CS/SB 1148 by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs and Senator Clary

Florida Building Code; provides for continuing validation of certifications of certain building inspectors & plans examiners for certain period of time; recognizes that rule adopting Fla. Building Code may not become final by 2000 Legislative Session if challenged pursuant to specific provision; clarifies effect on local govts. of adopting & updating said code; provides for certain rules of AHCA to be adopted as standards for electrical & alarm systems, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on April 26, 1999

Similar to **HB 1723** in the Committees on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, Regulated Industries, and Fiscal Policy

CS/CS/SB 356 by the Committee on Fiscal Policy and the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity

FRS/Optional Retirement Program; creates optional retirement program for employees who are regular members of FRS; provides that employees may participate in said program in lieu of participating in FRS; provides for retention of retirement service credits; prescribes vesting requirements; excludes participants from eligibility for certain health insurance subsidies; modifies definitions to provide for 6-year graded vesting for all members, etc. Amends Chs. 121, 112, 216. Effective Date: 07/01/2001 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on April 23, 1999

SB 8 by Senator Jones

Relief/Jose & Johammes Pena/Hialeah; provides for relief of Jose Pena, as Personal Representative of Estate of Carmen

Pena, deceased, & individually, as surviving father of Katherine Pena & Richard Pena, minor children of Carmen Pena & Jose Pena, deceased; provides for relief of Johammes Pena, surviving son of Carmen Pena; compensates them for death of Carmen Pena, Katherine Pena, & Richard Pena as result of negligence of City of Hialeah. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on March 9, 1999, read the third time on April 27, 1999. With pending amendment # 1 by Senator Jones and with pending substitute amendment # 2 by Senator Casas (April 27, 1999)

CS/SB 2000 by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Cowin

Judicial Nominating Commissions; provides for appointment of members to each judicial nominating commission; prohibits judges from serving; restricts appointment of members & former members to judicial offices for certain time period; requires appointing authorities to seek to ensure racial, ethnic, gender, & geographical diversity of membership; requires consideration of county representation on circuit judicial nominating commissions, etc. Creates 43.291; repeals 43.29. Effective Date: Upon becoming

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 1999

Identical to CS/HB 2013 in Messages

CS/SB 1352 by the Committee on Regulated Industries, Senator Bronson and others

Public Service Commission; prohibits commission from imputing prospective future contributions-in-aid-of-construction against certain utility investments in certain rate proceedings; requires commission to approve rates for certain services under certain circumstances; authorizes PSC to authorize collection of interim rates under certain circumstances; requires PSC to grant petitions to intervene which are filed by local governing bodies, etc.

Amends Ch. 367. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

CS/SB 90 by the Committee on Transportation, Senator Grant and others

Florida Safety Belt Law; provides restrictions on authority to search motor vehicle, its contents, driver, or passenger based on safety belt violation; deletes provision that requires enforcement of act only as secondary action. Amends 316.614. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

CS/HB 903 by the Committee on Insurance (CAC), Representatives Albright and Boyd

Employee Health Care Access Act; revises definition; revises & updates provisions requiring small employer carriers to offer & issue certain health benefit plans; provides additional restrictions on premium rates for certain health benefit plans. Amends 627.6699. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

With pending amendment # 2 by Senator Scott (April 28, 1999)

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 1294** (Holzendorf) and read the second time on April 28, 1999

CS/SB 1932 by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs and Senator Sullivan

Emergency Management; prescribes duties of Board of Regents re identifying public hurricane evacuation shelter space on certain campuses; revises condition precedent to requirement for

specified building construction standards; revises legislative intent to include certain private facilities within survey of prospective public hurricane evacuation shelters; defines "emergency management worker", etc. Amends 240.295, 252.38,.385,.51; repeals 252.855. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, and withdrawn from the Committee on Fiscal Policy

Similar to **HB 2029** in the Committees on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, and Fiscal Policy

SB 2244 by Senator Dyer

Building Designations/State Univ.; designates & names specified baseball field, tennis courts, tennis facility, buildings, public safety facility, golf course, golf management & learning center, athletic center & cancer center at their respective universities of Florida A&M Univ., Florida Gulf Coast Univ., Florida State Univ., Univ. of Central Florida, Univ. of Florida, & Univ. of North Florida; authorizes erection of suitable markers. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Education

Similar to HB 1735 in the Committee on Education

CS/SB 2348 by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs and Senator Carlton

Emergency Management Planning; revises provisions re registration of persons requiring special needs assistance in emergencies; provides for recruitment of health care practitioners for special needs shelters; requires nurse registries to assist at-risk clients with special needs registration & to prepare comprehensive emergency management plan; requires that certain emergency care & service information be included in hospice patients' medical records, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 10/01/1999.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, and the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care, reports the Committee substitute favorably, with two amendments and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the Committee substitute favorably, with one amendment

CS/SB 74 by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity and Senator Campbell

Culpable Negligence/Financial Injury; provides definitions; specifies offense of culpable negligence causing public financial injury; specifies elements of offense; provides penalties; requires certain notice in certain state contracts; specifies that failure to provide such notice does not constitute defense to offense; provides for prosecuting such offenses. Creates 812.030. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, and the Committee on Criminal Justice reports the Committee substitute favorably and withdrawn from the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/SB 1286 by the Committee on Education and Senator Dyer

School System Personnel; provides for establishment of model peer assistance & review programs; provides minimum standards; provides for technical assistance & allocations. Creates 231.315. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the Committee substitute favorably, with one amendment

CS/SB 1316 by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Webster

Driver's License Suspension/Alcohol; requires use of ignition interlock device for persons convicted second or subsequent time for DUI; clarifies blood-alcohol & breath-alcohol levels that are unlawful; prescribes waiting period before temporary driving permit becomes effective; provides notice requirements; authorizes use of blood tests obtained pursuant to other investigations for purposes of license suspension under certain provision, etc. Amends 316.1937, 322.2616. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Transportation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice

CS/SB 690 by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs and Senator Campbell

Housing Facilities/Older Persons; provides that certain housing facilities or communities shall be deemed housing for older persons despite specified provisions in document which governs deed restrictions pertaining to that facility or community. Amends 760.29. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs

SB 878 by Senator Myers

Department of Health; transfers powers, duties, functions, & funds of CFS Dept. re alcohol, drug abuse, & mental health programs, including mental health institutions, to Health Dept.; authorizes Health Dept. to organize & classify positions transferred; establishes within Health Dept. a Mental Health Div. &Substance Abuse Div.; conforms provisions; authorizes reimbursement of expenditures for start-up contracts; provides for rules & requires reports, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/1999 except as otherwise provided.

Reported favorably, with three amendments, by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care, and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

SB 960 by Senator Forman and others

Human Rights; redesignates Statewide Human Rights Advocacy Committee as Statewide Human Rights Advocacy Council; revises membership of statewide council; redesignates district human rights advocacy committees as local human rights councils; provides for additional local councils to be established; provides for local councils to monitor activities of, & investigate complaints against, CFS Dept., etc. Amends Chs. 39, 393, 394, 400, 402, 415. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Reported favorably, with two amendments, by the Committee on Children and Families, and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules and Calendar, and withdrawn from the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/SB 880 by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care and Senator Myers

Department of Health Care; reassigns AHCA to Dept. of Health Care; requires Executive Director of Health Care Administration to be confirmed by Senate; redesignates Dept. of Health as Dept. of Health Care; transfers to Dept. of Health Care powers, duties, functions, & assets that relate to consumer complaint services, investigations, & prosecutorial services that are performed by AHCA under contract with Dept. of Health, etc. Amends 20.42,.43. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care, and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the Committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 994 by the Committee on Education and Senator Horne

Fla. School for Deaf & Blind; authorizes DMS to provide facilities services for the Fla. School for Deaf & Blind; provides for Fla. School Improvement & Academic Achievement Trust Fund grants to said school; provides for allocation & school-level administration; revises provisions re mission & responsibilities of said school; authorizes private attorney services for said school without certain prior written approval. Amends 235.014,.017, 236.1229, 242.3305, 287.059. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education and withdrawn from the Committee on Fiscal Policy

Similar to **HB 257** in the Committees on Education and Fiscal Policy

CS/CS/SB 1470 by the Committees on Judiciary, Children and Families and Senator Mitchell

Child Support; defines term "rotating custody"; revises requirements for determination & adjustment of child support obligation; provides presumption re adult parent's ability to work; revises allowable deductions from gross income; provides responsibility for health insurance costs & noncovered medical costs; requires court review of child support obligation arrived at through settlement agreement; creates Child Support Study Commission, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children and Families, and reported favorably as acommittee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and withdrawn from the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/CS/SB 1594 by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, Criminal Justice and Senator Campbell

Juvenile Justice; adds to list of offenses that will prohibit employment of person subject to Level 2 screening standards; requires Criminal Justice Information Program to retain criminal history records of minors who are committed to maximum-risk residential program; provides for minimum-risk nonresidential programs to be used for aftercare placement of juveniles; provides for fingerprint records & photographs of juveniles to be submitted to FDLE, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, and withdrawn from the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/SB 1588 by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Grant

Domestic Violence/Mediation; provides that court may not refer case involving domestic violence to mediation except under specified conditions; provides legislative intent; requires court to assess whether domestic violence is present among parties; provides factors that court may consider in such assessment; conforms provisions; clarifies application of privilege of communications made in mediation. Creates 44.1021; amends 44.102,201. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Children and Families, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and withdrawn from the Committee on Fiscal Policy

SB 2234 by Senator Klein

Water & Wastewater/Rates/PSC; eliminates annual report to Public Service Commission by exempt utility; authorizes interim rate relief in staff-assisted rate cases; provides for interim or temporary rates when utility becomes exempt during pendency of case; conforms inconsistent provision. Amends 367.022,.0814,.082. Effective Date: 10/01/1999.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries

CS/SB 1656 by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Casas

Driving Schools; increases number of times person may elect to take driver improvement course; revises language re driver improvement schools; provides for mandatory basic driver improvement courses & mandatory driver improvement courses; revises provisions re taffic law & substance abuse education program for driver's license applicants; revises provisions re said schools, etc. Amends Ch. 322, 318.14,.1451, 627.06501. Effective Date: 10/01/1999.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and withdrawn from the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/SB 2092 by the Committee on Children and Families and Senator Sebesta

Child Care; modifies duties of state agencies re child care programs sponsored by agencies; increases maximum family income for participation in subsidized child care program; directs CFS Dept. to establish health care coverage for employees of certain subsidized child care providers through state employees health insurance program; provides for licensure of large family child care homes, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children and Families, and withdrawn from the Committee on Fiscal Resource and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the Committee substitute favorably, with four amendments

Similar to **HB 869** in the Committees on Children and Families, and Fiscal Resource

CS/SB 2250 by the Committee on Children and Families and Senator Diaz-Balart

Privatization of Foster Care; requires Child Welfare System Estimating Conference to include forecasts of child welfare caseloads within information it generates; provides for inclusion of additional classes of children in need of care among estimates; provides for hiring preference for state employees; prescribes requirements for preschool foster homes; authorizes AHCA to establish targeted case-management pilot project within certain counties, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children and Families, and withdrawn from the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/SB 1982 by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, Senator Dyer and others

Title Insurance Reserve; specifies components of unearned premium reserve for certain financial statements; provides formula for releasing unearned premium reserve over period of years; provides definitions. Amends 625.111. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance

Similar to **CS/CS/CS/HB 93** in the Committee on Banking and Insurance

SB 1894 by Senator Grant and others

Economic Development; revises criteria for approval of applications for tax refunds for economic development purposes by Office of Tourism, Trade, & Economic Development; caps amount of refunds that may be made in fiscal year; revises criteria for approval of tax refunds under tax refund program for qualified target industry businesses; extends refund program to additional counties; revises amount of refunds, etc. Amends 288.095,.106. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Commerce and Economic Opportunities, and reported favorably by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, and withdrawn from the Committee on Fiscal Resource

CS/SB 1910 by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Campbell

Representation of Indigent Defendant; requires that court review alleged conflict of interest without disclosing confidential information; provides for withdrawal of public defender unless court determines that conflict does not exist or court is unable to make determination; requires each circuit conflict committee to assess circuit's conflict representation system; requires that committees report findings & recommendations to Legislature. Amends 27.53. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and withdrawn from the Committee on Fiscal Policy

Similar to **CS/HB 327** in the Committees on Criminal Justice, Judiciary, and Fiscal Policy

CS/SB 1934 by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Brown-Waite

Communications Security; prohibits intentional disclosure of certain communications; prescribes circumstances in which person may aid in intercepting communications; removes prostitution from offenses that may be investigated using court-ordered intercepts; provides duties of officers authorized to install & use pen registers; provides guidelines & standards for emergency installation of pen registers & trap & trace devices, etc. Amends Ch. 934. Effective Date: 10/01/1999.

Withdrawn from the Committee on Commerce and Economic Opportunities, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and withdrawn from the Committee on Fiscal Policy

SB 2070 by Senator Kirkpatrick

Education Dept.; clarifies duties of Deputy Commissioner for Educational Programs; creates position of Deputy Commissioner for Technology & Administration & provides its powers, duties, responsibilities, & functions; creates Technology Division. Amends 20.15. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education and withdrawn from the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/SB 1676 by the Committee on Children and Families and Senator Forman

Cross-Reporting of Family Violence; requires animal control officers or other agents appointed under specified provision to report known or suspected child abuse, abandonment, or neglect or abuse, neglect, or exploitation of disabled adult or elderly person; requires persons who are required to report or investigate child abuse, abandonment, or neglect under specified provision to report known or suspected animal abuse, neglect, cruelty, or abandonment, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 10/01/1999.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children and Families

CS/SB 1698 by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Klein

Funeral & Cemetery Services; revises terminology re cemeteries owned by religious institution; defines term "religious institution"; authorizes Banking & Finance Dept. & Funeral & Cemetery Services Board to adopt rules to allow for electronic submission of applications, documents, & fees & to provide for certification of compliance in lieu of submission of documents; provides initial application & renewal fees for certificate of auth. to sell preneed contract, etc. Amends Ch. 497. Effective Date: 07/01/1999 except as otherwise provided.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and withdrawn from the Committee on Fiscal Resource and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the Committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 1552 by the Committee on Education, Senator Dawson-White and others

School Enrollment/Swim Lessons; authorizes each district to require each child, prior to enrollment in school, to submit evidence of whether or not he or she has learned to swim; requires district school board to provide certain information; provides for review & repeal. Creates 232.042. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education

Similar to HB 241 in the Committee on Education

CS/SB 1600 by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Campbell

Osteoporosis/Insurance Coverage; expands required insurance coverage for osteoporosis-related matters. Amends 627.6409,.6691, 641.31. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and withdrawn from the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/SB 1260 by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Brown-Waite

Sexual Predators & Offenders; streamlines sexual predator registration; amends sexual predator definition; requires that DOC or custodian of local jail notify FDLE if sexual predator escapes from custody, absconds from supervision, or dies; deletes current exemption from registration if sexual predator has civil rights restored; authorizes petition for removal of registration requirements by minor if specific criteria are met, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and withdrawn from the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/SB 1290 by the Committee on Education and Senator Horne

Education/Juvenile Justice; requires public schools of state to provide instruction for youth in Juvenile Justice Dept. programs; requires development of model contracts for delivery of educational services to youth in department programs; requires DOE to provide training & technical assistance; authorizes establishment of district advisory councils for juvenile justice education programs; requires student access to GED programs; requires certain funding, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education and the Committee on Criminal Justice reports the Committee substitute favorably and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the Committee substitute favorably, with one amendment

Similar to **CS/HB 1033** in the Committees on Education, Criminal Justice, and Fiscal Policy

CS/SB 1440 by the Committee on Education and Senator Lee

Schools/Courses of Study; authorizes certain exemptions from required reproductive health or HIV/AIDS instructional activities; conforms terminology. Amends 233.061. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education

Identical to CS/HB 309 in the Committee on Education

CS/CS/SB 1478 by the Committees on Fiscal Resource, Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs and Senator Mitchell

Crime Stoppers Funds; specifies purposes for which special county trust fund moneys may be expended by Sheriff or other law enforcement entity that operates Crime Stoppers program; provides for surcharge assessed as additional court cost to be deposited in special county trust funds for use as provided in specified provision; repeals provision which provides for Crime Stoppers Trust Fund in Legal Affairs Dept., etc. Creates 932.80; amends 938.06; repeals 16.555. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Resource

CS/SB 1068 by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care and Senator Sullivan

Physician Assistants; allows physician assistant to perform medical examination, & to authorize radiological exam. to be performed, on child who is suspected to be victim of abuse, abandonment, or neglect; provides for appointment of formulary committee to establish formulary of medicinal drugs that physician assistants may prescribe; provides standards for formulary drugs;

provides for Medicine & Osteopathic Medicine Bds. to adopt formularies, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care, and withdrawn from the Committee on Fiscal Policy

Identical to **HB 1031** in the Committees on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care, and Fiscal Policy

SB 732 by Senator Horne and others

Local Govt. 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
