SB 74 by Senator Campbell—

Relief/Steven Mitchell/Volusia Co.; provides for relief of Steven Mitchell; authorizes & directs Halifax Hospital Medical Center, special taxing district in Volusia Co. d/b/a Halifax Medical Center to compensate Mr. Mitchell for personal injuries that he suffered while at Halifax Medical Center. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

SB 106 by Senator Smith—

Criminal Punishment Code; authorizes state & defendant to waive preparation of worksheet & scoresheet under Criminal Punishment Code & requires court to proceed with sentencing; requires that scoresheet be filed within specified period after sentencing. Amends 921.0022. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice and withdrawn from the Committees on Appropriations Subcommittee on Public Safety and Judiciary, and Appropriations

CS/SB 132 by the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator Laurent—

Tobacco Products/Minors; prohibits sale, offer for sale, or display of tobacco products under specified circumstances; provides exceptions & penalty. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries

CS/SB 148 by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, Senator Geller and others—

Homeowners' Associations/U. S. Flag; provides that any homeowner may display United States flag; prohibits association documents from placing certain restrictions on display of United States flag; provides for retroactive application of act. Amends 720.304,.3075. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs

CS/CS/SB 150 by the Committees on Judiciary, Criminal Justice and Senator Cowin—

United States Flag/Display; provides that it is unlawful to prohibit display of flag of United States; provides exception; provides penalties. Creates 256.15. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary

CS/SB 168 by the Committee on Agriculture and Consumer Services and Senator Miller—

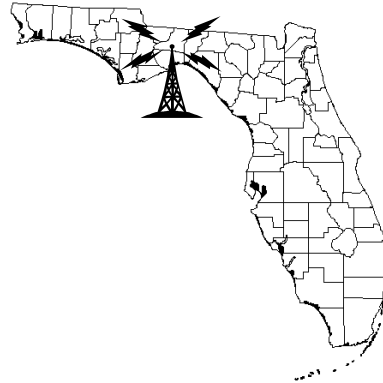
