Student Financial Assistance; amends provisions re Florida Public Student Assistance Grant Program; authorizes grants to part-time degree-seeking students; revises provisions re maximum amount of grants. Amends 240.409. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on March 6, 2002

CS/SB 1500 (3R) by the Committee on Children and Families, Senator Mitchell and others—

Parents' & Children's Day; renames "Children's Day" as "Parents' & Children's Day"; changes designated day for celebration of Parents' & Children's Day. Amends 683.17. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read the second time on March 6, 2002

Identical to HB 1283 (HC) in Messages

CS/CS/SB's 662, 232 (3R) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, Banking and Insurance, Senators Latvala and Geller—

Governmental Reorganization; (THIS BILL COMBINES S 662,232) establishes Office of Chief Financial Officer; creates Department of Financial Services; transfers Deferred Compensation Program from DOI to DMS; transfers Workers' Compensation Division from LES Dept. to Dept. of Financial Services; transfers Banking & Finance Dept. & Insurance Dept. to Dept. of Financial Services; repeals provision re Workers' Compensation in LES Dept., etc. Amends/Transfers/Repeals various FS. Effective Date: 01/07/2003 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on March 7, 2002

CS/SB 1926 (3R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Posey and others—

Citrus Canker; revises definition of citrus trees that are exposed to infection from citrus canker bacteria; provides for removal & destruction of infected citrus trees & trees exposed to infection; authorizes chief law enforcement officers to perform certain duties; provides grounds for issuance of search warrants re spread of citrus canker; provides repeal & review of provision re definition of term "exposed to infection", etc. Amends Ch. 581, 933.02,.07. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

CS/SB 24 (3R) by the Committee on Finance and Taxation and Senator Campbell—

Relief/Margaret B. Helm/Martin Co.; provides for relief of Margaret B. Helm for injuries & damages sustained as result of negligence of Martin Co. Volunteer Fire Dept.; specifies use of funds appropriated; provides for reimbursement of Medicaid Brain & Spinal Cord Injury Program & Vocational Rehabilitation Services expenditures. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

SB 26 (3R) by Senator Latvala—

Relief/Skowroneks/Clearwater; provides for relief of Eva Skowronek as widow of Wieslaw Skowronek & for relief of Anna Marie, Victor, & Hubert Alexander Skowronek, children of Wieslaw Skowronek, for death of Wieslaw Skowronek as result of negligence of City of Clearwater. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on February 14, 2002

SB 30 (3R) by Senator Jones—

Relief/Hilda De Paz/Miami-Dade Co.; provides for relief of Hilda De Paz; authorizes & directs Miami-Dade Co. to compensate Hilda De Paz for personal injuries she suffered due to negligence of county employees. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Relief/Jose & Johammes Pena/Hialeah; provides for relief of Jose Pena, as Personal Representative of Estate of Carmen Pena, deceased, & individually, as surviving father of Katherine Pena & Richard Pena, deceased minor children of Carmen Pena & Jose Pena; provides for relief of Johammes Pena, surviving son of Carmen Pena; compensates them for death of Carmen Pena, Katherine Pena, & Richard Pena as result of negligence of City of Hialeah. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

CS/SB 36 (3R) by the Committee on Finance and Taxation and Senator Rossin—

Relief/Jones & Fergusons; provides for relief of injuries of Kharmilia Ferguson, Angela Jones & Raymond Ferguson; compensates estate of Kharmilia Ferguson, Angela Jones, & Raymond Ferguson for injuries & damages sustained; specifies use of funds; provides for reimbursement of Medicaid expenditures. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

SB 38 (3R) by Senator Rossin—

Relief/Rosemary Falkinburg; provides for relief of Rosemary Falkinburg; authorizes & directs City of West Palm Beach to compensate Ms. Falkinburg for personal injuries she suffered due to negligence of city employee. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

SB 44 (3R) by Senator Pruitt—

Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

SB 50 (3R) by Senator Campbell—

Relief/Lawrence Bigney; provides for relief of Lawrence Douglas Bigney; authorizes & directs Sheriff's Office of Palm Beach Co. to compensate him for personal injuries suffered due to unlawful acts of employee of sheriff's office. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

CS/SB 52 (3R) by the Committee on Finance and Taxation and Senator Villalobos—

Relief/Calderon/Miami-Dade Co.; provides for relief of Jessica Ann Calderon, personal representative of Estate of Roberto Luis Calderon, Sean Ryan Calderon, minor child of Roberto Luis Calderon & Jessica Ann Calderon, & Lily Ann Calderon, minor child of Roberto Luis Calderon & Jessica Ann Calderon; compensates them for wrongful death of Roberto Luis Calderon as result of negligence of Miami-Dade Co. employee. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on February 14, 2002

CS/SB 56 (3R) by the Committee on Finance and Taxation and Senator Silver—

Relief/Joseph Arvay/Vero Beach; provides for relief of Joseph Arvay; directs City of Vero Beach to compensate Mr. Arvay for injuries caused by negligence of city police officer. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on February 14, 2002

CS/SB 60 (3R) by the Committee on Finance and Taxation and Senator Jones—

Relief/Joshua England/Monroe Co.; provides for relief of Joshua England, a minor; authorizes & directs District School Board of Monroe Co. to compensate Joshua England for personal injuries that he suffered due to negligence of school board employees; provides for use of such funds; provides for forfeiture & reversion of funds; provides for trustee qualifications. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

SB 62 (3R) by Senator Meek-

Relief/Millie Jackson/Miami-Dade Co.; provides for relief of Millie Jackson for injuries & damages sustained by her as result of negligent acts by employee of Miami-Dade County. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

CS/SB 66 (3R) by the Committee on Finance and Taxation and Senator Klein—

Relief/Harley & Dent; provides for relief of Mary Nell Dent Harley, as legal guardian of Ariel Alexus Dent, for injuries sustained by Ariel Alexus Dent as result of negligence on part of employee of Palm Beach County School Board. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on February 14, 2002

SB 72 (3R) by Senator Diaz de la Portilla-

Relief/Jacob P. Darna/Lee Co. School; provides for relief of Jacob P. Darna, a minor, for injuries sustained as result of negligence of Lee County School Board. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on February 14, 2002

SB 74 (3R) by Senator Campbell—

Relief/Steven Mitchell/Volusia Co.; provides for relief of Steven Mitchell; authorizes & directs Halifax Hospital Medical Center, special taxing district in Volusia Co. d/b/a Halifax Medical Center to compensate Mr. Mitchell for personal injuries that he suffered while at Halifax Medical Center. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Effective Date: 10/01/2002 except as otherwise provided.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries and withdrawn from the Committees on Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government and Appropriations

CS/SB 924 (SO) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity and Senator Clarv—

Deferred-payment Commodity Contracts; permits deferred-payment commodity contracts for replacing state accounting & cash-management systems to include certain commodities & services. Amends 287.063,.064. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, and the Committee on Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government reports the committee substitute favorably and withdrawn from the Committee on Appropriations with subcommittee recommendation

Similar to **CS/HB 395 (HC)** in the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government, and Appropriations

CS/SB 544 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations, Senator Pruitt and others—

Florida Arts Council/Dept. of State; revises membership of & appoints authority for Florida Arts Council; provides for terms of members; provides limitation on consecutive terms of membership; provides qualifications for council appointees; revises duty of council; revises scope of challenge grant program authorized by Cultural Affairs Division of Dept. of State; provides match ratio criteria for local, regional, & state or capital projects. Amends 265.285, 286. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government and withdrawn from the Committee on Appropriations with subcommittee recommendation

Similar to CS/HB 377 (HC) in Messages

CS/SB 268 (SO) by the Committee on Finance and Taxation and Senator Carlton—

Persons/Trust & Confidence Position; defines term "position of trust & confidence"; prescribes civil remedies for theft & other offenses in which victim is elderly person or disabled adult; provides that violation of patient rights is not cause of action under act; authorizes court to advance trial on docket which involves victim who is elderly person or disabled adult; provides guidelines for registration of professional guardians, etc. Amends Ch. 744, 772.11, 825.101. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Finance and Taxation, and withdrawn from the Committees on Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services, and Appropriations

SB 2094 (SO) by Senator Geller-

Misbranded Food Products; requires retesting of certain food products administratively determined to be misbranded; provides penalties. Amends 500.121. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Agriculture and Consumer Services, and withdrawn from the Committees on Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government and Appropriations

CS/SB 1916 (SO) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Silver—

Bail Bond Agencies & Agents; prescribes licensure requirements for managing general agents; provides for temporary permits; prescribes requirements for build-up accounts; revises qualifications for bail bond agents & temporary licenses; prohibits certain forms of solicitation & advertising; prescribes requirements for appointment of certain bail bond appointees who were previously appointed; provides severability, etc. Amends Ch. 648, 624.501,.523. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and the Committee on Criminal Justice reports the committee substitute favorably and withdrawn from the Committees on Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government and Appropriations

CS/SB 1066 (SO) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Campbell—

Uniform Commercial Code; revises provisions of said code as amended to clarify & conform; clarifies application of laws of this state to security interests in goods as fixtures; revises operation of provisions specifying priority of such security interests. Amends Ch. 679. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and the Committee on Banking and Insurance, reports the committee substitute favorably, with one amendment and withdrawn from the Committees on Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government and Appropriations

CS/CS/CS/SB 386 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Governmental Oversight and Productivity, Commerce and Economic Opportunities and Senator Holzendorf—

Fla. Black Business Investment Board; revises legislative findings re creation & growth of black business enterprises; redefines term "black business enterprise"; provides that board shall be not-for-profit corporation & not entity of state government; provides legislative findings that needs of black business enterprises are shared by other minority business enterprises; eliminates provisions re authority of corporation to acquire & sell property, etc. Amends Ch. 288. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Economic Opportunities, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government and withdrawn from the Committee on Appropriations with subcommittee recommendation

CS/SB 288 (SO) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Campbell—

Children/Continuances/Case Plans; provides that time limitations under specified provisions do not include continuances requested by any party; provides that time limitations governing placement of child in shelter do not include continuances requested by any party; provides limitations on continuances; eliminates requirement for court's continued review of child's placement in shelter. Amends 39.013,.402,.506. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably, with two amendments, by the Committee on Children and Families, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and withdrawn from the Committees on Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services, and Appropriations

SB 968 (SO) by Senator Silver-

Healthy Kids Corp./Operating Fund; allows Florida Healthy Kids Corporation to establish & manage operating fund; provides purposes of fund; provides limitations on cash balance; provides for reversion of moneys to state upon dissolution of corporation. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care, and reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, and withdrawn from the Committees on Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services, and Appropriations

CS/CS/CS/SB 686 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Children and Families, the Committee on Judiciary and others—

Legal Proceedings/Minor Children; provides for transfer of guardian ad litem program to Statewide Public Guardianship Office; provides for county funding of program elements; renames each guardian ad litem office as Circuit Office of Children's Representation; requires office to establish Circuit Office of Children's Representation in each judicial circuit; requires circuit offices to provide representation for children in dependency proceedings, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 10/01/2002.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children and Families, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services, and withdrawn from the Committee on Appropriations with subcommittee recommendation

CS/SB 996 (SO) by the Committee on Children and Families and Senator Saunders—

Road to Independence Act; creates said act; provides transition to self-sufficiency as goal for older children who are likely to remain in foster care until 18 years of age; directs CFS Dept. or its agents to administer system of independent-living transition services; provides for eligibility for services; provides for services for young adults formerly in foster care; provides for dept. & program accountability, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 10/01/2002.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children and Families, and withdrawn from the Committees on Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services, and Appropriations

Similar to **CS/HB 245 (HC)** in the Committees on Children and Families, Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services, and Appropriations

SB 1016 (SO) by Senator Burt-
