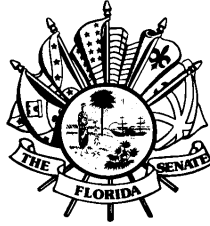

BILLS ON THIRD READING

GENERAL BILLS

CS/CS/SB 1610 (3R) by the Committees on Finance and Taxation, Regulated Industries and Senator Pruitt—

Communications Services Tax; amends provision re tax exemption on sale of communications services to religious or educational institutions; provides exception to requirement that dealers separately state communications services tax on bills & invoices; clarifies that E911 fee applies to certain customers; requires DOR to submit report on accuracy of 2001 state & local tax rates to Governor, Senate President, & House of Representatives Speaker, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on March 13, 2002

CS/SB 2124 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Laurent—

Drycleaning Solvent Cleanup Program; defines term "nearby real property owner"; exempts certain real property owners & others from claims for property damage arising from contamination by drycleaning solvents; revises provisions governing statutory construction of immunity provisions; revises provisions governing remedies & actions for damages; revises definition of term "third-party liability"; conforms statutory cross-reference, etc. Amends 376.301, .3078, .308, .313, .3079, .30781. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on March 13, 2002

CS/SB 934 (3R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Wasserman Schultz—

Sexual Offenses; provides for crime of lewd or lascivious offenses committed upon or in presence of elderly person or disabled person; provides penalties; amends provision re offense severity ranking chart of criminal punishment code; revises punishment for lewd or lascivious battery upon elderly person or disabled adult. Amends 825.1025, 921.0022. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read the second time and amended on March 13, 2002

SB 2500 (3R) by the Committee on Appropriations—

Appropriations; provides moneys for annual period beginning July 1, 2002, & ending June 30, 2003, to pay salaries, & other expenses, capital outlay - buildings, & other improvements, & for other specified purposes of various agencies of State government. Effective Date: 07/01/2002 or upon becoming law, whichever occurs later.

Read the second time and amended on March 14, 2002

*Similar to **HB 1943 (HC)** in the Committee on Appropriations*

SB 2502 (3R) by the Committee on Appropriations—

Appropriations Implementing Bill; increases percentage of funds from financial aid fee to be used for need-based financial aid; prohibits State University System employees from enrolling in tuition-free courses; authorizes CFS Dept. to transfer funding between certain services; provides for additional positions to operate additional prison bed capacity under certain circumstances; provides for use of Emergency Management, Preparedness, & Assistance TF, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2002 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on March 14, 2002

*Compare to **HB 1945 (HC)** in the Committee on Appropriations*

CS/SB 1108 (3R) by the Committee on Appropriations and Senator Silver—

Health Care; provides for feasibility study re outsourcing specified functions of Dentistry Board; requires agency to contract for evaluation of Fla. Kidcare program; revises provisions governing purchase of goods & services for Medicaid recipients; revises disproportionate share/financial assistance program for rural hospitals; requires AHCA to conduct pilot program for subacute pediatric transitional care center, etc. Amends Ch. 409, 499.012. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read the second time and amended on March 14, 2002

CS/SB 1116 (3R) by the Committee on Appropriations and Senator Silver—

Children & Family Services Dept.; provides for use of funds by department; prescribes specified contract requirement; requires department to operate domestic violence program; specifies amount of funds available for use by department & FDLE; repeals provisions re funding for Prevention of Domestic & Sexual Violence Program; abrogates repeal of community partnership matching grant program; authorizes sale of hospital & provides for use of proceeds, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read the second time on March 14, 2002

CS/CS/SB 1654 (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Judiciary and Senator Burt—

Increase of Judges & Justices; increases number of judges in specified judicial circuits; increases number of judges in specified county courts; increases number of judges in specified district courts of appeal; provides for appointment by Governor. Amends 26.031, 34.022, 35.06. Effective Date: 07/01/2002 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on March 14, 2002

HJR 1987 (3R) by the Procedural & Redistricting Council, Representative Byrd and others—

Apportionment; provides for apportionment of Fla. House of Representatives & Fla. Senate (plans H062H001 & H062S001); adopts United States Decennial Census of 2000 for use in such apportionment; provides for omitted areas; provides contiguity for areas specified for inclusion in one district which are entirely surrounded by other districts; provides severability of invalid portions; provides for application beginning in 2002.

Substituted for CS/SJR 580 (SUB) (Laurent), read the second time and amended on March 15, 2002

CS/CS/SB 1360 (3R) by the Committees on Finance and Taxation, Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs and Senator Pruitt—

Property Tax Administration; provides additional right to know amount of special district taxes; authorizes DOR to prescribe form of petition to value adjustment board; provides timeline for exchange of information & uniform procedures for value adjustment board hearings; limits counties authorized to appoint special masters; authorizes DOR to update guidelines for tangible personal property assessment upon approval of executive director, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 01/01/2003.

Read the second time and amended on March 15, 2002

CS/CS/SB 1656 (3R) by the Committees on Children and Families, Judiciary, Senator Burt and others—

Rape Crisis Centers; provides definition; provides for confidential communication between sexual crime victim & trained volunteer at rape crisis center; expands privilege of refusal to disclose certain information to include communications between victim & trained volunteer; prohibits disclosure of certain identifying information re sexual crime victims by public officers or employees; provides penalty. Amends 90.5035, 794.024. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read the second time on March 15, 2002

CS/SB 1994 (3R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Latvala—

Insurance/Communication Equipment; exempts applicants for limited licenses for communication equipment property or communication equipment inland marine insurance from certain examination requirements; provides for issuance of such limited licenses; exempts such limited licensees from certain education requirements. Amends 626.221, .321, .732. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read the second time on March 15, 2002

CS/SB 1418 (3R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, Senator Garcia and others—

Insurance; provides for certain additional coverages under Fla. Hurricane Catastrophe Fund; renames Residential Property & Casualty Joint Underwriting Association as Citizens Property Insurance Corporation to provide residential & commercial property insurance; provides for emergency assessments for policyholders of participating insurers; authorizes corporation to enter into quota share primary insurance agreements, etc. Amends Ch. 627, 215.555. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on March 15, 2002

CS/SB 268 (3R) by the Committee on Finance and Taxation and Senator Carlton—

Persons/Trust & Confidence Position; prescribes civil remedies for theft & other offenses in which victim is elderly or disabled person; provides that violation of patient rights is not cause of action under act; provides for court actions to protect ward in event of breach of fiduciary duty by guardian; provides priority of guardian advocate who has been authorized to consent to medical treatment for person with developmental disability, etc. Amends Chs. 744, 765, 772.11, 825.101. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on March 15, 2002

HB 813 (3R) by Representatives Dockery, Greenstein, Lacasa, Goodlette, Harrington, Atwater, Alexander, Gannon and others—

Everglades Restoration; provides for distribution of proceeds from excise taxes on documents to pay debt service on Everglades restoration bonds; authorizes issuance of said bonds to finance or refinance cost of acquisition & improvement of land, water areas, & related property interests & resources for purpose of implementing Comprehensive Everglades Restoration Plan; provides that certain project components shall be exempt from permit requirements, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2002 except as otherwise provided.

Substituted for CS/SB 684 (SUB) (Brown-Waite), read the second time and amended on March 15, 2002

CS/SB's 1226, CS/734 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary, Children and Families and others—

Family Court Reform; (THIS BILL COMBINES S1226,CS/734) creates Commission on Family Law & Children to develop family code; provides for membership & staffing commission; provides for repeal of commission; revises timeframe for completing parenting course; requires Criminal Justice Standards & Training Commission to allow agencies employing law officers to authorize volunteer service as means of fulfilling requirements for continuing education, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read the second time and amended on March 15, 2002

SB 1946 (3R) by Senator Sebesta—

DMS/Leases/Right-to-terminate; requires certain replacement leases to contain right-to-terminate clause except under specified circumstances. Amends 255.25. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read the second time and amended on March 15, 2002

CS/SB 1772 (3R) by the Committee on Agriculture and Consumer Services and Senator Smith—

Agriculture/Crop Damage/Destruction; revises provisions that provide cause of civil action for knowing & willful damage or destruction of agricultural crops to include damage or destruction to agricultural production systems; provides for allowable damages; provides exemption from liability. Amends 604.60. Effective Date: 10/01/2002.

Read the second time and amended on March 15, 2002

CS/SB 1264 (3R) by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care and Senator Brown-Waite—

Public Health Emergency; revises rulemaking authority of Health Dept. re its power to impose quarantine, including requiring vaccination; specifies terms under which public health emergency is declared; provides for consultation for, notice, & duration of declaration of public health emergency; provides immunity from civil damages under Good Samaritan Act for actions taken in response to situations during declared emergency, etc. Amends 381.0011, .00315, 768.13. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on March 15, 2002

HB 861 (3R) by Representative Flanagan and others—

State Attorneys/Reports; amends provision re State Attorney RICO Trust Fund; revises requirements for explanation, submission, & maintenance of sentencing deviation reports for prison release reoffenders who do not receive mandatory minimum sentence; repeals provision re annual report by Fla. Prosecuting Attorneys Association re prosecutions, etc. Amends 27.345, 775.082; repeals various FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Substituted for CS/SB 948 (SUB) (Smith) and read the second time on March 15, 2002

CS/CS/SB 512 (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, Senator Saunders and others—

Civil Legal Assistance Act; creates Florida Access to Civil Legal Assistance Act; provides definitions; specifies powers of DCA for certain purposes; limits use of certain funds for certain purposes; requires DCA to contract for delivery of civil legal assistance to certain persons through not-for-profit legal aid organizations; provides contract requirements; specifies application; requires DCA to ensure accountability; provides for eligibility for state support, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on March 15, 2002

CS/CS/SB 640 (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Health, Aging and Long-Term Care and Senator Burt—

Criminal Offenses; authorizes representative of DOH to appear in criminal proceeding against health care professional to furnish information, make recommendations, or provide other assistance; prohibits practitioner from knowingly assisting person in obtaining controlled substance through fraud or scheme, knowingly prescribing controlled substance for fictitious person, or prescribing controlled substance for purposes of monetary benefit, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read the second time on March 15, 2002

CS/SB 168 (3R) by the Committee on Agriculture and Consumer Services and Senator Miller—

Farm Labor Contractors; prohibits charging of certain fees to farm laborers. Amends 450.34. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read the second time and amended on March 15, 2002

CS/CS/SB 1150 (3R) by the Committees on Criminal Justice, Health, Aging and Long-Term Care, Senator Saunders and others—

Medicaid Overpayments/Recovery; specifies additional requirements for Medicaid Fraud Control Unit of Legal Affairs Dept. & Medicaid program integrity program; extends whistle-blower protection to employees of Medicaid providers reporting Medicaid fraud or abuse; allows AHCA to take action against licensee in certain circumstances; prescribes additional requirements re provider enrollment; requires that AHCA deny provider's application under certain circumstances, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on March 15, 2002

SB 1574 (3R) by Senator Garcia—

Enterprise Zone/City of Hialeah; requires designation of enterprise zone in City of Hialeah under certain circumstances notwithstanding certain limitations; provides requirements. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on March 15, 2002

SB 8 (3R) by Senator Campbell—

Relief/Hopkins & Bowman; provides for relief of Towanna Denise Hopkins, incompetent, by & through Willie Lee Hopkins, her father & legally appointed guardian, Robert Keith Bowman, Jr., son of Towanna Denise Hopkins, & Willie Lee Hopkins, individually; authorizes & directs Fla. Board of Regents, University of South Florida, & USF Health Sciences Center Insurance Company to compensate them for injuries & damages, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on February 14, 2002

CS/SB 10 (3R) by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care and Senator Villalobos—

Relief/Mark Schwartz; provides for relief of Mark Schwartz, a minor, for injuries sustained as result of negligence of employees of Coral Springs Medical Center. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on February 14, 2002

CS/SB 24 (3R) by the Committee on Finance and Taxation and Senator Campbell—

Relief/Margaret B. Helm/Martin Co.; provides for relief of Margaret B. Helm for injuries & damages sustained as result of negligence of Martin Co. Volunteer Fire Dept.; specifies use of funds appropriated; provides for reimbursement of Medicaid Brain & Spinal Cord Injury Program & Vocational Rehabilitation Services expenditures. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on February 14, 2002

SB 26 (3R) by Senator Latvala—

Relief/Skowroneks/Clearwater; provides for relief of Eva Skowronek as widow of Wieslaw Skowronek & for relief of Anna Marie, Victor, & Hubert Alexander Skowronek, children of Wieslaw Skowronek, for death of Wieslaw Skowronek as result of negligence of City of Clearwater. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on February 14, 2002

SB 30 (3R) by Senator Jones—

Relief/Hilda De Paz/Miami-Dade Co.; provides for relief of Hilda De Paz; authorizes & directs Miami-Dade Co. to compensate Hilda De Paz for personal injuries she suffered due to negligence of county employees. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on February 14, 2002

CS/SB 32 (3R) by the Committee on Finance and Taxation and Senator Lawson—

Relief/Jose & Johannes Pena/Hialeah; provides for relief of Jose Pena, as Personal Representative of Estate of Carmen Pena, deceased, & individually, as surviving father of Katherine Pena & Richard Pena, deceased minor children of Carmen Pena & Jose Pena; provides for relief of Johannes Pena, surviving son of Carmen Pena; compensates them for death of Carmen Pena, Katherine Pena, & Richard Pena as result of negligence of City of Hialeah. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on February 14, 2002

CS/SB 36 (3R) by the Committee on Finance and Taxation and Senator Rossin—

Relief/Jones & Fergusons; provides for relief of injuries of Kharmilia Ferguson, Angela Jones & Raymond Ferguson; compensates estate of Kharmilia Ferguson, Angela Jones, & Raymond Ferguson for injuries & damages sustained; specifies use of funds; provides for reimbursement of Medicaid expenditures. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on February 14, 2002

SB 38 (3R) by Senator Rossin—

Relief/Rosemary Falkinburg; provides for relief of Rosemary Falkinburg; authorizes & directs City of West Palm Beach to compensate Ms. Falkinburg for personal injuries she suffered due to negligence of city employee. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on February 14, 2002

SB 44 (3R) by Senator Pruitt—

Relief/James Torrence; provides for relief of James Torrence; authorizes & directs Palm Beach Co. Health Care District to compensate him for personal injuries resulting from surgery negligently performed by health care district employee. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on February 14, 2002

CS/SB 46 (3R) by the Committee on Finance and Taxation and Senator Pruitt—

Relief/Sharon & Victor Dixon, Sr.; provides for relief of Sharon Dixon & Victor Dixon, Sr.; authorizes & directs School Board of Indian River Co. to compensate them for wrongful death of their minor child, Victor Dixon, Jr., due to negligence of employee of school board. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on February 14, 2002

SB 50 (3R) by Senator Campbell—

Relief/Lawrence Bigney; provides for relief of Lawrence Douglas Bigney; authorizes & directs Sheriff's Office of Palm Beach Co. to compensate him for personal injuries suffered due to unlawful acts of employee of sheriff's office. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on February 14, 2002

CS/SB 52 (3R) by the Committee on Finance and Taxation and Senator Villalobos—

Relief/Calderon/Miami-Dade Co.; provides for relief of Jessica Ann Calderon, personal representative of Estate of Roberto Luis Calderon, Sean Ryan Calderon, minor child of Roberto Luis Calderon & Jessica Ann Calderon, & Lily Ann Calderon, minor child of Roberto Luis Calderon & Jessica Ann Calderon; compensates them for wrongful death of Roberto Luis Calderon as result of negligence of Miami-Dade Co. employee. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on February 14, 2002

CS/SB 56 (3R) by the Committee on Finance and Taxation and Senator Silver—

Relief/Joseph Arvay/Vero Beach; provides for relief of Joseph Arvay; directs City of Vero Beach to compensate Mr. Arvay for injuries caused by negligence of city police officer. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on February 14, 2002

CS/SB 60 (3R) by the Committee on Finance and Taxation and Senator Jones—

Relief/Joshua England/Monroe Co.; provides for relief of Joshua England, a minor; authorizes & directs District School Board of Monroe Co. to compensate Joshua England for personal injuries that he suffered due to negligence of school board employees; provides for use of such funds; provides for forfeiture & reversion of funds; provides for trustee qualifications. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on February 14, 2002

SB 62 (3R) by Senator Meek—

Relief/Millie Jackson/Miami-Dade Co.; provides for relief of Millie Jackson for injuries & damages sustained by her as result of negligent acts by employee of Miami-Dade County. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on February 14, 2002

CS/SB 66 (3R) by the Committee on Finance and Taxation and Senator Klein—

Relief/Harley & Dent; provides for relief of Mary Nell Dent Harley, as legal guardian of Ariel Alexis Dent, for injuries sustained by Ariel Alexis Dent as result of negligence on part of employee of Palm Beach County School Board. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on February 14, 2002

SB 72 (3R) by Senator Diaz de la Portilla—

Relief/Jacob P. Darna/Lee Co. School; provides for relief of Jacob P. Darna, a minor, for injuries sustained as result of negligence of Lee County School Board. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on February 14, 2002

SB 74 (3R) by Senator Campbell—

Relief/Steven Mitchell/Volusia Co.; provides for relief of Steven Mitchell; authorizes & directs Halifax Hospital Medical Center, special taxing district in Volusia Co. d/b/a Halifax Medical Center to compensate Mr. Mitchell for personal injuries that he suffered while at Halifax Medical Center. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on February 14, 2002

SPECIAL ORDER CALENDAR AS DETERMINED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES AND CALENDAR FOR MONDAY, MARCH 18, 2002

CS/SB 594 (SO) by the Committee on Reapportionment and Senator Latvala—

Congressional Districts of State; redistricts state's congressional districts in accordance with United States Decennial Census of 2000; provides for inclusion of unlisted territory in contiguous districts; provides contiguity for areas specified for inclusion in one district which are entirely surrounded by other districts; reenacts provision which provides for election of representatives to United States House of Representatives, etc. Amends Ch. 8; reenacts 8.031. Effective Date: Contingent except ss. 7 & 8 shall take effect upon this act becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Reapportionment and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules and Calendar

*Compare to **HB 1993 (HC)** in the Committees on Reapportionment and Rules and Calendar*

CS/SB 1312 (SO) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Campbell—

Child Custody; creates "Uniform Child Custody Jurisdiction & Enforcement Act"; provides purposes; specifies proceedings not governed by act; provides application to Indian tribes; provides international application of act; provides for notice to persons outside state; provides for communication between courts of this state & courts of other states; provides for taking testimony in another state, etc. Amends Ch. 61, 39.502, 741.30; reenacts 44.102. Effective Date: 10/01/2002.

With pending amendment 6 by Senator Campbell and pending amendment 6a by Senator Meek (March 15, 2002)

*Similar to **CS/HB 549 (HC)** in the Committees on Judiciary and Children and Families*

CS/SJR 940 (SO) by the Committee on Ethics and Elections, Senator Smith and others—

Constitution/Amendments/Initiatives; constitutional amendment to allow legislation to be proposed by initiative, prescribe standards for such proposals, & require that Legislature adopt procedures governing such initiatives & to increase number of votes required to approve constitutional amendment or revision & require that ballot statement of proposed constitutional amendment include statement of amendment's economic impact. Creates s. 20, Art. III; amends s. 5, Art. XI.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Ethics and Elections, and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules and Calendar

CS/CS/SB 370 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Health, Aging and Long-Term Care and Senator Saunders—

Health Regulation; terminates standardized credentialing program for health care practitioners; requires accreditation of physician offices in which surgery is performed; exempts certain persons from radiologic technologist certification & provides certain training requirements for such exemption; defines term "medically unnecessary procedure"; requires AHCA to adopt rules governing conduct of inspections or investigations, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2002 except as otherwise provided.

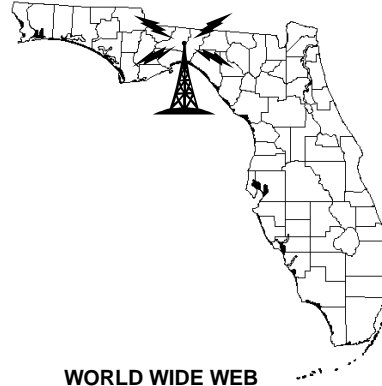
