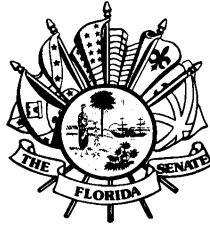

BILLS ON THIRD READING

SB 2500 by the Committee on Budget

General Appropriations; provides moneys for annual period beginning July 1, 1999, & ending June 30, 2000, to pay salaries, & other expenses, capital outlay - buildings, & other improvements, & for other specified purposes of various agencies of State government; provides retroactive effective date. Effective Date: 07/01/1999 or upon becoming law, whichever occurs later.

Read the second time and amended on March 25, 1999

SB 2502 by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

Appropriations Implementing Bill; implements fiscal year 1999-2000 General Appropriations Act; provides legislative intent; authorizes CFS Dept. & AHCA to transfer general revenue funds between them; provides that specified funds are to be used to increase adult mental health equity funding in specified districts; specifies how AHCA shall make payments for Medicaid disproportionate share program for mental health hospitals; provides severability & retroactivity, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Read the second time and amended on March 25, 1999

CS/SB 108 by the Committee on Commerce and Economic Opportunities and Senator McKay

Unemployment Compensation; extends for an additional year temporary reduction in certain contribution rates for specified employers; clarifies provisions re disqualification for benefits; extends for specified period temporary increase in maximum weekly & yearly benefit amounts for unemployment compensation benefits; specifies benefit years; provides extension for Fla. Training Investment Program. Amends 443.101,.111,.231. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

CS/SB 318 by the Committee on Fiscal Resource and Senator Lee

Intangible Personal Property Taxes; reduces rate of intangible property taxes; prescribes amount of accounts receivable subject to tax as of January 1, 2000; provides that an exemption applies to last 0.5 mill of annual tax. Amends 199.032,.185. Effective Date: 01/01/2000.

CS/SB 140 by the Committee on Fiscal Resource, Senator Cowin and others

Fla. Residents' Tax Relief Act; specifies period during which sale of clothing shall be exempt from tax on sales, use, & other transactions; defines "clothing" for purposes of exemption; provides for rules. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on March 25, 1999

CS/SB 172 by the Committee on Fiscal Resource, Senator Horne and others

Taxation; reduces period for tolling certain statutes of limitations; prescribes circumstances for tolling of said statutes as result of administrative or judicial proceedings; provides for annual issuance of resale certificates to active accounts; authorizes DOR to disclose to dealer or taxpayer whether specified certificate is active, canceled, inactive, or invalid, etc. Amends 95.091, 193.063, 212.07,.11,.18, 213.053, 215.26; creates 213.235,.255. Effective Date: 07/01/1999 except as otherwise provided.

CS/SB 64 by the Committee on Judiciary, Senator Grant and others

Citizen Participation in Govt. Act; creates "Citizen Participation in Government Act" & provides for its purposes; defines terms; provides procedures for judiciary to respond to lawsuits re constitutional right to petition government for redress of grievances. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on March 24, 1999

SB 130 by Senator Klein

Juveniles/Prosecution as Adults; provides for juvenile to be prosecuted as adult if juvenile is charged with grand theft of motor vehicle & has prior adjudication for grand theft of motor vehicle; reenacts specified provision re state attorney's authority to prosecute juvenile as adult, to incorporate amendment in references thereto. Amends 985.227; reenacts 985.21(4)(e). Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

CS/SB 154 by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Sebesta

Trespass/School Grounds or Facility; provides for offense of trespass upon grounds or facilities of school to apply to trespass upon grounds or facilities of nonpublic school; defines term "school property." Amends 228.091. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Read the second time on March 24, 1999

CS/SB 144 by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Hargrett

Murphy Act Lands; provides for conveyance of all Murphy Act transportation easements to governmental entity currently having title to adjacent roadway; requires establishment of procedure for review of deeds containing Murphy Act transportation reservations; sets requirements for review process; provides for compensation of certain property owners if reservation denies property owner current economic use of property, etc. Amends 253.82, 712.04,.05. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

SB 114 by Senator Brown-Waite

Florida Independent Living Council; authorizes Florida Independent Living Council to incorporate as corporation not for profit; allows increase in number of members; amends prerequisites to Governor's appointment of council members. Amends 413.395. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Read the second time and amended on March 24, 1999

SB 248 by Senator Kurth

Orthotics/Prosthetics/Pedorthics; allows person who met experience requirement to practice orthotics, prosthetics, or pedorthics before specified date to apply for licensure, based on person's experience & educational preparation, without meeting educational requirements set forth in statute. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

CS/SB 714 by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, Senator Mitchell and others

Fla. World War II Veterans Memorial; provides for construction of memorial to Florida residents who served during World War II; specifies source of moneys; directs Commission on Veterans' Affairs to cooperate with Capitol Center Planning Commission to report on cost & appropriate location of memorial; directs Governor to arrange for appropriate ceremony; takes effect 07/01/1999, if SB 716 or similar legislation is adopted in same legislative session or extension thereof. Effective Date: Contingent.

CS/SB 716 by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, Senator Mitchell and others

Fla. World War II Vet. Memorial TF; creates Fla. World War II Veterans Memorial Matching Trust Fund within Veterans' Affairs Dept.; provides for sources of moneys & purposes; provides for future review & termination or re-creation of trust fund; takes effect 07/01/1999, if SB 714 or similar legislation is adopted in same legislative session or extension thereof. Effective Date: Contingent.

Read the second time on March 24, 1999

CS/SB 288 by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity and Senator Lee

Fla. Prepaid College Program; provides for transfer of Fla. Prepaid College Program benefits to certain applied technology diploma programs & vocational certificate programs; requires direct-support organization to operate under written contract with board; provides contract requirements; requires annual financial & compliance audit; provides for such organizations to invest funds with moneys invested under Fla. Prepaid College Trust Fund, etc. Amends 240.551. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

SB 676 by Senator Horne

Taxation/Citrus Processing Company; revises definitions re income tax code to incorporate most recent changes to U.S. Internal Revenue Code; defines "citrus processing company"; allows certain citrus processing companies to elect to determine apportionment of their adjusted federal income to this state solely by use of the sales factor; provides for retroactive application. Amends 220.03,.151. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

CS/CS/SB 740 by the Committees on Judiciary, Commerce and Economic Opportunities and Senator Campbell

UCC/Letters of Credit; revises article 5 of Uniform Commercial Code re letters of credit; provides formal requirements; provides that consideration is unnecessary; provides for issuance, amendment, cancellation, & duration; specifies rights & obligations of confirmers, nominated persons, & advisers; provides issuer's rights & obligations; provides procedures for counteracting fraud & forgery, etc. Amends 95.11, 671.105, 672.512, 675.101-.117, 679.103-.106,.304,.305. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Read the second time on March 24, 1999

CS/HB 133 by the Committee on Financial Services (CAC), Representative Goodlette and others

Corporations/Shareholder Voting; provides alternative methods for appointing proxies by shareholders; clarifies provisions re conversion of shares in certain internal mergers of corporations. Amends 607.0722,.11045. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

SB 876 by Senator Forman and others

"Sandy" Nininger & Jim Smith Bldgs.; designates State Veterans' Nursing Home in Pembroke Pines as Alexander "Sandy" Nininger, Jr. State Veterans' Nursing Home; directs Veterans' Affairs Dept. to erect suitable markers; designates Florida Records Storage Center of Department of State as Jim Smith Building; directs Department of State to erect suitable markers. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Read the second time and amended on March 24, 1999

SB 212 by Senator Diaz-Balart

Witnesses in Judicial Proceedings; prohibits threatening employee with dismissal because of employee's testimony or appearance as witness in judicial proceeding; authorizes court to hold employer in contempt for dismissing, or threatening to dismiss, employee because of employee's appearance or testimony as witness. Amends 92.57. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Read the second time on March 24, 1999

SB 712 by the Committee on gubernatorial Appointments and Confirmations and others

Executive Appointments; amends provisions re various executive appointments; deletes obsolete provisions; requires that Secretary of Juvenile Justice be confirmed by Senate; requires Health Care Administration Director to be confirmed by Senate; specifies terms of members of certain councils, commissions & boards; repeals provisions re terms of members of Board of Nursing & terms & appointment of members of Parole Commission, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 10/01/1999.

Read the second time and amended on March 24, 1999

CS/HB 13 by the Committee on Crime & Punishment (CRC) and Representative Heyman

Restitution; specifies retention of jurisdiction by county courts to enforce restitution under certain circumstances. Amends 775.089. Effective Date: 10/01/1999.

Substituted for CS/SB 744 (Campbell), read the second time and amended on March 24, 1999

SB 1396 by Senator Burt

Drugs, Devices, Cosmetics/FDA; exempts from certain provisions manufacturers of medical devices that meet specified requirements of federal FDA; requires certain information to be submitted with such manufacturer's application for permit to do business in this state. Amends 499.015. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Read the second time and amended on March 24, 1999

SB 326 by Senator Thomas

Treasurer/Deferred Compensation Plan; provides that fees contributed by participants in Government Employees' Deferred Compensation Plan Act shall not be included in unencumbered balance of certain trust fund maintained by Treasurer. Amends 18.125, 112.215. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on March 24, 1999

CS/SB 1280 by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Laurent

Financial Institutions; revises time period within which state financial institutions must notify dept. concerning appointment or employment of certain individuals; authorizes Banking & Finance Dept. to exempt certain financial institutions from reporting requirements re directors & executive officers; revises notice & disclosure requirements; exempts certain financial institutions from reporting requirements, etc. Amends 655.0385, 948, 658.26. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Read the second time on March 24, 1999

CS/SB 932 by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Brown-Waite

Corrections Dept./Contracts; limits services that may be provided by dept. when it contracts with governmental entities for

planning & designing buildings, parks, roads, & other projects. Amends 944.10. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Read the second time on March 24, 1999

SB 1514 by Senator Clary

Hospices; prescribes additional subjects that must be addressed in rules of Elderly Affairs Dept.; authorizes hospices to contract for physician services; authorizes physician services & home health aide services to be provided through contract; prescribes additional facilities in which hospice services may be provided; prescribes responsibility for care & services of persons admitted to hospice programs, etc. Amends 400.605, 6085, 609. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Read the second time and amended on March 24, 1999

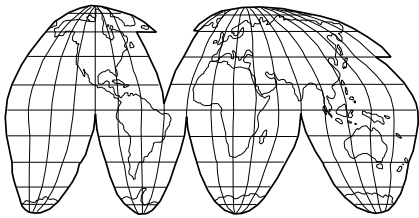

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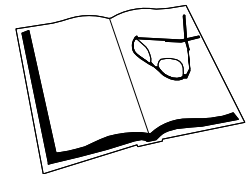
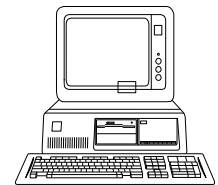
