Homeowners' Associations/U. S. Flag; provides that any homeowner may display United States flag; prohibits association documents from placing certain restrictions on display of United States flag; provides for retroactive application of act. Amends 720.304,.3075. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Amends 765.510,.512,.516,.517. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 341 (3R) by Representative Maygarden and others—

Univ. of West Fla. & FAU/Programs; authorizes bachelor of science in nursing degree program at University of West Florida; authorizes master's in social work degree program at Florida Atlantic University. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

SB 496 (3R) by Senator Mitchell-

Military/Dependent Education Benefit; provides educational opportunity at state expense for dependent children of military personnel who die or suffer specified disability in Operation Enduring Freedom; specifies documentation that constitutes proof of eligibility for such benefits. Creates 295.0185. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

CS/SB 176 (3R) by the Committee on Appropriations and Senator Silver—

Law Off./Firefighter/Children/Educ.; provides for graduate or postbaccalaureate educational expenses to be waived for children of officers or firefighters killed in line of duty; provides for waiver to apply to state resident who attends state institution as full-time or part-time student until specified age. Amends 112.19,.191. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

SB 1390 (3R) by Senator Pruitt-

Education/Statewide Assessment; expresses legislative intent to amend specified provision re John M. McKay Scholarships for Students with Disabilities; requires school district to notify parent of student who does not take said assessments; requires school district to notify parent when student is provided with instructional modifications that are not allowable in assessment program, etc. Amends 229.05371, 232.245, 229.57. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.
