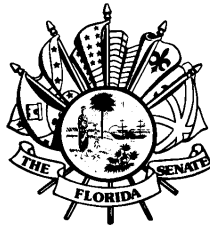

BILLS ON THIRD READING

CS/CS/SB 1468 by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Criminal Justice and Senator Brown-Waite

Statewide Drug Control; creates Office of Drug Control within Executive Office of Governor; provides for office to be headed by director appointed by Governor & subject to Senate confirmation; requires director of said office to report annually to Governor & Legislature; creates Statewide Drug Policy Advisory Council within Executive Office of Governor; provides for payment of per diem & travel expenses; amends provisions to conform, etc. Amends Ch. 397. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

CS/CS/SB 94 by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Criminal Justice and Senator Rossin

Driving or Boating Under Influence; increases penalty imposed for fourth or subsequent conviction of DUI; increases penalties imposed for causing serious bodily injury while driving under influence; provides that it is first-degree felony to cause death of another while DUI; revises blood-alcohol or breath-alcohol level; provides that previous convictions for boating under influence are to be considered for purposes of penalties, etc. Amends 316.193, 327.35, 921.0022. Effective Date: 10/01/1999.

SB 168 by Senator McKay

Alcohol or Drugs/DUI; provides that motor vehicle is subject to forfeiture under Fla. Contraband Act if motor vehicle is driven by person under influence of alcohol or drugs & person's license is suspended as result of prior conviction for DUI; requires that notification of impoundment or seizure be sent to HSMV Dept.; redefines term "contraband article" re Fla. Contraband Act to conform to changes made by act, etc. Amends 322.34, 932.701; reenacts 932.703. Effective Date: 10/01/1999.

CS/SB 156 by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, Senator Hargrett and others

Alcohol & Tobacco Products/Minors; amends provision re purchase of alcohol by minors; provides restrictions on locations for on-premises consumption of alcoholic beverages; amends provision re purchase of tobacco products by minors. Amends 562.11,.45, 569.11. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

CS/SB 60 by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Brown-Waite and others

Pretrial Intervention Programs; authorizes court to deny admission of defendant to pretrial substance-abuse education & treatment intervention program if defendant has rejected any prior offer of admission to such program. Amends 948.08. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

SB 138 by Senator Bronson

Victims & Witnesses/Fair Treatment; allows specified state agencies to participate in crime prevention & educational activities re fair treatment of victims & witnesses in justice system; provides for use of funds. Amends 960.001. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Read the second time and amended on March 17, 1999

CS/SB 166 by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Brown-Waite and others

Law Enforcement Agencies/Operations; provides it is third-degree felony to contact or communicate with any person who is directly involved in tactical operation of law enforcement agency or to authorize broadcast or telecast of any recording or depiction of tactical operation of law enforcement agency during course of operation; requires that law enforcement agency inform public of conclusion of such tactical operation; encourages development of protocol, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

SB 72 by Senator Campbell

Homicide/Vehicular & Vessel; increases penalties imposed for committing offense of vehicular homicide or vessel homicide; increases penalties imposed for committing vehicular homicide or vessel homicide & failing to give information & render aid when offender knew, or should have known, that accident occurred; amends certain provision re Criminal Punishment Code; conforms references to changes made by act. Amends 782.071,.072, 921.0022. Effective Date: 10/01/1999.

Read the second time on March 17, 1999

CS/SB 152 by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Brown-Waite and others

Controlled Substances; amends provision re scheduling of controlled substances for purpose of penalizing unlawful acts involving controlled substances; deletes references to dextropropoxyphene in its nondosage forms from Schedule II; adds references to propoxyphene in its nondosage forms to Schedule II; deletes references to gamma-hydroxybutyrate from Schedule II; adds references to gamma-hydroxybutyric acid to Schedule II, etc. Amends Ch. 893; reenacts FS. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

SB 8 by Senator Jones

Relief/Jose & Johannes Pena/Hialeah; provides for relief of Jose Pena, as Personal Representative of Estate of Carmen Pena, deceased, & individually, as surviving father of Katherine Pena & Richard Pena, minor children of Carmen Pena & Jose Pena, deceased; provides for relief of Johannes Pena, surviving son of Carmen Pena; compensates them for death of Carmen Pena, Katherine Pena, & Richard Pena as result of negligence of City of Hialeah. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

SENATE BILLS ON SECOND READING

CS/CS/SB 2 by the Committees on Children and Families, Judiciary, Senator Campbell and others

Adoption; removes provisions authorizing licensed child-placing agencies to file actions to terminate parental rights; provides additional requirements for petition for adoption; prohibits filing such petition until order terminating parental rights is final; provides duties of adoption entity to prospective adoptive parents; provides for placement of minor pending adoption, etc. Amends Chs. 39, 63, 984.03, 985.03. Effective Date: 10/01/1999.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children and Families

SB 16 by Senator Geller

Relief/Jeremy Stewart/Sanibel; provides for relief of Jeremy Stewart; compensates him for injuries & damages sustained as result of negligence of City of Sanibel. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Recommended favorably, with one amendment, by The Special Master on Claim Bills and reported favorably, with two amendments, by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, and reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Fiscal Resource

CS/SB 62 by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, Senator Thomas and others

Bone Marrow Transplants; requires that coverage for bone-marrow-transplant procedures include costs of donor patient; makes legislative finding that provisions of act fulfill important state interest. Amends 627.4236. Effective Date: 01/01/2000.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and withdrawn from the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/SB 64 by the Committee on Judiciary, Senator Grant and others

Citizen Participation in Govt. Act; creates "Citizen Participation in Government Act" & provides for its purposes; defines terms; provides procedures for judiciary to respond to lawsuits re constitutional right to petition government for redress of grievances. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, reports the Committee substitute favorably, with one amendment

CS/SB 82 by the Committee on Transportation, Senator Brown-Waite and others

Road & Bridge Designations; codesignates portion of SR 54 in Pasco Co. as "State Trooper James Crooks Hwy."; designates Fla. Highway Patrol substation on SR 52 in Land O'Lakes as "State Trooper James Crooks Substation"; directs DOT to erect two additional markers for "Purple Heart Highway" on SR 54; designates portion of SR 9 from 58th St. to Co. 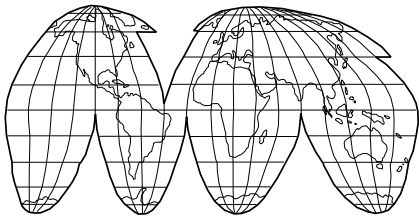

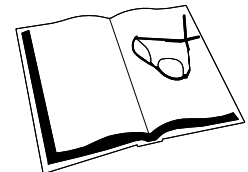
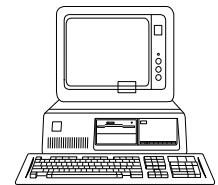
