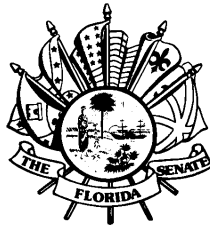

# BILLS ON THE CALENDAR

## BILLS ON THIRD READING

### SB 2000 by the Committee on Appropriations

**Appropriations**; provides moneys for annual period beginning July 1, 2001, & ending June 30, 2002, to pay salaries, & other expenses, capital outlay - buildings, & other improvements, & for other specified purposes of various agencies of State government. Effective Date: 07/01/2001 or upon becoming law, whichever occurs later.

*Read the second time and amended on March 29, 2001*

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### SB 2002 by the Committee on Appropriations

**Appropriations Implementing Bill**; provides legislative intent; provides for allocation of moneys provided for workforce development & provides for budget amendment when program is moved; provides formula for rural hospital disproportionate share payments; prescribes conditions upon which adjustment in hospital's inpatient per diem rate may be based; provides for restricted drug formulary applicable to Medicaid providers, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2001 or upon becoming law.

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### SB 946 by Senator Diaz de la Portilla

**Key Largo Hammock Botanical Site**; changes name of Key Largo Hammock State Botanical Site to "Dagney Johnson Key Largo Hammock Botanical State Park". Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

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### SB 98 by Senator Campbell

**Parental Rights**; provides that specified rights apply to both parents. Amends 61.13. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

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### CS/SB 252 by the Committee on Commerce and Economic Opportunities and Senator King

**Law Officer/Background Investigation**; provides specified requirements of employers re background investigation of applicant for employment or appointment as full-time, part-time, or auxiliary law enforcement officer, correctional officer, or correctional probation officer; provides requirements re authorization to release info.; defines terms "employing agency" & "employment information"; provides qualified immunity from civil liability for release, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

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## SB 288 by Senator Lee

**Florida Statutes;** repeals provisions all of which have become inoperative by noncurrent repeal or expiration & , pursuant to specified provisions, may be omitted from Fla. Statutes 2001 only through reviser's bill duly enacted by Legislature; repeals provisions to conform to repeal of specified provisions. Repeals FS. Effective Date: 60 days after sine die.

*Identical to **HB 669** in the Committee on Rules and Calendar*

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## SB 290 by Senator Lee

**Florida Statutes;** amends provisions to conform to directive in specified provision to remove gender-specific references applicable to human beings from Florida Statutes without substantive change in legal effect. Amends 11.90, 228.082, 445.004, 570.61, 893.138. Effective Date: 60 days after sine die.

*Read the second time on March 7, 2001*

*Identical to **HB 671** in the Committee on Rules and Calendar*

## SENATE BILLS ON SECOND READING

### SB 136 by Senator Campbell

**Rules of Evidence/Sexual Battery;** provides for certain rules of evidence applicable to criminal prosecution of crime of sexual battery to apply in any civil action brought under Florida Civil Rights Act involving perpetration or alleged perpetration of such crime. Amends 794.022. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary*

### SB 150 by Senator Horne

**Property Exempt from Legal Process;** exempts certain debtor's interests from attachment, garnishment, or legal process. Amends 222.25. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Reported favorably by the Committees on Judiciary and Finance and Taxation*

### CS/SB 178 by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Brown-Waite

**Duration of Real Property Liens;** revises period of duration of certain liens; provides for application to existing liens. Amends 55.10. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and the Committee on Finance and Taxation, reports the committee substitute favorably, with one amendment*

Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

### CS/SB 240 by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Smith

### SB 274 by Senator Lee

**Official Florida Statutes Adoption;** adopts Florida Statutes 2001 & designates portions thereof that are to constitute official law of state; provides that Florida Statutes 2001 shall be effective immediately upon publication; provides that general laws enacted during 1999 regular session & prior thereto & not included in Florida Statutes 2001 are repealed, etc. Amends 11.2421, .2422, .2424, .2425. Effective Date: 60 days after sine die.

### SB 308 by Senator Saunders

**Political Committee;** modifies definition of "political committee". Amends 106.011. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

**Civil Actions/Firearms & Ammunition;** provides legislative findings re lawful manufacture, distribution, & sale of firearms & ammunition; prohibits civil actions on behalf of state or other political subdivision against manufacturers, distributors, & dealers of firearms or ammunition & firearms trade associations; provides for actions by state or other political subdivision for breach of contract or warranty, etc. Creates 790.331. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

**CS/SB 424 by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Jones**

**Retired Judges or Justices;** redefines term "retired justice" or "retired judge" re certain justices or judges assigned to temporary duty. Amends 25.073. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

**SB 426 by the Committee on Education**

**Univ. Health Services Support Org.;** provides that university health services support organizations may enter into specified arrangements with other entities for benefit of university academic health sciences centers; provides for future review & repeal of provision re establishment of university health services support organizations. Amends 240.2995. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

**SB 520 by Senator Miller**

**Reading/Kindergarten-Grade 4;** provides legislative intent re required reading instruction; requires each public elementary school to develop & implement programs for reading & literacy development in kindergarten through grade 4; requires DOE to provide technical support. **SB 648 by Senator Garcia**

**Alcoholic Bev./Students/Curriculum;** provides exemption for giving or serving to certain underage students alcoholic beverages that are delivered as part of required curriculum at accredited institution; provides exemption for possession of alcoholic beverages by underage students in specified circumstances. Amends 562.11, .111. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

**Prison Releasee Reoffender;** redefines term "prison releasee reoffender" to include defendant who commits certain felonies within specified period after being released from correctional institution outside state or while escaped from correctional institution outside state; provides requirements for sentencing defendant if state attorney proves by preponderance of evidence that defendant is prison releasee reoffender. Amends 775.082. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

**CS/SB 684 by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care, Senator Cowin and others**

**CS/SB 748 by the Committee on Ethics and Elections and Senator Clary**

**Elections Results;** prohibits release of election results until polls close in all parts of state. Amends 101.5614, .68, 102.071. Effective Date: 01/01/2002.

**CS/SB 778 by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Rossin**

**Lawyer Assistance Programs;** provides civil immunity for persons making good-faith reports of information to lawyer assistance program; provides for presumption of good faith; provides for immunity for certain persons; provides that certain information is subject to attorney-client privilege; provides for confidentiality of certain records, proceedings & communications. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

**CS/SB 788 by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Silver**

**Unfair Discrimination/Insurance;** prohibits certain insurers from specified discriminatory acts based upon applicant or insureds having been or likelihood to become victim of specified abuse; provides exceptions. Amends 626.9541. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance*

**CS/SB 836 by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, Senator Crist and others**

**Health Insurers & HMOs;** prohibits health insurers from requiring contracted health care providers to accept terms of other health care contracts as condition of continuation or renewal; applies such prohibition to group health insurance, blanket health insurance, & franchise health insurance; applies such prohibition to health maintenance organizations. Creates 627.6474; amends 627.662, 641.315. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

**SB 844 by Senator Campbell**

**Taxation;** provides for venue & jurisdiction of taxpayer actions in circuit court; redefines term "intangible personal property"; revises exemptions from intangible personal property tax; provides for methods of determining overpayments by persons paying tax on sales, use, & other transactions; revises process for review of taxpayer's liability for tax & interest; provides for tax classification of specified entities, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

*Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Finance and Taxation*

**SB 854 by Senator Pruitt and others**

**Aquifer Storage & Recovery Wells;** provides for classifications & permitting of such wells; provides zone of discharge for such wells meeting specific criteria; provides monitoring requirements for such wells; requires aquifer exemption for aquifer storage & recovery well that does not meet primary drinking water standards other than those re total coliform bacteria or sodium; provides requirements for certain domestic wells, etc. Creates 403.065, 373.222. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

**CS/SB 886 by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Klein**

**Durable Powers of Attorney;** provides for durable powers of attorney contingent upon specified condition; provides guidelines for such powers; provides statutory forms for affidavits to attest to specified condition; provides immunity from criminal & civil liability for physicians making determination of incapacity to manage property under certain conditions. Amends 709.08. Effective Date: 01/01/2002.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary*

**CS/SB 888 by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Campbell**

**Probation or Community Control;** provides for tolling period of probation or community control for offender following filing of affidavit alleging violation of probation or community control & issuance of warrant; provides for previously imposed period of probation or community control to be reinstated following dismissal of affidavit. Amends 948.06. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice*

**SB 968 by Senator Clary**

**Certificate of Need/Heart Surgery;** provides criteria for review of certificate-of-need application for establishment of adult open heart surgery program in county in which none of hospitals has existing or approved adult open heart surgery program. Amends 408.043. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care*

**SB 1020 by Senator Rossin**

**Non-Ad Valorem Assessments;** amends provision re uniform method for levy, collection, & enforcement of non-ad valorem assessments; defines term "levied for the first time"; specifies circumstances in which local government must adopt non-ad valorem assessment roll at public hearing; prescribes requirements re notice that must be given before such hearing is held. Amends 197.3632. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

*Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, and reported favorably by the Committee on Finance and Taxation*

**CS/SB 1030 by the Committee on Natural Resources and Senator Bronson**

**Water Resources;** requires DEP to adopt primary & secondary drinking water regulations for nontransient noncommunity water systems & transient noncommunity water systems; authorizes dept. to make loans to nonprofit transient noncommunity water systems; authorizes dept. to issue permits for altering or extending public water system based on size of system under certain circumstances, etc. Amends Ch. 403. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Natural Resources*

**CS/SB 1052 by the Committee on Agriculture and Consumer Services and Senator Silver**

**Pest-Control Regulation;** provides for physician licensed under Osteopathic Medicine law to provide certification for purposes of placing person on registry for prior notification of application of pesticide or class of pesticides; provides additional exceptions to state's preemption of pest-control regulation. Amends 482.2267, .242. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Agriculture and Consumer Services, and the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, reports the committee substitute favorably, with one amendment*

**SB 1066 by Senator Peaden**

**Civil Actions/Admission of Liability;** provides definitions; provides for inadmissibility of certain statements, writings, or benevolent gestures as evidence of admission of liability in civil action; provides for admissibility of certain statements. Creates 90.4026. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Judiciary*

**SB 1094 by Senator Campbell**

**Insurance/Pollution-Exclusion;** provides that certain pollution-exclusion provisions may exclude only certain incidents & hazards. Effective Date: 08/01/2001.

*Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Banking and Insurance*

**CS/SB 1096 by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care and Senator Campbell**

**Ernest Belles Act;** provides short title; defines term "pharmaceutical adverse incident" & requires that such incidents be reported to Health Dept.; requires dept. to review reported incidents to determine if incidents potentially involve conduct by health care practitioner that is subject to disciplinary action; specifies that any disciplinary action shall be taken by appropriate board; provides for adoption of rules & forms. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care*



**CS/SB 1274 by the Committee on Judiciary, Senator Burt and others**

**Learner's Driver's License;** provides that foster parent or group-home representative who signs application for said license for minor in foster care is not, by reason of having signed application, assuming any obligation or liability for any damages caused by minor; prohibits insurers that issue policies for private passenger automobiles from charging additional premium for minor who operates his or her parent's vehicle during certain time, etc. Amends Chs. 322, 627. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and the Committee on Banking and Insurance, reports the committee substitute favorably*

**SB 1372 by Senator Cowin**

**Person with Developmental Disability;** reenacts specified provision to ratify prior changes that removed licensure requirement for comprehensive transitional educational programs. Reenacts 400.962. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Children and Families*

**CS/SB 1398 by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Carlton**

**Unclaimed Property;** revises certain provisions to refer to property considered abandoned as unclaimed property; provides additional criterion for certain property in financial organizations being presumed unclaimed; provides presumption that certain intangible property is unclaimed under certain circumstances; provides valuation & remission of contents of safe-deposit boxes, etc. Amends Ch. 717, 732.107, 493.6101,.6102, 215.965. Effective Date: 10/01/2001.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and withdrawn from the Committee on Finance and Taxation*

**SB 1412 by Senator Posey**

**Child Restraint Devices;** revises requirements re use of child restraint devices. Amends 316.613. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

**SB 1516 by Senator Constantine**

**Surety Bonds;** prohibits public entities from directing that contractors building public facilities obtain surety bonds from specific agent or bonding company. Amends 235.32, 255.05. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

**CS/SB 1524 by the Committee on Natural Resources and Senator Constantine**

**Comprehensive Everglades Restoration;** creates Comprehensive Everglades Restoration Plan Regulation Act; provides expedited permitting program for project components as part of comprehensive plan; provides that state funds for land purchases are authorized if contained within Fla. Forever Water Management District Work Plan; revises due date for annual comprehensive plan report, etc. Creates 373.1502; amends 373.026,.470, 403.088. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

**SB 1564 by Senator Carlton**

**Corp. Income Tax/Internal Revenue;** provides for adoption of 2001 version of Internal Revenue Code; provides for retroactivity. Amends 220.03. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

**SB 1786 by Senator Dawson**

**Life Insurance;** requires life insurers having certain types of policies in force to annually notify policyholders of certain information concerning their policies; limits exception from specified notice requirements re lapse of life insurance coverage for nonpayment of premium; requires benefit enhancement of certain types of policies if premium payment reaches certain levels, etc. Creates 627.4553,.4587,.5015; amends 627.4555. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

**CS/SB 1788 by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care, Senator Wasserman Schultz and others**

**Continuing Dental Education;** provides alternative by which licensees may comply with general requirement that they take domestic-violence education courses; provides alternative by which licensees may comply with general requirement that they take AIDS/HIV education courses. Amends 456.031,.033. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

**SB 1942 by Senator Diaz de la Portilla**

**Employment Screening/Medical Clinics;** requires administrators of medical clinics to successfully complete level 1 background screening; provides for payment of screening costs. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

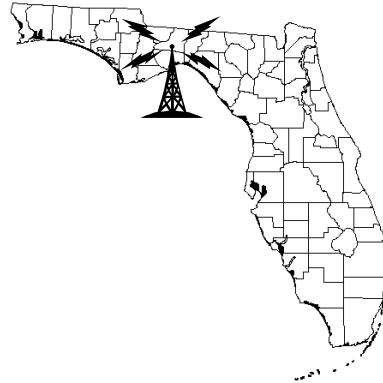
