Amends 112.324. Effective Date: Contingent.

CS/SB 1106 by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Sebesta

The Florida Election Code/Violation; provides that person who agrees, conspires, combines, or confederates with another person to knowingly commit violation of Florida Election Code is

punishable as if he or she committed violation; exempts certain violations of Florida Election Code from provisions specifying ranking of offense under Criminal Punishment Code, etc. Amends 104.091, 777.04. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Ethics and Elections, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and withdrawn from the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/SB 946 by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Sebesta

Offenses by Public Servants; authorizes Statewide Prosecutor to prosecute violations of chapter on Bribery; Misuse of Public Office; provides criteria for placement & removal of names on convicted vendor list; provides for exception to perjury in official proceedings; creates "Citizens' Right to Honest Government Act"; deletes specified felonies from & adds specified felonies to Criminal Punishment Code, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 10/01/2000.

Reported favorably, with three amendments, by the Committee on Ethics and Elections, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice

SB 1108 by Senator Sebesta

Public Records/Criminal Justice; provides exemption from public records requirements for certain public records provided to &compiled by criminal justice agency which contain active investigative information or active criminal intelligence information; provides exemption for any court process used to secure such information; provides for future review & repeal; provides finding of public necessity, etc. Amends 119.07. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

SB 1714 by Senator Latvala and others

Campaign Financing; specifies that certain endorsements are not contributions or expenditures for purposes of Campaign Financing Law; prohibits contributions made during certain period preceding first primary election through general election which exceed specified amount; requires state executive committee of each political party to report contributions in excess of specified amount to Elections Div. within Dept. of State, etc. Amends Ch. 106. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

Board of Dentistry; revises qualifications of members of board. Amends 466.004. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

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
