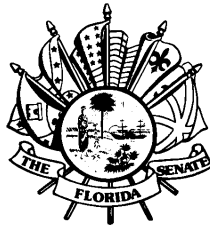

## BILLS ON CALENDAR

### SPECIAL ORDER CALENDAR AS DETERMINED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES AND CALENDAR FOR THURSDAY, JANUARY 31, 2002

#### CS/SJR 938 by the Committee on Finance and Taxation, Senator Pruitt and others—

**Sales & Use Tax;** constitutional amendment to reduce general state sales & use tax rate to 4.5 percent & require extraordinary vote of Legislature to exceed this rate, except re specified transactions; to provide that all sales of goods or services are subject to tax, except for specified goods & services & except for exemptions enacted by specified date, etc. Creates s. 19, Art. VII.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Finance and Taxation, and the Committee on Rules and Calendar, reports the committee substitute favorably*

#### CS/CS/SB 1106 by the Committees on Rules and Calendar, Finance and Taxation and Senator Pruitt—

**Taxation;** defines terms applicable to taxation of sales, use, & other transactions; prescribes rates of taxation for transient rentals; revises rates & exemptions applicable to taxation of lease or rental of or license in real property; revises provisions governing admissions tax; revises rates & exemptions applicable to tax on sales, storage, & use; revises provisions governing taxation of service warranties, etc. Amends Chs. 212, 376, 395. Effective Date: Contingent.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Finance and Taxation, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules and Calendar*

## SENATE BILLS ON SECOND READING

#### CS/SB 10 by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care and Senator Villalobos—

**Relief/Mark Schwartz;** provides for relief of Mark Schwartz, a minor, for injuries sustained as result of negligence of employees of Coral Springs Medical Center. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Recommended favorably, with one amendment, by The Special Master on Claim Bills and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care, and the Committee on Finance and Taxation, reports the committee substitute favorably*

#### SB 26 by Senator Latvala—

**Relief/Skowroneks/Clearwater;** provides for relief of Eva Skowronek as widow of Wieslaw Skowronek & for relief of Anna Marie, Victor, & Hubert Alexander Skowronek, children of Wieslaw Skowronek, for death of Wieslaw Skowronek as result of negligence of City of Clearwater. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Recommended favorably by The Special Master on Claim Bills and reported favorably by the Committee on Finance and Taxation*

**SB 30 by Senator Jones—**

**Relief/Hilda De Paz/Miami-Dade Co.;** provides for relief of Hilda De Paz; authorizes & directs Miami-Dade Co. to compensate Hilda De Paz for personal injuries she suffered due to negligence of county employees. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Recommended favorably by The Special Master on Claim Bills and reported favorably by the Committee on Finance and Taxation*

**SB 38 by Senator Rossin—**

**Relief/Rosemary Falkinburg;** provides for relief of Rosemary Falkinburg; authorizes & directs City of West Palm Beach to compensate Ms. Falkinburg for personal injuries she suffered due to negligence of city employee. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Recommended favorably by The Special Master on Claim Bills and reported favorably by the Committee on Finance and Taxation*

**SB 44 by Senator Pruitt—**

**Relief/James Torrence;** provides for relief of James Torrence; authorizes & directs Palm Beach Co. Health Care District to compensate him for personal injuries resulting from surgery negligently performed by health care district employee. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Recommended favorably by The Special Master on Claim Bills and reported favorably by the Committee on Finance and Taxation*

**SB 50 by Senator Campbell—**

**Relief/Lawrence Bigney;** provides for relief of Lawrence Douglas Bigney; authorizes & directs Sheriff's Office of Palm Beach Co. to compensate him for personal injuries suffered due to unlawful acts of employee of sheriff's office. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Recommended favorably by The Special Master on Claim Bills and reported favorably by the Committee on Finance and Taxation*

**SB 62 by Senator Meek—**

**Relief/Millie Jackson/Miami-Dade Co.;** provides for relief of Millie Jackson for injuries & damages sustained by her as result of negligent acts by employee of Miami-Dade County. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Recommended favorably by The Special Master on Claim Bills and reported favorably by the Committees on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, and Finance and Taxation*

**SB 72 by Senator Diaz de la Portilla—**

**Relief/Jacob P. Darna/Lee Co. School;** provides for relief of Jacob P. Darna, a minor, for injuries sustained as result of negligence of Lee County School Board. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Recommended unfavorably by The Special Master on Claim Bills and reported favorably by the Committees on Education and Finance and Taxation*

**SB 74 by Senator Campbell—**

**Relief/Steven Mitchell/Volusia Co.;** provides for relief of Steven Mitchell; authorizes & directs Halifax Hospital Medical Center, special taxing district in Volusia Co. d/b/a Halifax Medical Center to compensate Mr. Mitchell for personal injuries that he suffered while at Halifax Medical Center. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Recommended favorably by The Special Master on Claim Bills and reported favorably by the Committee on Finance and Taxation*

**CS/SB 148 by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, Senator Geller and others—**

**Homeowners' Associations/U. S. Flag;** provides that any homeowner may display United States flag; prohibits association documents from placing certain restrictions on display of United States flag; provides for retroactive application of act. Amends 720.304, .3075. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs*

**CS/CS/SB 150 by the Committees on Judiciary, Criminal Justice and Senator Cowin—**

**United States Flag/Display;** provides that it is unlawful to prohibit display of flag of United States; provides exception; provides penalties. Creates 256.15. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary*

**CS/SB 168 by the Committee on Agriculture and Consumer Services and Senator Miller—**

**Farm Labor Contractors;** prohibits charging of certain fees to farm laborers. Amends 450.34. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Agriculture and Consumer Services*

**SB 172 by Senator Smith—**

**Election Code/Violation;** provides that any person who conspires with another person to violate said code or who knowingly gives aid to person who has violated code with intent to help such person avoid or escape detection, arrest, trial, or punishment shall be punished as if he or she had committed violation; exempts certain violations of Florida Election Code from provisions specifying ranking of offense under Criminal Punishment Code, etc. Amends 104.091, 777.04. Effective Date: 10/01/2002.

*Reported favorably by the Committees on Ethics and Elections, and Criminal Justice*

**SB 196 by Senator Villalobos—**

**HSMV/Exclusionary Rule;** provides legislative findings re Driver Licenses Div. & Motor Vehicles Div. of HSMV; provides legislative findings re records maintained by divisions; provides legislative findings re missions of divisions & department & re application of exclusionary rule; provides that creation & maintenance of records of HSMV & Driver Licenses Div. pursuant to specified provision are not law enforcement functions, etc. Creates 90.959; amends 322.20, 320.05. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

*Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Criminal Justice and reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary*

**CS/SB 218 by the Committee on Commerce and Economic Opportunities and Senator Cowin—**

**Disabled People/Seizure Disorders;** extends to people who have seizure disorders right to be accompanied by trained service dog in specified circumstances; provides penalties for violations of this section; conforms provision re trainers of service dogs. Amends 413.08. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Economic Opportunities, and the Committee on Education reports the committee substitute favorably*

**SB 230 by Senator Saunders—**

**Political Committee/Redefined;** redefines term "political committee". Amends 106.011. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Ethics and Elections*

**CS/SB 244 by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Mitchell—**

**Schools/Reduced Speed Limits;** authorizes school boards to extend hours during which reduced speed limits are in effect at specified schools. Amends 316.1895. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and the Committee on Education reports the committee substitute favorably*

**SB 264 by Senator King—**

**Drug-free Workplaces;** clarifies that drug testing must be conducted in conformity with that section in order for employer to qualify as having drug-free workplace program; requires certain contractors to implement drug-free workplace program under certain circumstances. Amends 440.102. Effective Date: 10/01/2002.

*Reported favorably by the Committees on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care, and Regulated Industries*

**SB 266 by Senator Dyer—**

**Solid Waste Collection;** clarifies provisions re treatment of existing solid waste contracts in areas affected by merger or incorporation of municipalities; exempts solid-waste or recovered-materials collection vehicles from prohibition against leaving engine running when vehicle is unattended. Amends 165.061, 316.1975. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

*Reported favorably by the Committees on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, and Transportation*

**SB 292 by Senator Brown-Waite and others—**

**HS Diploma/Korean War Veterans;** provides for award of standard high school diploma to certain Korean War Veterans. Amends 232.246. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Education*

**CS/SB 330 by the Committee on Commerce and Economic Opportunities and Senator King—**

**Credit Service Organizations;** eliminates exception to prohibited charging or receiving of money or valuable consideration prior to complete performance of specified services by said organization; eliminates condition for establishment of trust account; requires said organizations to obtain surety bond in specified amount;

authorizes Attorney General to enforce Credit Repair Organizations Act, etc. Amends 817.7005, .701, .702, .703. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Economic Opportunities*

**SB 346 by Senator Lawson—**

**Professions/Reinstatement of License;** provides general authority for reinstatement of licenses that have become void; provides for reinstatement of certain public accountancy licenses & for reinstatement of certain contracting licenses that have become void. Amends 455.271, 473.313, 489.116. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries*

**SB 350 by Senator Futch—**

**Parking Permits/Disabled Persons;** provides that certain advanced registered nurse practitioners & physician assistants may provide certification of disability required for issuance of such permits. Amends 320.0848. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

*Reported favorably by the Committees on Transportation and Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs*

**CS/SB 366 by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Crist—**

**Traffic Control/Move Over Act;** creates said act; provides requirements re authorized emergency vehicles making use of visual signals when parked; provides penalty; provides for disposition of fines; authorizes wreckers to use amber rotating or flashing lights under certain circumstances. Amends 316.126, .2397. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation*

**SB 424 by Senator Jones—**

**Retired Judges/Temporary Duty;** redefines term "retired justice" or "retired judge" re certain justices or judges assigned to temporary duty. Amends 25.073. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary*

**SB 476 by the Committee on Transportation—**

**Public Records/Deepwater Ports;** abrogates future legislative review & repeal of exemptions re deepwater ports scheduled under OGSR Act of 1995. Amends 315.18. Effective Date: 10/01/2002.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation*

**CS/SB 508 by the Committee on Natural Resources and Senator Brown-Waite—**

**Environment/Detrital Material;** provides exemption from permitting requirements for removal of organic detrital material from certain freshwater rivers or lakes; provides exemption from permitting requirements for specified types of floating vessel platforms or floating boat lifts; limits local government regulation of floating vessel platforms & floating boat lifts; provides requirements for report to Governor & Legislature, etc. Amends 403.813. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Natural Resources and the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, reports the committee substitute favorably*

**CS/SB 520 by the Committee on Transportation, Senator Brown-Waite and others—**

**Driver's Licenses/ID Cards;** revises application requirements for issuance of ID card; revises application requirements for issuance of driver's license & duplicate driver's license; revises expiration period for said license issued to person who established his or her identity by using specified identification documents; requires person issued such license to renew it in person & submit certain identification documents, etc. Amends 322.051,.08,.17,.18,.19,.212. Effective Date: 10/01/2002.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and the Committee on Criminal Justice reports the committee substitute favorably*

**CS/CS/SB 522 by the Committees on Criminal Justice, Transportation and Senator Sebesta—**

**Highway Safety & Motor Vehicles;** provides that certain vehicles of Health Dept. are authorized emergency vehicles; reenacts provision re penalties for violation of load limits on vehicles; authorizes HSMV to affix decal on rebuilt motor vehicles; provides penalty for removal of rebuilt decals; provides penalty for falsely reporting certain information to HSMV; revises provisions re denial, suspension, or revocation of motor vehicle dealer licenses, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice*

**SB 528 by Senator Campbell—**

**Attorney's Fees;** provides for serving of motions seeking sanctions allowed for unsupported claims or defenses or delay of litigation. Amends 57.105. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary*

**CS/SB 560 by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Futch—**

**Inmate Welfare Trust Fund;** prohibits use of funds for certain purposes; authorizes use of funds for certain purposes. Amends 945.215. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice*

**CS/SB 622 by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Miller and others—**

**Public or Commercial Transportation;** provides penalty for illegal use of any means of public or commercial transportation or conveyance to commit any felony or to facilitate commission of any felony. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice*

**CS/SB 680 by the Committee on Natural Resources, Senator Mitchell and others—**

**Silver Springs & Rainbow Springs;** permits fishing from shore of Rainbow River. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Natural Resources*

**CS/SB 682 by the Committee on Children and Families and Senator Peaden—**

**Vehicles/Intersections;** clarifies provisions governing vehicles approaching or entering intersections. Amends 316.121. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

**Payment-card Transactions;** provides restrictions on information that may be printed on receipts for certain payment-card transactions; provides penalties. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

**SB 1028 by Senator Peaden—**

**Pharmaceutical Education Requirement;** allows continuing professional pharmaceutical education requirements to be met at any time during biennium preceding application for license renewal by eliminating requirement that specified number of hours of biennial requirements be done each year. Amends 465.009. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

**SB 1162 by Senator Futch—**

**Investigative & Security Services;** revises requirements for initial application for licensure to perform private investigative, private security, & repossession services; revises provisions re investigation of applicants by Dept. of State; provides that performance of certain services is not creditable toward experience requirements for specified classes of licensure to perform private investigative services; conforms provisions, etc. Amends Ch. 493; reenacts various FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

**Official Florida Statutes Adoption;** adopts Florida Statutes 2002 & designates portions thereof that are to constitute official law of state; provides that Florida Statutes 2002 shall be effective immediately upon publication; provides that general laws enacted during 2001 regular session & prior thereto & not included in Florida Statutes 2002 are repealed, etc. Amends 11.2421,.2422,.2424,.2425. Effective Date: 60 days after sine die.

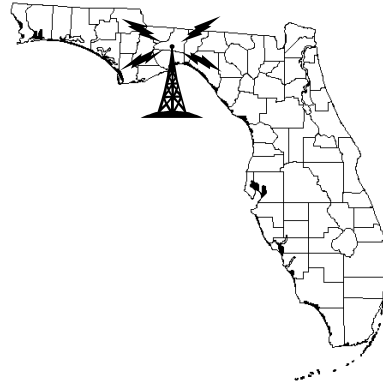
