Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Ethics and Elections, and withdrawn from the Committees on Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government and Appropriations

CS/SB 622 by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Miller and others—

Public or Commercial Transportation; provides penalty for illegal use of any means of public or commercial transportation or conveyance to commit any felony or to facilitate commission of any felony. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice

CS/SB 664 by the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator Carlton—

Real Estate Professionals; requires educational courses that are prerequisites to licensure as broker, broker-salesperson, or salesperson or maintenance or renewal of such licensure to be made available by means of distance learning; amends provision re real estate appraisers to require distance learning to be made available for continuing education courses, etc. Amends 475.17,.182,.451,.618; reenacts 475.05. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries and withdrawn from the Committees on Appropriations Subcommittee on Education and Appropriations

CS/SB 680 by the Committee on Natural Resources, Senator Mitchell and others—

Silver Springs & Rainbow Springs; permits fishing from shore of Rainbow River. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Natural Resources

CS/SB 682 by the Committee on Children and Families and Senator Peaden—

Substance-abuse Services; redefines term "licensed service provider"; requires that licensure standards apply to certain housing locations; requires that owners, directors, & chief financial officers of substance-abuse service provider undergo background check pursuant to specific provisions; requires level-2 background screening for employees who work with children & with adults who are developmentally disabled, etc. Amends 397.311,.405,.407,.416,.451, 212.055, 440.102. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children and Families

SB 932 by Senator Burt—

Vehicles/Intersections; clarifies provisions governing vehicles approaching or entering intersections. Amends 316.121. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation

SB 954 by Senator Smith—

Local Govt. Employees & Contractors; authorizes county or municipality to require, by ordinance, screening of employee, appointee, or applicant for employment or appointment to position that is critical to security or public safety; authorizes screening of contractor, vendor, repair person, or delivery person who has access to public facilities that are critical to security or public safety; requires that fingerprints of applicants & employees be submitted to FDLE & FBI, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, and reported favorably, with two amendments, by the Committee on Criminal Justice

SB 994 by Senator Sanderson—

Offenses Involving Vehicle ID Number; revises elements of offense of possessing, selling or offering for sale, concealing, or disposing of motor vehicle or mobile home, or major component part thereof, on which motor number or vehicle identification number has been destroyed, removed, covered, altered, or defaced; provides penalties. Amends 319.33. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice

SB 1020 by Senator Burt and others—

Payment-card Transactions; provides restrictions on information that may be printed on receipts for certain payment-card transactions; provides penalties. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Commerce and Economic Opportunities

SB 1028 by Senator Peaden—

Pharmaceutical Education Requirement; allows continuing professional pharmaceutical education requirements to be met at any time during biennium preceding application for license renewal by eliminating requirement that specified number of hours of biennial requirements be done each year. Amends 465.009. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care

SB 1104 by Senator Sullivan—

Certified Audits; postpones repeal of provisions re certified audits project. Amends 213.053,.21,.285. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Finance and Taxation

CS/SB 1126 by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, Senator Posey and others—

Insurance Policy Holder Protection; creates Insurance Policy Holder Protection Act; revises certain agent commission payment & policy servicing procedures & requirements; adds area eligible for coverage from Fla. Windstorm Underwriting Association; preserves policyholder's right to select & maintain certain agents; authorizes DOI to adopt rules to preserve such right; provides application. Amends 627.351,.3511; creates 627.3517. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance

SB 1162 by Senator Futch—

Investigative & Security Services; revises requirements for initial application for licensure to perform private investigative, private security, & repossession services; revises provisions re investigation of applicants by Dept. of State; provides that performance of certain services is not creditable toward experience requirements for specified classes of licensure to perform private investigative services; conforms provisions, etc. Amends Ch. 493; reenacts various FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries

SB 1334 by Senator Lee—

Official Florida Statutes Adoption; adopts Florida Statutes 2002 & designates portions thereof that are to constitute official law of state; provides that Florida Statutes 2002 shall be effective immediately upon publication; provides that general laws enacted during 2001 regular session & prior thereto & not included in Florida Statutes 2002 are repealed, etc. Amends 11.2421,.2422,.2424,.2425. Effective Date: 60 days after sine die.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Rules and Calendar

CS/SB 1380 by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care and Senator Meek—

Terrorism Response Training; authorizes substitution of specified number of hours of qualifying terrorism response training for like number of hours of training required for certification of emergency medical technicians, paramedics, firefighters, law enforcement officers, correctional officers, & correctional probation officers. Amends 401.2715, 633.35, 943.135. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care

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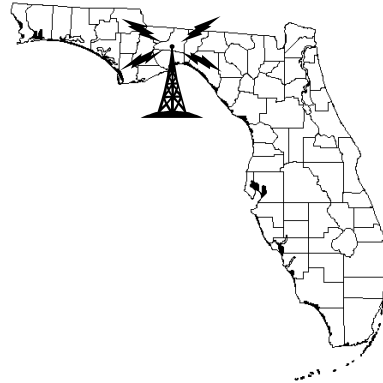
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
