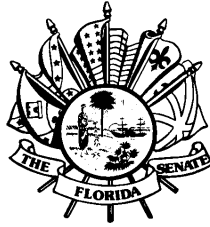

#### **CS/SB 946 by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Sebesta**

**Offenses by Public Servants;** authorizes Statewide Prosecutor to prosecute violations of chapter on Bribery; Misuse of Public Office; provides criteria for placement & removal of names on convicted vendor list; creates "Citizens' Right to Honest Government Act"; provides status of confidential informants or confidential sources; authorizes public servants who are subjected to investigation for official misconduct to recover attorney's fees, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 10/01/2000.

*Read the second time on March 15, 2000, and amended on March 15 & 16, 2000*

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#### **SB 1108 by Senator Sebesta**

**Public Records/Criminal Justice;** provides that identity of confidential informants or confidential sources is exempt from disclosure; provides for future review & repeal; provides finding of public necessity. Amends 119.07. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

#### **SR 1076 by Senator Sullivan and others**

**Florida's State Parks/America's Best;** commends DEP's Recreation & Parks Division for receiving 1999 National State Park Gold Medal, signifying that Florida's state park system is best in all 50 states; encourages all Floridians to support Florida's state parks, voted "America's Best"; recognizes July, 2000, as "Parks & Recreation Month" in celebration of benefits of all state, national, & local parks in Florida.

#### **SB 1014 by Senator Saunders**

**Board of Dentistry;** revises qualifications of members of board. Amends 466.004. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

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#### **CS/SB 688 by the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator Sullivan**

**Public Accountancy;** extends application deadline for licensure based on certain practice experience; revises practice requirement of partnerships, corporations, & limited liability companies re ownership; provides restrictions on use of practice titles, designations, & abbreviations. Amends 473.308,.309,.322. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries*

*Similar to **CS/HB 405** in the Committee on Regulated Industries*

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#### **CS/SB 234 by the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator Silver**

**Alcoholic Bev./Students/Curriculum;** provides exemption for giving or serving to certain underage students alcoholic beverages that are delivered as part of required curriculum at accredited institution; provides exemption for possession of alcoholic beverages by underage students in specified circumstances. Amends 562.11,.111. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries*

*Similar to **CS/HB 5** in the Committee on Regulated Industries*

## **SB 70 by Senator Diaz-Balart**

**Thomas Barkdull District Courthouse;** designates courthouse of District Court of Appeal for Third District as "Thomas H. Barkdull, Jr., District Courthouse"; authorizes Third District Court of Appeal to erect suitable markers. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary*

*Similar to **HB 17** in the Committee on Judiciary*

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## **CS/SB 140 by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs and Senator Geller**

**Local Govt. Code Enforcement Boards;** authorizes suits to recover money judgments & costs; provides alternative for posting certain notices. Amends 162.09,.10,.12. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs*

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## **CS/SB 224 by the Committee on Commerce and Economic Opportunities and Senator Laurent**

**Warehouse Receipt;** revises definition of term "warehouse receipt" to include electronic notification. Amends 671.201. Effective Date: 10/01/2000.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Economic Opportunities*

*Similar to **CS/HB 143** in the Committee on Commerce and Economic Opportunities*

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## **SB 892 by Senator King**

**Insurance Claims/Electronic Payments;** authorizes payment of certain claims by debit card or other form of electronic transfer under certain circumstances. Amends 627.4035. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance*

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## **SB 360 by Senator Campbell and others**

**Local Govts./Bldgs./Public Nuisance;** authorizes local governments to take local administrative action to declare certain buildings & premises to be public nuisance when building or premises is used to deal in stolen property. Amends 893.138. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

*Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs*

*Similar to **HB 65** in the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs*

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## **CS/CS/CS/SB's 852, 2 & 46 by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Criminal Justice, the Committee on Education, Dyer, Carlton and others**

**School Safety & Security;** (THIS BILL COMBINES S852,2,46) revises criteria for determining school's performance grade category for specified school years; establishes Partnership for School Safety & Security; requires each district school board to review its zero-tolerance policy & ensure inclusion of specific offenses; prohibits students referred to child study team from enrolling in home education program, etc. Amends Chs. 229, 230, 231, 232, 235, 414, 984. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

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## **CS/SB 1002 by the Committee on Education**

**Public Records/Educational Facility;** provides exemption from public records & meetings requirements for portions of blueprints of educational facility, including state university facility; provides for future legislative review & repeal; provides for rulemaking authority; provides for persons who have bona-fide need to know such information; provides finding of public necessity. Effective Date: Contingent.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules and Calendar*

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## **SB 990 by the Committee on Education**

**Students/High School Grading;** requires certain reports; encourages certain grading practices; requires grade-point-average calculation for Bright Futures Scholarship Program; prohibits certain exemption; authorizes school districts to abandon certain high school grading practices; provides definitions; repeals provision re weighting of grades in dual enrollment & advanced placement courses. Amends 230.23, 232.24521,.2463; repeals 240.1163(4). Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

*Reported favorably, with two amendments, by the Committee on Education*

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## **SB 748 by the Committee on Education**

**Professional Teaching Fellowship Act;** provides intent to demonstrate benefits of said program to prepare new teachers & to provide certain professional development activities to support them; provides for recruitment of persons to participate in fellowship program by means of forgivable loans; provides conditions for repayment of loans not eligible for loan forgiveness; establishes professional development program for recipients of fellowship & other college graduates, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Education and reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

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## **CS/SB 50 by the Committee on Education, Senator Sullivan and others**

#### **SB 1378 by Senator Bronson**

**Consumer Protection;** requires certain health studio contract refunds to be issued within time certain; specifies additional info required in certain business opportunity contract disclosure statements; revises application of requirements for certain securities re selling business opportunities; revises certain requirements for motor vehicle repair shop registrations, etc. Amends Chs. 325, 501, 559; repeals 559.903(5). Effective Date: 10/01/2000.

*Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Agriculture and Consumer Services*

#### **SB 1396 by Senator Mitchell**

**Sales Tax/Nonprofit Water Systems;** exempts certain nonprofit water systems from tax on sales, use, & other transactions. Amends 212.08. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

*Reported favorably by the Committees on Fiscal Resource and Commerce and Economic Opportunities*

#### **SB 1414 by Senator Childers**

**Environmental Permitting;** provides for accelerated development of implementing actions for permitting program under specified provision, in Northwest Florida Water Management District. Amends 373.4145. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Natural Resources*

#### **SB 1502 by Senator Casas**

**Candidates for Public Office;** eliminates requirement that a subordinate officer, deputy sheriff, or police officer who is seeking public office & who is not required to resign to run for that office must, upon qualifying, take a leave of absence without pay during period of that candidacy. Amends 99.012. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Ethics and Elections*

#### **SB 1550 by Senator Grant**

**Liquefied Petroleum Gas/Sale;** defines terms "category IV liquefied petroleum gas dispenser & recreational vehicle servicer" & "wholesaler"; includes category IV liquefied petroleum gas dispensers & recreational vehicle services within licensure & examination provisions re Sale of Liquefied Petroleum Gas law; provides penalty for operating without license; increases minimum requirements for insurance coverage, etc. Amends Ch. 527. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Agriculture and Consumer Services*

#### **CS/SB 1560 by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Horne**

**Bail Bond Premiums;** requires reporting of net amounts of certain bail bond premiums; provides minimum requirement for direct written premiums for bail bonds; provides application; provides reporting requirements for assumed premiums; requires recordkeeping; requires disclosure of certain information in annual statements. Creates 624.4094. Effective Date: 10/01/2000.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance*

#### **SB 1656 by the Committee on Ethics and Elections and others**

**Political Committees;** redefines term "political committee" for purposes of campaign finance laws. Amends 106.011. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

#### **CS/SB's 1834, 694 by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, Senators Latvala, Meek and others**

**Fair Accountability in Interest Rate;** (THIS BILL COMBINES S1834,694) creates "Fair Accountability in Interest Rates Act of 2000"; requires licensure by Banking & Finance Dept. to act as title loan lender; provides remedies for title loans made or serviced without licensure; provides for title loan agreement; provides for reclaiming repossessed motor vehicle under certain circumstances; provides for title loan interest rates, etc. Amends Ch. 538, 560.309. Effective Date: 10/01/2000 except as otherwise provided.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity*

#### **CS/SB 2050 by the Committee on Fiscal Policy, Senator King and others**

**Workforce Innovation Act of 2000;** revises provisions implementing federal Workforce Investment Act of 1998 to conform to changes made by act; revises investment act principles & funding requirements; redesignates Workforce Development Bd. as "Workforce Florida, Inc."; requires reports & measures of outcomes; requires Workforce Florida, Inc. to develop strategic plan for workforce development, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2000 except as otherwise provided.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

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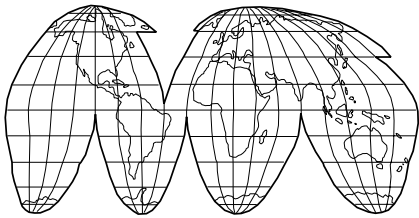
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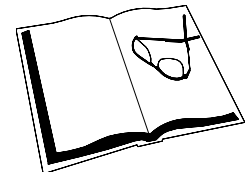
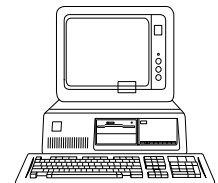
