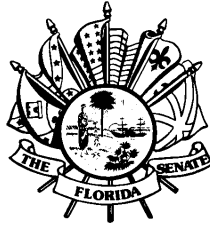

Smoking Areas/Restaurants; reduces percentage of seats required to be in area designated as smoking area in restaurants; amends provision re definition of term "public place" to remove size limitation. Amends 386.203,.205. Effective Date: 10/01/2000 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time on April 5, 2000

CS/CS/SB 134 by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Criminal Justice and Senator Diaz-Balart

Pretrial Release; revises criteria for bail determination; prohibits persons charged with dangerous crimes from being placed on pretrial release on nonmonetary conditions at first appearance hearings; authorizes court to order pretrial detention for persons on pretrial release who commit new crimes under certain circumstances; revises time period for bond forfeiture payment & notice, etc. Amends 903.046,.26, 907.041; creates 903.0471. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

Generic & Brand-Name Drug Formulary; requires Board of Medicine & Board of Pharmacy to provide recommendations & submit report to Legislature concerning formulary for generic & brand-name drugs; repeals provision which requires establishment of formulary of generic & brand-name drug products which are inequivalent. Repeals 465.025(6). Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

SB 428 by the Committee on Judiciary

Trial Court Jurisdiction; increases amount in controversy over which county court has jurisdiction; conforms reference. Amends 34.01. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

SB 156 by Senator Klein

Funeral & Cemetery Services; revises terminology re cemeteries owned by religious institution; authorizes Banking & Finance Dept. & Funeral & Cemetery Services Board to adopt rules to allow for electronic submission of applications, documents, & fees & to provide for certification of compliance in lieu of submission of documents; eliminates reference to examination fee; increases annual license fees for certain cemeteries, etc. Amends Ch. 497. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and withdrawn from the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/SB 210 by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity

Deferred Compensation Programs; clarifies & defines term "employee" to include any constitutional county officer under specified provision of State Constitution; provides for protection of existing contractual relationships; provides for negotiation of joint deferred compensation program interlocal government agreement for respective employees of county political subdivisions & county constitutional officers, etc. Amends 112.215. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity

SB 300 by Senator Sebesta

Securities/Unlawful Sales; provides that certain unlawful sales of securities are not subject to rescission or other penalties. Amends 517.211. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance

Similar to CS/HB 57 in Messages

SB 828 by Senator Grant

Insurance/Medicare Supplement Policy; redefines term "Medicare supplement policy" for purposes of Florida Medicare Supplement Reform Act to exclude specified policies & plans. Amends 627.672. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance

CS/SB 1560 by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Horne

Bail Bond Premiums; requires reporting of net amounts of certain bail bond premiums; provides minimum requirement for direct written premiums for bail bonds; provides application; provides reporting requirements for assumed premiums; requires recordkeeping; requires disclosure of certain information in annual statements. Creates 624.4094. Effective Date: 10/01/2000.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance

CS/SB 930 by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Grant

Industrial Insured Captive Insurers; specifies requirements for industrial insureds of industrial insured captive insurer; provides additional requirement for industrial insured captive insurers. Amends 628.903. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance

SB 2150 by Senator Holzendorf

Insurance Agents/Continuing Educ.; allows certain interactive, on-line continuing education courses to use unmonitored testing. Amends 626.2815. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance

CS/SB 2028 by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Grant

Consumer Finance; provides for delinquency charges on consumer finance loans; prescribes standards for imposition of such charges; revises disclosure requirements for retail installment contracts. Amends 516.031, 520.07. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance

CS/SB 120 by the Committee on Ethics and Elections and Senator Klein

Illegal Campaign Contributions; increases penalties for making certain illegal campaign contributions. Amends 106.09. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Ethics and Elections, and withdrawn from the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/SB 2158 by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Holzendorf

Insurance; provides that part VI of Fla. Insurance Code regulating adjusters does not apply to employees or agents of certain governmental entities; provides exception to minimum down-payment requirement for motor vehicle insurance policies. Amends 626.852, 627.7295. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance

SB 794 by Senator Saunders

Underage Witness Protection; requires judge to protect witness under specific age from undue harassment or embarrassment during interrogation & to restrict unnecessary repetition of questions; requires that questions be stated in form appropriate to age & understanding of witness; authorizes court to forbid questions that are not in form reasonably understood. Amends 90.612. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary

SB 294 by Senator Forman

Alexander Nininger, Jr. Nursing Home; designates State Veterans' Nursing Home in Pembroke Pines as Alexander "Sandy" Nininger, Jr. State Veterans' Nursing Home; directs Veterans' Affairs Dept. to erect suitable markers. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs

SB 1042 by Senator Saunders

Unclaimed Funds Held By Guardian; increases threshold value of such funds for which publication of notice of disposition is required. Amends 744.534. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary

CS/SB 1066 by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Klein

Durable Powers of Attorney; provides for durable powers of attorney contingent upon specified condition; provides guidelines for such powers; provides statutory forms for affidavits to attest to specified condition. Amends 709.08. Effective Date: 01/01/2001.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary

SB 1118 by Senator Mitchell

Research & Development Authority; deletes requirements re membership of authority affiliated with National High Magnetic Field Laboratory. Amends 159.703. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, and Commerce and Economic Opportunities

*Identical to **HB 479** in the Committees on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, and Commerce and Economic Opportunities*

CS/CS/SB 1114 by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Agriculture and Consumer Services and Senator Thomas

Agric. & Horticulture Protection; clarifies provisions re requirement to immediately inform Agric. & Consumer Services Dept. upon receipt or possession of any noxious weed, plant, plant product, or regulated article infected or infested with any plant pest, declared to be threat to state's agricultural & horticultural interests, & to hold such weed, plant, or article for inspection; provides for classification of lands subject to eradication or quarantine programs, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Agriculture and Consumer Services, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/SB 840 by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Carlton and others

Sexual Abuse Cases; defines term "sexual abuse"; provides for admissibility of defendant's confession or admission in specified sexual abuse cases without proof of corpus delicti of crime under certain conditions; provides for court hearing; requires corroborating evidence of trustworthiness of defendant's confession or admission; allows hearsay evidence at such hearing; requires specific findings of fact by court on record. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and the Committee on Judiciary reports the Committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 1854 by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Brown-Waite

Delinquency or Dependency of Child; defines terms "child in need of services," "delinquent child," & "dependent child" re crime of contributing to delinquency or dependency of child. Amends 827.04. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice

CS/SB 830 by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Grant

Perpetuities/Trusts; revises certain criteria for application of rule to certain trusts; specifies exclusivity of application of rule; excludes common-law expressions; provides for judicial & nonjudicial modifications of certain trusts under certain circumstances; provides for representation of certain persons in modification actions; specifies nonapplication to certain trusts, etc. Amends 689.225; creates 737.4031-.4033. Effective Date: 12/31/2000.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary

Similar to CS/HB 599 in the Committee on Judiciary

CS/SB 2190 by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Saunders

Business Entities/Merger/Conversion; deletes requirement that deed be recorded in order to transfer title to real property incident to merger; clarifies application of limited liability company name requirements to fictitious name; deletes requirement that deed be recorded in order to transfer title to real property incident to conversion of partnership or limited partnership, etc. Amends 607.11101, 608.4383,.406, 620.204,.8904,.8906; creates 694.16. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary

SB 354 by Senator Klein

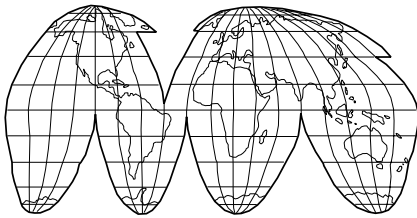

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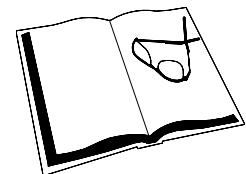
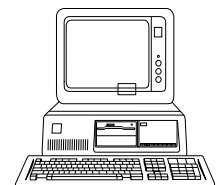
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
