#### SB 276 by Senator Lee

Florida Statutes; deletes provisions which have expired, have become obsolete, have had their effect, have served their purpose, or have been impliedly repealed or superseded; corrects grammatical, typographical, & like errors; removes inconsistencies, redundancies, & unnecessary repetition in statutes; confirms restoration of provisions unintentionally omitted from republication in acts of Legislature during amendatory process, etc. Amends/Repeals/Reenacts FS. Effective Date: 60 days after sine die.

#### SB 278 by Senator Lee

Florida Statutes; deletes provisions which have expired, have become obsolete, have had their effect, have served their purpose, or have been impliedly repealed or superseded; replaces incorrect cross-references & citations; corrects grammatical, typographical & like errors; removes inconsistencies, redundancies, & unnecessary repetition in statutes; improves clarity of statutes & facilitates their correct interpretation, etc. Amends FS. #### SB 288 by Senator Lee

Florida Statutes; repeals provisions all of which have become inoperative by noncurrent repeal or expiration & , pursuant to specified provisions, may be omitted from Fla. Statutes 2001 only through reviser's bill duly enacted by Legislature; repeals provisions to conform to repeal of specified provisions. Repeals FS. Effective Date: 60 days after sine die.

Read the second time and amended on March 7, 2001

#### SB 290 by Senator Lee

Florida Statutes; amends provisions to conform to directive in specified provision to remove gender-specific references applicable to human beings from Florida Statutes without substantive change in legal effect. Amends 11.90, 228.082, 445.004, 570.61, 893.138. Effective Date: 60 days after sine die.

Read the second time on March 7, 2001

# SENATE BILLS ON SECOND READING

#### CS/SB 94 by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Laurent

Consumer Collection Practices; prohibits certain communications with debtor who is represented by attorney; prohibits causing of charges to be made to debtor; revises civil remedies for engaging in prohibited collection practices; provides for damages in class actions; prescribes circumstances under which liability does not attach; provides limitation on bringing action for remedy for unlawful collection practices; provides applicability. Amends 559.72,.77. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and the Committee on Commerce and Economic Opportunities, reports the Committee substitute favorably

#### SB 98 by Senator Campbell

**Parental Rights**; provides that specified rights apply to both parents. Amends 61.13. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

Reported favorably, with two amendments, by the Committee on Judiciary

#### SB 130 by Senator Silver

Eminent Domain/Public School Purpose; authorizes municipalities to exercise power of eminent domain for public school purposes; provides for future repeal. Amends 166.411; repeals 166.411(11). Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, and Education

#### SB 136 by Senator Campbell

Rules of Evidence/Sexual Battery; provides for certain rules of evidence applicable to criminal prosecution of crime of sexual battery to apply in any civil action brought under Florida Civil Rights Act involving perpetration or alleged perpetration of such crime. Amends 794.022. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary

#### CS/CS/SB 138 by the Committees on Children and Families, Judiciary, Senator Campbell and others

**Adoption**; amends specified provisions re petition & grounds for terminating parental rights & powers of disposition; removes authority of licensed child-placing agencies to file actions to terminate parental rights; allows biological relatives to have communication or contact with adopted child under certain circumstances; restricts certain criminal offenders from having minors placed in their homes for adoption, etc. Amends Chs. 39, 63, 984.03, 985.03. Effective Date: 10/01/2001.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children and Families

#### SB 218 by Senator Horne

Mortgage Guaranty Insurance; revises minimum surplus requirements for mortgage guaranty insurers; revises limits on total liability & exposure to losses for such insurers; requires mortgage guaranty insurers to include certain information in audited financial reports required pursuant to certain provision; authorizes Insurance Dept. to take certain actions against mortgage guaranty insurer that is not in compliance. Amends 624.408, 635.042. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance

#### SB 272 by Senator Klein

Law Enforcement Officers; provides exemption from civil or criminal liability for sale of imitation controlled substances by law enforcement officers & other persons acting at their direction. Amends 817.564. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice

#### SB 274 by Senator Lee

Official Florida Statutes Adoption; adopts Florida Statutes 2001 & designates portions thereof that are to constitute official law of state; provides that Florida Statutes 2001 shall be effective immediately upon publication; provides that general laws enacted during 1999 regular session & prior thereto & not included in Florida Statutes 2001 are repealed, etc. Amends 11.2421,.2422,.2424,.2425. Effective Date: 60 days after sine die.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Rules and Calendar

#### SB 304 by Senator Pruitt

**Deferred Compensation Programs**; redefines term "employee," for purposes of participation in such programs, to include employees of constitutional county officers; prescribes duties of said officers re their employees; provides for negotiation of joint deferred compensation program for certain local employees currently eligible for participation in such programs & employees of constitutional county officers. Amends 112.215. Effective Date: 10/01/2001.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, and reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs

#### SB 410 by Senator Dawson and others

**Schools/Emergency Preparedness**; requires DOE to adopt rules for emergency drills which must be followed by each district school board. Amends 230.23. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education

#### SB 412 by Senator Bronson and others

Civil Actions/Firearms & Ammunition; provides legislative findings re lawful manufacture, distribution, & sale of firearms & ammunition; prohibits civil actions on behalf of state or other political subdivision against manufacturers, distributiors, & dealers of firearms or ammunition & firearms trade associations; provides for actions by state or other political subdivision for breach of contract or warranty, etc. Creates 790.331. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Criminal Justice and Judiciary

#### CS/SB 424 by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Jones

Retired Judges or Justices; redefines term "retired justice" or "retired judge" re certain justices or judges assigned to temporary duty. Amends 25.073. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary

#### SB 426 by the Committee on Education

Univ. Health Services Support Org.; provides that university health services support organizations may enter into specified arrangements with other entities for benefit of university academic health sciences centers; provides for future review & repeal of provision re establishment of university health services support organizations. Amends 240.2995. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education

#### SB 520 by Senator Miller

**Reading/Kindergarten-Grade 4**; provides legislative intent re required reading instruction; requires each public elementary school to develop & implement programs for reading & literacy development in kindergarten through grade 4; requires DOE to provide technical support. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education

#### SB 536 by Senator Bronson

Demineralization Concentrate; reorganizes & clarifies specified section; directs DEP to enter into rulemaking; creates technical advisory committee to assist in rule development; provides permitting requirements re failure of toxicity tests due to naturally occurring constituents; provides exemption allowing demineralization concentrate mixing zones in Outstanding Florida Waters with specific requirements. Amends 403.0882. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Natural Resources

#### SB 648 by Senator Garcia

Alcoholic Bev./Students/Curriculum; provides exemption for giving or serving to certain underage students alcoholic beverages that are delivered as part of required curriculum at accredited institution; provides exemption for possession of alcoholic beverages by underage students in specified circumstances. Amends 562.11,.111. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries

#### CS/SB 780 by the Committee on Education and Senator Dawson

Parental Consent/Medical Treatment; provides that student is exempt from certain services under school health services program if his or her parent or guardian requests such exemption in writing; limits transportation of student to medical treatment facility without parental consent. Amends 232.465, 234.02. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education

## CS/SB 788 by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Silver

**Unfair Discrimination/Insurance**; prohibits certain insurers from specified discriminatory acts based upon applicant or insureds having been or likelihood to become victim of specified abuse; provides exceptions. Amends 626.9541. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance

## CS/SB 806 by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Laurent

**Insurance Examination/Exemptions**; exempts applicant for license as customer representative from examination requirements under certain conditions; exempts applicant for license as adjuster from examination requirements under certain conditions. Amends 626.221. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance

## CS/SB 838 by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Saunders

Landlord & Tenant; increases time period within which landlord must return security deposit; exempts certain landlords from requirement to give notice to former tenants re personal property; provides exemption from real estate brokers & salespersons regulatory law; increases value of abandoned personal property that may be kept, sold, or destroyed by landlord; conforms notice provisions. Amends 83.49,.67, 475.011, 715.105,.106,.109. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary

#### SB 946 by Senator Diaz de la Portilla

**Key Largo Hammocks Botanical Site**; changes name of Key Largo Hammocks State Botanical Site to "Dagney Johnson Key Largo Hammocks Botanical State Park". Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Natural Resources
