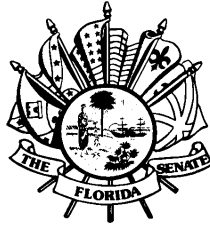

## BILLS ON CALENDAR

### BILLS ON THIRD READING

#### **CS/SB 1018 by the Committee on Education and Senator Pruitt**

**Young Children/Learning Gateway;** authorizes 3-year demonstration program to be called Learning Gateway re prevention & amelioration of learning problems & learning disabilities in young children; authorizes demonstration projects in three counties; authorizes designated agencies to share confidential information with Learning Gateway programs; provides access to student records by said programs & Learning Gateway steering committee, etc. Amends 228.093. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

#### **CS/CS/SB 912 by the Committees on Appropriations, Criminal Justice and Senator Villalobos**

**Criminal Rehabilitation;** redesignates area of program services within DOC as program, transition, & postrelease services; creates Addiction-Recovery Supervision Program Act; requires dept. to contract with faith-based groups & private organizations to operate substance-abuse-transition housing programs; provides for inmates released from private correctional facilities to be eligible for same transition-assistance services that are provided, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

#### **CS/SB 94 by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Laurent**

**Consumer Collection Practices;** prohibits certain communications with debtor who is represented by attorney; prohibits causing of charges to be made to debtor; revises civil remedies for engaging in prohibited collection practices; provides for damages in class actions; prescribes circumstances under which liability does not attach; provides for application of federal precedent re corresponding federal laws; provides applicability, etc. Amends 559.72,.77. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

#### **SB 304 by Senator Pruitt**

**Deferred Compensation Programs;** redefines term "employee," for purposes of participation in such programs, to include employees of constitutional county officers; provides for negotiation of joint deferred compensation program for certain local employees currently eligible for participation in such programs & employees of constitutional county officers; provides for funding costs of deferred compensation plan, etc. Amends 112.215. Effective Date: 10/01/2001.

#### **SB 410 by Senator Dawson and others**

**Schools/Emergency Preparedness;** requires DOE to adopt rules for emergency drills which must be followed by each district school board. Amends 230.23. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

#### **CS/CS/SB 126 by the Committees on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, Natural Resources and Senator Brown-Waite**

**Xeriscape/Irrigation Wells;** redefines term "Xeriscape"; prohibits certain restrictions on practice of Xeriscape or construction of irrigation wells; provides for operation & maintenance of rain sensor devices; prohibits homeowners' associations from restricting practice of Xeriscape or construction of irrigation wells. Amends 125.568, 166.048, 255.259, 335.167, 373.185,.62, 720.3075. Effective Date: 10/01/2001.

#### **SB 708 by Senator Sullivan**

**Educ. Employees/Unused Sick Leave;** limits amount of pay certain employees of district school systems may receive for unused sick leave & unused vacation leave upon termination of employment; provides conditions on use of sick leave; limits amount of pay certain employees of community college districts may receive for unused sick leave upon termination of employment; provides conditions on use of sick leave, etc. Amends 231.40,.481, 240.343. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

## SB 536 by Senator Bronson

**Demineralization Concentrate;** reorganizes & clarifies specified section; directs DEP to enter into rulemaking; creates technical advisory committee to assist in rule development; provides permitting requirements re failure of toxicity tests due to naturally occurring constituents; provides exemption allowing demineralization concentrate mixing zones in Outstanding Florida Waters with specific requirements. Amends 403.0882. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

## SB 1058 by the Committee on Ethics and Elections and others

**Vacancies in Office;** defines term "qualify for office" for purposes of determining whether vacancy has occurred; describes ad interim term of office; requires certain persons appointed to office to be United States citizens & residents of state; requires all officials making appointments that are subject to Senate confirmation to follow certain procedures; provides for filling certain vacancies on Public Service Commission. Amends 114.01,.04,.05, 350.031. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

## SB 272 by Senator Klein

**Law Enforcement Officers;** provides exemption from civil or criminal liability for sale of imitation controlled substances by law enforcement officers & other persons acting at their direction. Amends 817.564. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

### SB 136 by Senator Campbell

**Rules of Evidence/Sexual Battery;** provides for certain rules of evidence applicable to criminal prosecution of crime of sexual battery to apply in any civil action brought under Florida Civil Rights Act involving perpetration or alleged perpetration of such crime. Amends 794.022. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

**Controlled Substances/Hydrocodone;** adds materials, compounds, mixtures, or preparations containing hydrocodone to substances listed under Schedule III as controlled substances; provides penalties for trafficking in certain mixtures containing hydrocodone; reenacts provisions re offense severity ranking chart in Criminal Punishment Code, to incorporate amendment in specified provision, in references thereto, etc. Amends 893.02,.03,.135, 948.01; reenacts 921.0022 (3)(b),(c),(e). Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and withdrawn from the Committees on Appropriations Subcommittee on Public Safety and Judiciary, and Appropriations*

**CS/SB 238 by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Mitchell and others**

**Death Penalty/Mental Retardation;** defines term "mental retardation"; prohibits imposition of sentence of death if court determines that defendant suffers from mental retardation; requires that defendant notify court of intention to raise mental retardation as bar to sentence of death; provides requirements for court in determining whether defendant suffers from mental retardation; authorizes state to appeal determination of mental retardation, etc. Creates 921.137. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and withdrawn from the Committees on Appropriations Subcommittee on Public Safety and Judiciary, and Appropriations*

**CS/SB 252 by the Committee on Commerce and Economic Opportunities and Senator King**

**Law Officer/Background Investigation;** provides specified requirements of employers re background investigation of applicant for employment or appointment as full-time, part-time, or auxiliary law enforcement officer, correctional officer, or correctional probation officer; provides requirements re authorization to release info.; defines terms "employing agency" & "employment information"; provides qualified immunity from civil liability for release, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

**SB 274 by Senator Lee**

Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

**CS/SB 424 by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Jones**

**SB 426 by the Committee on Education**

**Univ. Health Services Support Org.;** provides that university health services support organizations may enter into specified arrangements with other entities for benefit of university academic health sciences centers; provides for future review & repeal of provision re establishment of university health services support organizations. Amends 240.2995. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

**SB 520 by Senator Miller**

**Reading/Kindergarten-Grade 4;** provides legislative intent re required reading instruction; requires each public elementary school to develop & implement programs for reading & literacy development in kindergarten through grade 4; requires DOE to provide technical support. **SB 648 by Senator Garcia**

**Alcoholic Bev./Students/Curriculum;** provides exemption for giving or serving to certain underage students alcoholic beverages that are delivered as part of required curriculum at accredited institution; provides exemption for possession of alcoholic beverages by underage students in specified circumstances. Amends 562.11, .111. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

**SB 720 by Senator Carlton**

**Criminal Records/Obscene Materials;** prohibits court from expunging or sealing criminal history record of person who has been found guilty of or pled guilty or nolo contendere to distributing or showing obscene material to minor or who has been found guilty of or pled guilty or nolo contendere to certain activities involving computer pornography. Amends 943.0585, .059. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

**CS/SB 748 by the Committee on Ethics and Elections and Senator Clary**

**Elections Results;** prohibits release of election results until polls close in all parts of state. Amends 101.5614, .68, 102.071. Effective Date: 01/01/2002.

**CS/SB 780 by the Committee on Education and Senator Dawson**

**Parental Consent/Medical Treatment;** provides that student is exempt from certain services under school health services program if his or her parent or guardian requests such exemption in writing; limits transportation of student to medical treatment facility without parental consent. Amends 232.465, 234.02. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education*



**CS/SB 788 by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Silver**

**Unfair Discrimination/Insurance;** prohibits certain insurers from specified discriminatory acts based upon applicant or insureds having been or likelihood to become victim of specified abuse; provides exceptions. Amends 626.9541. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

**SB 810 by Senator Laurent**

**Municipal Law Enforcement Officers;** provides authority to municipal law enforcement officers to patrol property & facilities leased by municipality but located outside its territorial jurisdiction. Amends 901.252. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Reported favorably by the Committees on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, and Criminal Justice*

**CS/SB 838 by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Saunders**

**Landlord & Tenant;** increases time period within which landlord must return security deposit; exempts certain landlords from requirement to give notice to former tenants re personal property; provides exemption from real estate brokers & salespersons regulatory law; increases value of abandoned personal property that may be kept, sold, or destroyed by landlord; conforms notice provisions. Amends 83.49,.67, 475.011, 715.105,.106,.109. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary*

**SB 854 by Senator Pruitt and others**

**Aquifer Storage & Recovery Wells;** provides for classifications & permitting of such wells; provides zone of discharge for such wells meeting specific criteria; provides monitoring requirements for such wells; requires aquifer exemption for aquifer storage & recovery well that does not meet primary drinking water standards other than those re total coliform bacteria or sodium; provides requirements for certain domestic wells, etc. Creates 403.065, 373.222. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Natural Resources and withdrawn from the Committees on Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government and Appropriations*

**CS/SB 888 by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Campbell**

**Probation or Community Control;** provides for tolling period of probation or community control for offender following filing of affidavit alleging violation of probation or community control & issuance of warrant; provides for previously imposed period of probation or community control to be reinstated following dismissal of affidavit. Amends 948.06. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice*

**CS/SB 938 by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Peaden**

**Credit Insurance;** authorizes issuance of credit life insurance licenses to lending or financial institutions & authorizes such licensees to sell credit insurance; deletes certain license requirements for institutions with multiple offices; requires certain disclosures to credit life insurance purchasers re cancellation of such coverage, etc. Amends 626.321, 627.679. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance*

**SB 946 by Senator Diaz de la Portilla**

**Key Largo Hammocks Botanical Site;** changes name of Key Largo Hammocks State Botanical Site to "Dagney Johnson Key Largo Hammocks Botanical State Park". Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Natural Resources*

**CS/SB 1030 by the Committee on Natural Resources and Senator Bronson**

**Water Resources;** requires DEP to adopt primary & secondary drinking water regulations for nontransient noncommunity water systems & transient noncommunity water systems; authorizes dept. to make loans to nonprofit transient noncommunity water systems; authorizes dept. to issue permits for altering or extending public water system based on size of system under certain circumstances, etc. Amends Ch. 403. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Natural Resources*

**SB 1066 by Senator Peaden**

**Civil Actions/Admission of Liability;** provides definitions; provides for inadmissibility of certain statements, writings, or benevolent gestures as evidence of admission of liability in civil action; provides for admissibility of certain statements. Creates 90.4026. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

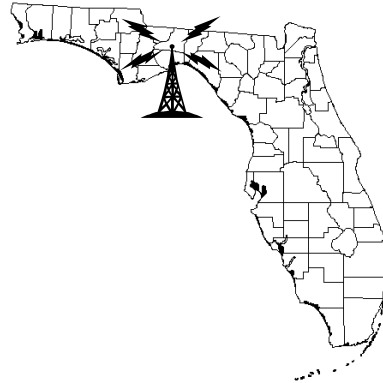
