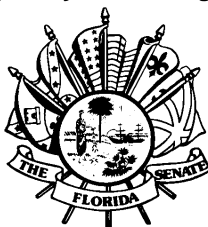

SB 710 by the Committee on Ethics and Elections and others

Primary Elections; allows all voters to vote in certain primary election contests; conforms provisions. Creates 100.065; amends 101.021,,251,,5606. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 6, 1999

CS/SB 752 by the Committee on Ethics and Elections and others

Elections/Lieutenant Governor; provides for designation of candidates for Lieutenant Governor; provides for ballot language on primary election ballots if candidate for Lieutenant Governor has not been designated by time certain; allows candidate who has qualified for public office who has withdrawn or been eliminated to be designated as candidate for Lieutenant Governor, etc. Amends Ch. 99, 100.111, 101.62, 102.112. Effective Date: 01/01/2000.

SB 754 by the Committee on Ethics and Elections and others

Elections; modifies requirements for alternative method of qualifying; modifies requirements for candidate with no party affiliation & for minor party candidate to obtain ballot position; modifies petition requirements in year of apportionment; modifies requirements for certain minor parties to have names of their candidates for President & Vice President printed on ballot, etc. Amends Chs. 99, 100, 101, 103, 105, 106. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

CS/SB 154 by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Sebesta

Trespass/School Grounds or Facility; provides for offense of trespass upon grounds or facilities of school to apply to trespass upon grounds or facilities of nonpublic school; defines term "school property." Amends 228.091. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

SB 8 by Senator Jones

Relief/Jose & Johammes Pena/Hialeah; provides for relief of Jose Pena, as Personal Representative of Estate of Carmen Pena, deceased, & individually, as surviving father of Katherine Pena & Richard Pena, minor children of Carmen Pena & Jose Pena, deceased; provides for relief of Johammes Pena, surviving son of Carmen Pena; compensates them for death of Carmen Pena, Katherine Pena, & Richard Pena as result of negligence of City of Hialeah. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

CS/CS/SB 662 by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs and Senator Carlton

One-Stop Permitting System; deletes provisions authorizing Office of Tourism, Trade, & Economic Development to make recommendations to Legislature on improving permitting procedures; requires that DMS establish One-Stop Permitting System using Internet; specifies various state agencies to be provided access to system; provides for permit fee reduction under certain circumstances; creates Quick Permitting County Designation Program within DMS, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, and the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, reports the Committee substitute favorably and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/CS/SB 252 by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Commerce and Economic Opportunities and Senator Kirkpatrick

Workforce Development; revises components of state's workforce development strategy; provides for state's One-Stop Career Center customer service delivery strategy; provides for oversight & operation of centers by regional workforce development boards & center operators; provides for assigning & leasing of employees; provides principles for implementing federal Workforce Investment Act of 1998; provides for 5-year plan, etc. Amends Ch. 288, 446, 414.026. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Economic Opportunities, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/CS/SB 256 by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Commerce and Economic Opportunities and Senator Kirkpatrick

WAGES Program; prohibits factoring of specified individuals in calculating staff-to-children ratio; establishes program for matching grants; provides funding for local WAGES coalitions through contract with Office of Tourism, Trade, & Economic Development; authorizes local WAGES coalition to assign certain additional educational activities as work requirements; requires Adjutant General to administer life preparation program & job readiness services, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/1999 unless otherwise specified in this act.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Economic Opportunities, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/SB 1150 by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, Senator Clary and others

Military Base Retention; provides legislative intent; provides for role of Fla. Defense Alliance; provides funding; removes limitation on amount of grant under Fla. Military Installation Reuse Planning & Marketing Grant Program; increases grant limitation re Fla. Defense Planning Grant Program; reduces amount of matching funds required under certain grant programs; creates Retention of Military Installations Program; provides eligibility criteria, etc. Amends 288.980. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Commerce and Economic Opportunities, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the Committee substitute favorably, with two amendments

CS/CS/SB 940 by the Committee on Fiscal Policy and the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs

Eminent Domain; requires presuit negotiation before action in eminent domain may be initiated under certain provisions; provides requirements for condemning authority; requires written offer of purchase & appraisal & specifies time period during which owner may respond to offer before condemnation lawsuit may be filed; allows business owner to claim business damage within specified time period; provides for nonbinding mediation, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 01/01/2000.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

SB 1214 by Senator Hargrett

EOG/Supplemental Appropriation; appropriates funds to Executive Office of Governor for distribution by Office of Tourism, Trade, & Economic Development; provides purposes. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Commerce and Economic Opportunities, and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

SB 1076 by Senator Webster

Governmental Controversies; renames "Florida Governmental Cooperation Act" as "Florida Governmental Conflict Resolution Act"; requires that, when local or regional governmental entity files suit against another such governmental entity, procedural options of act must be exhausted before court proceedings occur, except in specified circumstances; provides effect on existing contracts & agreements, etc. Amends, creates, & repeals Ch. 164. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, and Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs

Similar to CS/HB 223 in the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, and Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs

CS/SB 244 by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Campbell

Airbag Antitheft Act; creates said act; provides definitions; requires any person engaged in business of purchasing, selling, or installing salvaged airbags to maintain record of any purchase, sale, or installation of salvaged airbag; specifies required information; provides for inspection & disclosure of such records; requires any person who sells or installs salvaged airbag to disclose to purchaser that airbag is salvaged, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/1999.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and withdrawn from the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/SB's 54, 902 by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senators Lee and Silver

Criminal Law; (THIS BILL COMBINES S54,S902) prohibits consideration of evidence of defendant's voluntary intoxication to determine existence of mental state that is element of crime; requires that enhanced penalty be imposed if victim of felony is related by lineal consanguinity to defendant or is defendant's legal guardian. Creates 90.4051, 775.0852. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the Committee substitute favorably, with one amendment

CS/SB's 286, 722 & 1074 by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senators Campbell, Silver and Hargrett

Criminal Use of Personal ID Info.; (THIS BILL COMBINES S286,722,1074) provides that person who willfully & without authorization uses, or possesses with intent to use, personal identification info. re individual without previously obtaining individual's consent commits either offense of fraudulent use of personal ID info. or offense of harassment by use of personal ID info. depending on circumstances, etc. Creates 817.568; reenacts 464.018(1)(d), 772.102(1)(a), 895.02(1)(a). Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and withdrawn from the Committee on Fiscal Policy

SB 730 by Senator Meek

On-line Access to Criminal Records; provides each office of Public Defender on-line access to criminal records which are not exempt from disclosure & not confidential under law. Amends 943.053. Effective Date: 10/01/1999.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice and withdrawn from the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/SB 738 by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Campbell

Arrest Warrants/Issuance; provides that warrant is issued at time it is signed by magistrate; prohibits person who has been arrested

or lawfully detained by law enforcement officer from giving false name or otherwise falsely identifying himself or herself to law enforcement officer or county jail personnel; provides for increased penalty if person is adversely affected by unlawful use of person's name or other identification, etc. Amends 901.02; creates 901.36. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and withdrawn from the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/SB 912 by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Latvala

Sentencing; reclassifies penalties re offenses evidencing prejudice; reclassifies offenses involving multiple perpetrators of sexual battery. Amends 775.085, 794.023. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and withdrawn from the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/SB 336 by the Committee on Education and Senator Cowin

Students/Grade Point Averages; requires certain courses to receive weighted grades; authorizes certain courses to be designated as both dual enrollment & advanced placement courses. Amends 240.1163. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education

SB 330 by Senator Carlton and others

School Districts/Patriotic Programs; authorizes district school board rules to require patriotic programs & provides program requirements; requires recitation of pledge of allegiance. Creates 233.0655. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Education

SB 1292 by the Committee on Education

College Reach-out Program; specifies proposals to be given preference under program; repeals provision re legislative review & repeal of program. Amends 240.61. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Education

SB 1472 by Senator Mitchell

Insurance/Countersignature Law; provides exemption to countersignature law; defines term "claim" for purposes of property claim mediation. Amends 624.426, 627.7015. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Banking and Insurance

CS/SB 1978 by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Diaz-Balart

Personal Injury Protection; allows insureds to elect multiple personal injury protection policy limitations; deletes requirement that insurers offer certain limitations; allows insureds to receive appropriate premium reductions; requires notice; requires insurers to give policyholders notice of renewal premium; provides for continuation of policy coverage at existing rates if insurer fails to comply. Amends 627.739; creates 627.7277. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance

CS/CS/SB 304 by the Committee on Fiscal Policy, the Committee on Ethics and Elections and others

Ethics/Financial Interests; redefines terms "gift" & "liability"; revises reporting requirements for full & public disclosure of financial interests; transfers filing administration from Secretary of State to Ethics Comm.; requires former officers & employees to file final disclosure of financial interests no later than 60 days following departure; authorizes Technology Research & Development Authority to make certain gifts under certain circumstances, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 01/01/2000.

With pending amendment #1 by Senator Saunders (April 6, 1999)

SB 756 by the Committee on Ethics and Elections and others

Elections; provides for election of school bd. members in nonpartisan election; provides for qualifying for nonpartisan office & alternative method of qualifying for nonpartisan candidates; provides for electors that are eligible to vote for said candidates; provides for reporting of contributions & expenditures for said candidates; repeals provisions re endorsement of judicial candidates by partisan organizations, etc. Amends Chs. 99, 101, 105, 228, 230. Effective Date: 01/01/2000.

With pending amendment #1 by the Committee on Ethics and Elections (April 6, 1999)

SB 866 by Senator Lee

Candidates for Public Office; requires subordinate officer, deputy sheriff, or police officer seeking public office to resign or take leave of absence, depending on certain circumstances re office sought. Amends 99.012. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Ethics and Elections

*Identical to **HB 125** in the Committee on Ethics and Elections*

SB 2200 by Senator Laurent

Elections/State Agencies/Soliciting; prohibits state agencies from soliciting pledges or authorizing or conducting polls or surveys re candidacies for public office; exempts polls or surveys conducted by institutions of higher learning for research purposes. Effective Date: 10/01/1999.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Ethics and Elections

SB 280 by Senator Sullivan

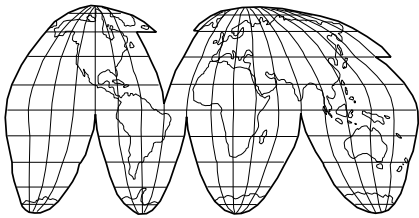

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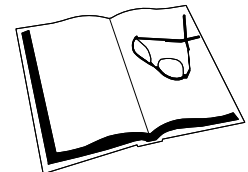
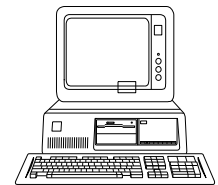
