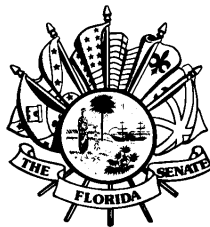

SB 196 (SO) by Senator Villalobos—

HSMV/Exclusionary Rule; provides legislative findings re Driver Licenses Div. & Motor Vehicles Div. of HSMV; provides legislative findings re records maintained by divisions; provides legislative findings re missions of divisions & department & re application of exclusionary rule; provides that creation & maintenance of records of HSMV & Driver Licenses Div. pursuant to specified provision are not law enforcement functions, etc. Creates 90.959; amends 322.20, 320.05. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Criminal Justice and reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary

CS/SB 188 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Smith and others—

Officer Scott Baird Act; provides that person who causes death, through culpable negligence, of law enforcement officer, firefighter, emergency medical technician, or paramedic while law enforcement officer, firefighter, emergency medical technician, or paramedic is performing duties of employment commits offense of aggravated manslaughter; provides enhanced penalty. Amends 782.07. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and withdrawn from the Committees on Appropriations Subcommittee on Public Safety and Judiciary, and Appropriations

CS/SB 520 (SO) by the Committee on Transportation, Senator Brown-Waite and others—

Driver's Licenses/ID Cards; revises application requirements for issuance of ID card; revises application requirements for issuance of driver's license & duplicate driver's license; revises expiration period for said license issued to person who established his or her identity by using specified identification documents; requires person issued such license to renew it in person & submit certain identification documents, etc. Amends 322.051,.08,.17,.18,.19,.212. Effective Date: 10/01/2002.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and the Committee on Criminal Justice reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 522 (SO) by the Committees on Criminal Justice, Transportation and Senator Sebesta—

Highway Safety & Motor Vehicles; provides that certain vehicles of Health Dept. are authorized emergency vehicles; reenacts provision re penalties for violation of load limits on vehicles; authorizes HSMV to affix decal on rebuilt motor vehicles; provides penalty for removal of rebuilt decals; provides penalty for falsely reporting certain information to HSMV; revises provisions re denial, suspension, or revocation of motor vehicle dealer licenses, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice

CS/SB 560 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Futch—

Inmate Welfare Trust Fund; prohibits use of funds for certain purposes; authorizes use of funds for certain purposes. Amends 945.215. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice

SB 264 (SO) by Senator King—

Drug-free Workplaces; clarifies that drug testing must be conducted in conformity with that section in order for employer to qualify as having drug-free workplace program; requires certain contractors to implement drug-free workplace program under certain circumstances. Amends 440.102. Effective Date: 10/01/2002.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care, and Regulated Industries

CS/SB 132 (SO) by the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator Laurent—

Tobacco Products/Minors; prohibits sale, offer for sale, or display of tobacco products under specified circumstances; provides exceptions & penalty. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries

SB 292 (SO) by Senator Brown-Waite and others—

HS Diploma/Korean War Veterans; provides for award of standard high school diploma to certain Korean War Veterans. Amends 232.246. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education

SB 1028 (SO) by Senator Peaden—

Pharmaceutical Education Requirement; allows continuing professional pharmaceutical education requirements to be met at any time during biennium preceding application for license renewal by eliminating requirement that specified number of hours of biennial requirements be done each year. Amends 465.009. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care

CS/SB 256 (SO) by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care—

Subscriber Assistance Program; redesignates Statewide Provider & Subscriber Assistance Program as Subscriber Assistance Program; requires Subscriber Assistance Panel to hold record of grievance hearing open for specified period after hearing; requires AHCA to impose fine for each violation re production of records from health care provider or managed care entity; requires that AHCA develop training program for panel members, etc. Amends 408.7056, 641.3154, .511, .58. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care, and the Committee on Banking and Insurance, reports the committee substitute favorably and withdrawn from the Committees on Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services, and Appropriations

SB 332 (SO) by Senator King—

Athlete Agents; redefines term "athlete agent"; revises licensure requirements; provides for service of process on nonresident agents; revises contract requirements; provides for increased administrative fines; provides additional criminal penalties for certain acts; revises provisions re civil remedies available to colleges & universities for violations of athlete agent regulations; revises business record requirements, etc. Amends Ch. 468. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Regulated Industries and Judiciary and withdrawn from the Committees on Finance and Taxation, Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government, and Appropriations

CS/SB 460 (SO) by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs and Senator Carlton—

Special Assessments/RV Parks; provides method for levy of assessments by counties & municipalities on recreational vehicle parks. Creates 125.0168, 166.223. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, and the Committee on Finance and Taxation, reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 330 (SO) by the Committee on Commerce and Economic Opportunities and Senator King—

Credit Service Organizations; eliminates exception to prohibited charging or receiving of money or valuable consideration prior to complete performance of specified services by said organization; eliminates condition for establishment of trust account; requires said organizations to obtain surety bond in specified amount; authorizes Attorney General to enforce Credit Repair Organizations Act, etc. Amends 817.7005, .701, .702, .703. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Economic Opportunities

CS/SB 622 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Miller and others—

Public or Commercial Transportation; provides penalty for illegal use of any means of public or commercial transportation or conveyance to commit any felony or to facilitate commission of any felony. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice

SB 184 (SO) by Senator Geller—

High-occupancy Vehicle Lanes; allows certain energy-saving vehicles to travel in such lanes, regardless of occupancy. Amends 316.0741. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation and withdrawn from the Committees on Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government and Appropriations

SB 350 (SO) by Senator Futch—

Parking Permits/Disabled Persons; provides that certain advanced registered nurse practitioners & physician assistants may provide certification of disability required for issuance of such permits. Amends 320.0848. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Transportation and Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs

*Similar to **HB 561 (HC)** in Messages*

CS/SB 664 (SO) by the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator Carlton—

Real Estate Professionals; requires educational courses that are prerequisites to licensure as broker, broker-salesperson, or salesperson or maintenance or renewal of such licensure to be made available by means of distance learning; amends provision re real estate appraisers to require distance learning to be made available for continuing education courses, etc. Amends 475.17, .182, .451, .618; reenacts 475.05. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries and withdrawn from the Committees on Appropriations Subcommittee on Education and Appropriations

SB 954 (SO) by Senator Smith—

Local Govt. Employees & Contractors; authorizes county or municipality to require, by ordinance, screening of employee, appointee, or applicant for employment or appointment to position that is critical to security or public safety; authorizes screening of contractor, vendor, repair person, or delivery person who has access to public facilities that are critical to security or public safety; requires that fingerprints of applicants & employees be submitted to FDLE & FBI, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, and reported favorably, with two amendments, by the Committee on Criminal Justice

SB 1104 (SO) by Senator Sullivan—

Certified Audits; postpones repeal of provisions re certified audits project. Amends 213.053,.21,.285. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Finance and Taxation

SB 476 (SO) by the Committee on Transportation—

Public Records/Deepwater Ports; abrogates future legislative review & repeal of exemptions re deepwater ports scheduled under OGSR Act of 1995. Amends 315.18. Effective Date: 10/01/2002.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation

*Similar to **HB 275 (HC)** in the Committee on Transportation*

CS/SB 508 (SO) by the Committee on Natural Resources and Senator Brown-Waite—

Environment/Detrimental Material; provides exemption from permitting requirements for removal of organic detrital material from certain freshwater rivers or lakes; provides exemption from permitting requirements for specified types of floating vessel platforms or floating boat lifts; limits local government regulation of floating vessel platforms & floating boat lifts; provides requirements for report to Governor & Legislature, etc. Amends 403.813. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Natural Resources and the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 172 (SO) by Senator Smith—

Election Code/Violation; provides that any person who conspires with another person to violate said code or who knowingly gives aid to person who has violated code with intent to help such person avoid or escape detection, arrest, trial, or punishment shall be punished as if he or she had committed violation; exempts certain violations of Florida Election Code from provisions specifying ranking of offense under Criminal Punishment Code, etc. Amends 104.091, 777.04. Effective Date: 10/01/2002.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Ethics and Elections, and Criminal Justice

CS/SB 682 (SO) by the Committee on Children and Families and Senator Peaden—

Substance-abuse Services; redefines term "licensed service provider"; requires that licensure standards apply to certain housing locations; requires that owners, directors, & chief financial officers of substance-abuse service provider undergo background check pursuant to specific provisions; requires level-2 background screening for employees who work with children & with adults who are developmentally disabled, etc. Amends 397.311,.405,.407,.416,.451, 212.055, 440.102. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children and Families

SB 414 (SO) by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care—

Long-term Care Ombudsman Program; increases maximum membership of local long-term care ombudsman councils; requires State Long-Term Care Ombudsman Council to publish complaint information quarterly; specifies training requirements for employees of State Long-Term Care Ombudsman & its volunteers. Amends 400.0069,.0089,.0091. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care, and withdrawn from the Committees on Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services, and Appropriations

SB 346 (SO) by Senator Lawson—

Professions/Reinstatement of License; provides general authority for reinstatement of licenses that have become void; provides for reinstatement of certain public accountancy licenses & for reinstatement of certain contracting licenses that have become void. Amends 455.271, 473.313, 489.116. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries

SB 424 (SO) by Senator Jones—

Retired Judges/Temporary Duty; redefines term "retired justice" or "retired judge" re certain justices or judges assigned to temporary duty. Amends 25.073. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary

SB 528 (SO) by Senator Campbell—

Attorney's Fees; provides for serving of motions seeking sanctions allowed for unsupported claims or defenses or delay of litigation. Amends 57.105. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary

SB 1334 (SO) by Senator Lee—

Official Florida Statutes Adoption; adopts Florida Statutes 2002 & designates portions thereof that are to constitute official law of state; provides that Florida Statutes 2002 shall be effective immediately upon publication; provides that general laws enacted during 2001 regular session & prior thereto & not included in Florida Statutes 2002 are repealed, etc. Amends 11.2421,.2422,.2424,.2425. Effective Date: 60 days after sine die.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Rules and Calendar

SB 8 (CB) by Senator Campbell—

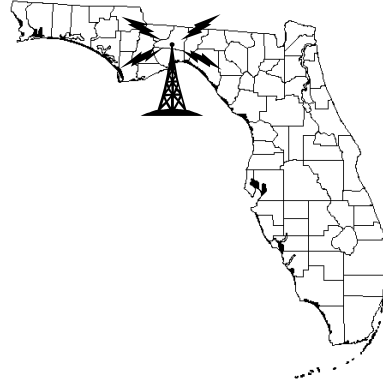
