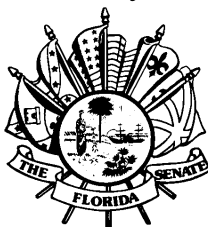

Certificate of Need/Heart Surgery; provides criteria for review of certificate-of-need application for establishment of adult open heart surgery program in county in which none of hospitals has existing or approved adult open heart surgery program. Amends 408.043. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care

CS/CS/SB 1016 by the Committees on Children and Families, Judiciary and Senator Rossin

Guardianship; raises amount of claim that may be settled by natural guardian of minor without necessity of appointment of legal guardian; raises amount of claim that may be settled by natural guardian of minor without necessity of appointment of guardian ad litem. Amends 744.387,.301. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

SB 1020 by Senator Rossin

Non-Ad Valorem Assessments; amends provision re uniform method for levy, collection, & enforcement of non-ad valorem assessments; defines term "levied for the first time"; specifies circumstances in which local government must adopt non-ad valorem assessment roll at public hearing; prescribes requirements re notice that must be given before such hearing is held. Amends 197.3632. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

CS/SB 1210 by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Latvala

Health Insurance; requires certain group certificates for health insurance coverage to be subject to requirements for individual health insurance policies; exempts group health insurance policies insuring groups of certain size from rate filing requirements; revises rating factors that may be used by small employer carriers; requires that insurers offer Medicare supplement policies to certain individuals, etc. Amends Ch. 627, 641.31. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and withdrawn from the Committees on Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government and Appropriations

SB 1424 by Senator Posey

Real Estate Professionals; provides exception to provisions governing return of escrowed personal property; requires supervisors of registered assistant real estate appraisers to sign appraisals & make certain disclosures; requires registered assistant real estate appraisers to be supervised by licensed or certified appraisers; prohibits direct payments for services to registered assistant real estate appraisers with supervising appraiser's agreement, etc. Amends Ch. 475. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries

SB 1450 by Senator Villalobos

Criminal Mischief; requires person or minor who commits said mischief to pay additional fines & perform community service; provides for parent or legal guardian of minor to be liable for payment of fine; authorizes court to decline to order payment of fine if court finds that person subject to payment of fine is indigent; deletes requirement that court impose penalty prescribed by municipal or county ordinance under certain circumstances, etc. Amends 806.13. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice

SB 1840 by Senator Clary

David Levitt School Anti-Hunger Act; creates "David Levitt School Food Anti-Hunger Act of 2001"; requires school districts to donate unused food to programs that assist hungry families under certain circumstances; provides exceptions; authorizes Education Dept. to adopt rules. Amends 228.195. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education and withdrawn from the Committees on Appropriations Subcommittee on Education and Appropriations

CS/SB 2098 by the Committee on Ethics and Elections, Senator Jones and others

Elections/Voter's Bill Of Rights; provides for Voter's Bill of Rights & Responsibilities; provides responsibilities of supervisors of elections. Amends 101.031. Effective Date: 10/01/2001.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Ethics and Elections

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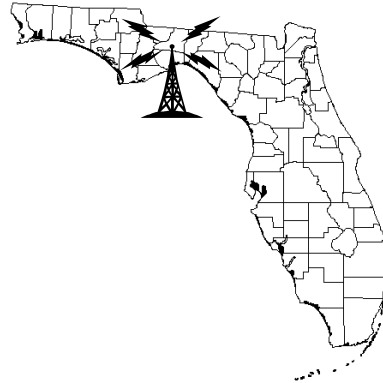
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
