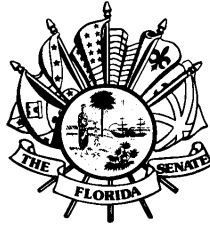

BILLS ON THIRD READING

SB 2200 by the Committee on Budget

Appropriations; provides moneys for annual period beginning July 1, 2000, & ending June 30, 2001, to pay salaries, & other expenses, capital outlay - buildings, & other improvements, & for other specified purposes of various agencies of State government. Effective Date: 07/01/2000 or upon becoming law, whichever occurs later, except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on March 30, 2000

CS/SB 2202 by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

Appropriations Implementing Bill; provides that specified funds are to be allocated based on equity & are not subject to specific provisions; specifies how AHCA shall make payments for Medicaid disproportionate share program for mental health hospitals; provides formula for rural hospital disproportionate share payments; prescribes conditions upon which adjustment in hospital's inpatient per diem rate may be based, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2000 except as otherwise provided.

CS/SB 1026 by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity , Senator Silver and others

Florida Retirement System; prescribes method for calculating average final compensation; provides that members employed in regularly established position shall be vested after 5 yrs. of creditable service; provides that any terminated, inactive member must be actively employed in covered position for 1 calendar yr. or more on or after bill's effective date to achieve vested status with 5 yrs. of service; provides funding of 1999 actuarial experience study, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2000 except as otherwise provided.

Intangible Personal Property Taxes; reduces rate of such tax; reduces rates of tax on securities in Florida Futures Investment Fund to conform; exempts accounts receivable from tax as of specified date; deletes exemption from tax to conform; amends definition of term "beneficial interest"; relieves trustees of specified obligations; provides additional assurance to holders of bonds secured by shared funds, etc. Amends Ch. 199, 218.25. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

SB 64 by Senator Cowin

Sales Tax; specifies period during which sale of clothing shall be exempt from tax on sales, use, & other transactions; specifies period during which taxes collected from sale of clothing shall be used to augment funding of grants & aid for adult & children's mental health services; exempts sales at certain locations from tax exemption; specifies period during which sale of school supplies is exempt from sales tax; provides for rules, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

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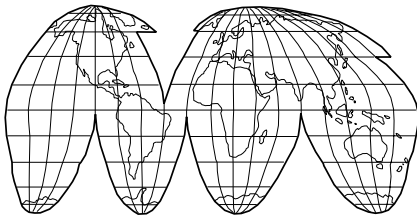
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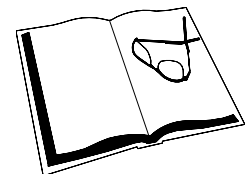
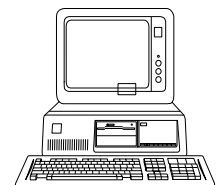
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
