-profit sponsoring organizations; provides that no tax imposed on such transactions & not actually paid or collected shall be due from such organization. Amends 212.031. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 27, 1999

SB 290 by Senator Horne and others

Community Contribution Tax Credits; increases annual limitation on amount of such credits which may be granted against corporate income tax & insurance premium taxes. Amends 220.183, 624.5105. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Read the second time on April 27, 1999

HB 1015 by Representative Feeney and others

Driver's License/Sale of Information; repeals provision re color photographic or digital imaged licenses; eliminates provision permitting HSMV to sell certain information re driver's licenses & other information; provides for establishment of task force to study privacy & public records issues; provides membership; provides for meetings, & report; provides for repeal, etc. Repeals 322.142(5),(6). Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Substituted for **CS/SB 1898** (Brown-Waite), read the second time and amended on April 27, 1999*

HB 2149 by the Committee on Family Law & Children (CJC), Roberts and others

Child Support; requires additional information on children of marriage & parties to dissolution of marriage; requires certain identifying information for each minor that is subject of child support order; revises provisions re child support obligations when public assistance is paid; modifies requirement that social security number or other documentation be given prior to issuance of marriage license, etc. Amends Chs. 61, 409, 741.04. Effective Date: 07/01/1999 except as otherwise provided.

*Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 808** (Diaz-Balart) and read the second time on April 27, 1999*

HB 2003 by the Committee on Children & Families (HFC) and Murman

Mental Health & Substance Abuse; authorizes CFS Dept. to use unit cost methods of payment in contracts for mental health & substance abuse services; requires dept. to establish certain contract, payments, & accounting standards; creates Mental Health & Substance Abuse Comm.; provides for staff, meetings & organization; requires reports; provides goals of children's substance abuse services system; specifies target populations, etc. Amends Chs. 394, 397. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

*Substituted for **CS/SB'S 2388 & 1946** (Mitchell), read the second time and amended on April 27, 1999*

SB 700 by Senator Forman

Sales Tax Exemption/Veterans' Groups; expands exemption for veterans' groups. Amends 212.08. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 1999

CS/SB 2554 by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator King

Insurance Contracts; provides exception from certain insurance licensing requirements for CPAs acting within scope of their profession; requires that certain information be included with payments made by fiscal intermediary to certain health maintenance contracts to cover persons licensed to practice massage under certain circumstances; prohibits HMO from denying payment to certain physicians for inpatient hospital services, etc. Amends Chs. 626, 641. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 1999

CS/SB 1806 by the Committee on Fiscal Policy and Senator Thomas

Workers' Compensation; defines term "net direct written premium"; revises method of calculating payments to Special Disability Trust Fund; revises method of determining expenses of administration; revises requirements for reports of information by workers' compensation insurers; creates Workers' Compensation Rating Law Study Commission; provides for appointment of members; requires commission to make study & recommendations, etc. Amends 440.02, .49, .51, 627.914. Effective Date: 07/01/2000 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time on April 27, 1999

HB 819 by Representative Maygarden and others

Presidential Preference Primary; changes date of said primary; provides that any election scheduled to be held concurrent with presidential preference primary in year 2000 be changed to conform. Amends 103.101. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 537 by Representative Hart and others

Sales Tax/Vending Machines; revises calculation of taxes on beverages sold from vending machines; eliminates requirement for certificate; eliminates monetary penalty. Amends 212.0515. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

*Substituted for **CS/SB 818** (Sullivan) and read the second time on April 27, 1999*

HB 1639 by Representative Alexander and others

Ad Val Tax Assessment/Irrigation; specifies requirements for inclusion of irrigation systems when income methodology approach is used in assessment of property used for agricultural purposes. Amends 193.461. Effective Date: 01/01/2000.

*Substituted for **SB 1582** (Laurent) and read the second time on April 27, 1999*

CS/HB 397 by the Committee on Business Development & International Trade (EDC), Representative Feeney and others

Sales Tax Exemptions; revises industries to which exemption for electricity or steam used in certain manufacturing & related operations applies; provides exemption for labor charges for, & parts & materials used in, repair of machinery & equipment used to produce tangible personal property at fixed location by specified industries; provides schedule for implementing exemption. Amends 212.08. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

*Substituted for **CS/SB 992** (Horne) and read the second time on April 27, 1999*

CS/SB's 2472, 1892 by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care, Senators Clary and Saunders

Managed Health Care; (THIS BILL COMBINES S2472,1892) requires AHCA to publish HMO report cards; revises notice requirements for cancellation or nonrenewal of group health insurance policy; revises time limits for employee or group member to apply for converted contract from HMO; requires that HMOs provide additional information to AHCA indicating quality of care; clarifies that state may recover & retain damages in excess of Medicaid payments, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 1999

HB 269 by Representative Albright

Lead-acid Battery Fee; specifies that fee applies to new or remanufactured lead-acid batteries sold at retail. Amends 403.717,.7185. Effective Date: 10/01/1999.

CS/HB 253 by the Committee on Corrections (CRC), Representative Trovillion and others

County & Municipal Jails; deletes provisions that require board of county commissioners to provide specified amount of money to prisoner at time of release; authorizes said board to discontinue or revise gain-time policies; provides that it is second degree misdemeanor for prisoner to knowingly & willfully refuse to obey certain rules governing prisoner conduct, etc. Amends 951.04,.21,.23. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

*Substituted for **CS/SB 292** (Bronson) and read the second time on April 27, 1999*

SB 1296 by Senator Sullivan and others

Sales Tax/Manufactured Asphalt; phases out indexed tax on manufactured asphalt used in state or local government public works project. Amends 212.06. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 1999

CS/HB 1779 by the Committee on Judiciary (CJC), Representative Pruitt and others

Victim Compensation; provides for assertion of victim's rights as provided by law or State Constitution; prescribes purposes of Crime Victims' Services Office in Legal Affairs Dept.; prescribes eligibility criteria for awards granted under specific provision; allows department to award to victim of domestic violence sum of money which victim may use for relocating; increases limit on payment for victims' examination expenses by said office, etc. Amends Ch. 960. Effective Date: 01/01/2000 except as otherwise provided.

*Substituted for **CS/SB 1484** (Saunders) and read the second time on April 27, 1999*

SB 1388 by Senator Cowin and others

Sales Tax/Athletic Event Sponsors; provides exemption from tax for certain organizations that are primarily funded by local governments & that encourage use of certain locations as venues for sporting events. Amends 212.08. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Read the second time on April 27, 1999

CS/HB 2147 by the Committee on Education Innovation (AEC), Representative Tullis and others

Charter Schools; revises date through which district school board must receive charter school applications; authorizes such schools to be operated by municipalities or other public entities; prohibits charter school from hiring certain persons who have resigned in lieu of disciplinary action or have been dismissed for good cause; establishes charter school districts pilot program; provides for protection & indemnity of state & such school, etc. Amends Ch. 228, 235.42. Effective Date: 07/01/1999 except as otherwise provided.

*Substituted for **CS/SB 1066** (Sullivan) and read the second time on April 27, 1999*

CS/SB 1502 by the Committee on Fiscal Resource, Senator Gutman and others

Sales Tax/Food & Drink Concessions; provides for exemptions from tax on renting, leasing, letting, or granting license for use of real property. Amends 212.031. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Read the second time on April 27, 1999

SB 2350 by Senator Carlton

Public Records/Business Records; provides exemption from public records requirements for business records of business owner subject to governmental condemning authority in eminent domain proceeding; provides expiration date; provides finding of public necessity. Effective Date: Contingent.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 1999

CS/CS/SB 1666 by the Committees on Judiciary, Children and Families and Senator Mitchell

Child Protection; amends provision re child abuse prevention training in district school system; reduces period court must preserve records pertaining to dependent child; revises provisions re placement in shelter; amends provision re identifying or locating parent; amends provision re grandparents' rights; revises provisions re petition for injunction for protection against repeat violence; requires sentencing multiplier to be applied, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 1999

CS/SB 1818 by the Committee on Fiscal Resource and Senator Campbell

Sales Tax Exemptions; provides exemption for consumer credit counseling services; provides exemption for any sale or lease to organization that is exempt from federal income tax & that has as its primary function raising funds for organizations that hold or qualify to hold a consumer's certificate of exemption issued by this state; provides for retroactive application. Amends 212.08. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 1999

SB 928 by Senator Cowin

Public Records/Child Abuse; provides that confidential info. obtained by State Child Abuse Death Review Committee, local committee, or panel or committee assembled by either, or by hospital or health care practitioner from any of those entities, shall remain confidential; provides exemption from public records & meetings requirements for specified records & meetings of state or local committee, or panel or committee assembled by either re child fatalities, etc. Creates 383.410. Effective Date: Contingent.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 1999

CS/SB 1406 by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care and Senator Cowin

Fla. Child Death Review Act; creates said act; creates Child Death Review Committee within Health Dept.; provides for

membership & duties of committee; provides for terms of office; provides for counties to establish local committees; authorizes review committees to have access to information pertaining to death of child; authorizes state review committee to issue subpoenas; provides immunity from liability for members of committees & employees, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 27, 1999

CS/SB 1408 by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care and Senator Cowin

Public Records/Child Death Review; provides that confidential information obtained by State Child Death Review Committee, local committee, or panel or committee assembled by either, or by hospital or health care practitioner from any of those entities, shall remain confidential; provides exemption from public records & public meeting requirements for specified records & meetings of state committee, local committee, panel or committee assembled by either, re child fatalities, etc. Effective Date: Contingent.

Read the second time on April 27, 1999

HB 357 by Representative Fasano

Hospital Meetings & Records; defines "strategic plan" for purposes of provisions which provide for confidentiality of such plans & of meetings relating thereto; provides exemption from open meetings requirements for meetings at which such plans are modified or approved by hospital's governing board; provides conditions for early release of transcripts of meetings at which such plans are discussed, etc. Amends 395.3035. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for CS/SB 1012 (Carlton), read the second time and amended on April 27, 1999

CS/SB 2028 by the Committee on Fiscal Resource, Senator Webster and others

Sales, Use, & Other Transactions Tax; provides that sale for resale includes sale of certain tangible personal property used or consumed by government contractor in performance of contract with U.S. Dept. of Defense or National Aeronautics & Space Administration under certain conditions; provides exemption for sales to or use by government contractor of overhead materials used or consumed in performance of such contract under certain conditions, etc. Amends 212.02,.08. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Read the second time on April 27, 1999

SB 1288 by Senator Horne

Distance Learning Education; authorizes State Board of Community Colleges to develop & produce certain work products re distance learning; authorizes fees for such materials for purposes of educational use; requires annual postaudits; requires adoption of rules; requires submission of report; requires State Board of Community Colleges to submit annual report to Legislature. Amends 240.311. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 1999

CS/CS/SB 2146 by the Committees on Fiscal Resource, Natural Resources, Senator Bronson and others

Marine Products & Stone Crabs; provides penalties for illegal buying & selling of marine products; provides for display of endorsements for taking of stone crabs on vessels; provides fee for stone crab endorsement on saltwater products license & fee for trap retrieval; provides for stone crab trap certificate program; provides for transferable trap certificates, trap tags, & fees; provides authority to implement additional means of trap reduction, etc. Amends Ch. 370. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 1999

HB 561 by Representative Fasano and others

Sales Tax/Veterans' Org. & Auxiliary; removes restriction on application of exemption for veterans' organizations & their auxiliaries; provides exemption for sales or leases to organizations exempt from federal income tax under s. 501(c)(3) of Internal Revenue Code. Amends 212.08. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

*Substituted for **SB 2374** (Cowin) and read the second time on April 27, 1999*

HB 2163 by the Committee on Election Reform (PRC) and Flanagan

Judicial Selection; authorizes retention of county court judges; provides requirements to qualify for election or retention to judicial office; provides for determination of retention for county & circuit court judges; authorizes electors to vote for retention of circuit & county court judges; places issue of method of selection of judges on general election ballot in year 2000; deletes terms of elected district court of appeal judges, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 01/01/2000.

*Substituted for **CS/SB 1210** (Grant) and read the second time on April 27, 1999*

CS/SB 2380 by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs and Senator Rossin

Local Govt. Comprehensive Planning; provides that limitation on amendments to local government's comprehensive plan does not apply to amendments necessary to establish public school concurrency; requires all local government public school facilities elements within county to be prepared & adopted on similar time schedule; provides that certain public educational facilities are not inconsistent with local comprehensive plans under certain circumstances, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 1999

CS/SB 2496 by the Committee on Fiscal Resource and Senator Horne

Intangible Personal Property Tax; revises method of calculating tax on future advances; amends exemption that applies to certain charitable trusts; amends exemptions from taxes imposed under Intangible Personal Property Taxes Law. Amends 199.143,.185. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 1999

CS/SB 2268 by the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator Clary

Contracting; requires Construction Industry Licensing Board & Electrical Contractors' Licensing Board to establish job scope for any licensure category registered by respective board, for purposes of local uniformity; revises eligibility requirements for certification as building inspector or plans examiner; revises course requirements for onsite supervisors & asbestos abatement workers, etc. Amends Chs. 20, 205, 468, 469, 471, 481, 489, 633. Effective Date: 10/01/1999 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 1999

CS/CS/SB 972 by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Transportation and Senator Casas

Transportation Dept.; changes name of Office of Construction to Office of Highway Operations; authorizes dept. & local governments to enter into interlocal agreement to provide financing for fixed guideway projects; authorizes bonding of federal aid; provides for portion of motor vehicle license tax moneys to be deposited in State Transportation TF & used to fund Fla. Seaport Transportation & Economic Dev. Program & seaport intermodal access projects, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

With pending amendment # 11 by Senators Casas and Diaz-Balart (April 22, 1999)

CS/SB 1314 by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Webster

Transportation Department; authorizes bonding of federal aid; repeals provisions re school bus stops, welcome stations, certain uncollectible debts owned by local government for utility relocation cost reimbursements, & declaration of legislative intent; repeals provision re certain expenditures in Working Capital Trust Fund & certain audits by Auditor General; deletes obsolete provisions, & where appropriate, clarifies provisions, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

With pending amendment # 1 by Senator Hargrett (April 22, 1999)

*Similar to **HB 591** in Messages*

CS/SB 2220 by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care and Senator Clary

Health Department; revises powers & internal structure of department; exempts certain positions from career service; prescribes conditions under which HIV test may be performed without obtaining consent; authorizes Health Dept. to adopt rules to implement Comprehensive Family Planning Act; provides dept. with rule authority re inspection of certain group care facilities; authorizes department's approval of EMT & paramedic programs, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care, and the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, reports the Committee substitute favorably, with fourteen amendments and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the Committee substitute favorably

*Similar to **HB 2125** in Messages*

CS/SB 228 by the Committee on Fiscal Policy and Senator Webster

State Agency Performance Report; requires each state agency annual performance report to include assessment of performance measures approved by Legislature & established in General Appropriations Act or implementing legislation for said act for previous fiscal year & summary of all moneys that were expended or encumbered by agency, or for which agency is otherwise responsible, during preceding fiscal year & estimate of such moneys for current FY, etc. Amends 186.022, 216.0235. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

With pending amendment # 2 by Senator Webster (April 27, 1999)

CS/SB 2296 by the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator Casas

Telecommunications Services; directs PSC to inform consumers about specific matters in telecommunications services market; provides for telephonic customer account information; specifies duties of DOE re distance learning; creates Fla. Distance Learning Network Advisory Council in DOE; provides responsibilities of council; requires dept. to provide administrative & support services for council, etc. Amends Ch. 364. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the Committee substitute favorably

*Similar to **HB 2123** in Messages*

CS/SB 2438 by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care, Senator Latvala and others

Health Care; provides requirements for accepting outside referrals for diagnostic imaging; authorizes group practices & sole practitioners to accept prescribed percentage of their patients from outside referrals for specified time; requires AHCA in conjunction with Medicaid Fraud Unit of Attorney General's Office to study certain specified business activities & arrangements of providers of clinical lab services for kidney dialysis, etc. Amends 455.654. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care

CS/SB 264 by the Committee on Judiciary

Filing of Records; authorizes filing of official records at branch offices of clerk of circuit court; provides for time of filing of official records & availability of Official Records register. Amends 28.07,.222. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary

CS/SB 1564 by the Committee on Commerce and Economic Opportunities and Senator Kirkpatrick

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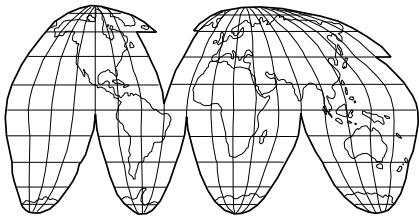
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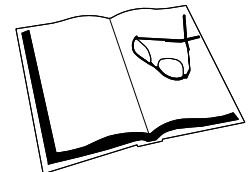
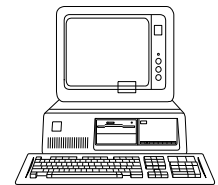
