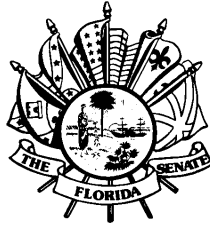

BILLS ON THIRD READING

GENERAL BILLS

CS/CS/SB 526 (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Regulated Industries and Senator Campbell—

Land Surveying & Mapping; exempts certain subordinate employees from provisions re regulation of land surveying & mapping; provides rulemaking authority to Professional Surveyors & Mappers Board re use of professional titles by retirees; deletes obsolete prerequisite to take licensure exam to practice as surveyor & mapper; revises provisions re access to lands of others for surveying or mapping purposes, etc. Amends Ch. 472. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read the second time on February 27, 2002

*Similar to **CS/HB 489 (HC)** in Messages*

CS/SB 88 (3R) by the Committee on Appropriations and Senator Pruitt—

Learning Gateway Program; authorizes demonstration program to be called Learning Gateway; creates steering committee; provides for membership & appointment of committee members; establishes duties of committee; authorizes demonstration projects in specified counties; authorizes designated agencies to provide confidential information to such program; provides for funding. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on February 28, 2002

SB 86 (3R) by Senator Pruitt—

Public Records/Learning Gateway; provides exemption from public records law for individual records of children enrolled in Learning Gateway programs; provides for release of such records for specified purposes; exempts from public records law those records held by said program which would be confidential if held by state agency; provides for future legislative review & repeal; provides finding of public necessity. Effective Date: Contingent.

Read the second time and amended on February 28, 2002

CS/SB 1496 (3R) by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care and Senator Campbell—

Nursing Training Programs; revises provisions governing approval of training programs by Board of Nursing; provides for adoption of rules; exempts certain programs from board oversight; provides for review of certain substandard programs. Amends 464.019. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read the second time and amended on February 28, 2002

CS/CS/SB 362 (3R) by the Committees on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care, Banking and Insurance, Senator Saunders and others—

Health Insurance; includes preferred provider organization & health insurers in claim dispute resolution program; provides requirements & procedures for payment or denial of claims; provides for direct payment for services in treatment of psychological disorder or substance abuse; provides that HMOs remain liable for certain violations that occur after transfer of certain financial obligations through health care risk contracts, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 10/01/2002.

Read the second time and amended on February 28, 2002

CS/SB 2102 (3R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Villalobos—

Motor Vehicle Service Agreements; revises definition of "motor vehicle service agreement"; revises definition of "corporation"; requires service agreement companies to maintain contractual liability insurance & limits those to whom vehicle protection products may be sold; revises financial requirements for warranty associations to qualify for contractual liability policies covering claims exposure under contracts delivered in this state, etc. Amends Ch. 634. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on February 28, 2002

CS/SB 1388 (3R) by the Committee on Education and Senator Pruitt—

Instructional Personnel; requires certain competencies as prerequisite to initial professional certification; requires procedures to be included in school district evaluation systems for instructional personnel; requires review by DOE; requires development & implementation of certain professional development training components. Amends 231.17,.29. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on February 28, 2002

CS/SB 300 (3R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Miller and others—

Prosecuting Crime/Time Limitations; provides that certain time limitations for prosecuting crime do not apply if alleged perpetrator of offense of sexual battery is identified, after expiration of such applicable time period, by analysis of DNA collected during investigation of crime or otherwise made available to law enforcement agency. Amends 775.15. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read the second time and amended on February 28, 2002

CS/SB 1912 (3R) by the Committee on Commerce and Economic Opportunities and Senator Peaden—

Defense Contractors; redefines term "Department of Defense contract"; revises required minimum percentage of gross receipts derived from Department of Defense contracts. Amends 288.1045. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read the second time on February 28, 2002

CS/SB 618 (3R) by the Committee on Ethics and Elections and Senator Sanderson—

Elections; requires late registration to be done in office of supervisor of elections; provides that voter who is in line when polls are scheduled to close must be allowed to vote; prescribes poll-worker procedures where name of potential voter is not on precinct register; revises provisions for duplicating defective ballots for purposes of tallying valid votes; etc. Amends Chs. 98, 101, 102, 97.0555,.021, 98.255, 100.011, 105.031. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on February 28, 2002

CLAIM BILLS

SB 8 (3R) by Senator Campbell—

Relief/Hopkins & Bowman; provides for relief of Towanna Denise Hopkins, incompetent, by & through Willie Lee Hopkins, her father & legally appointed guardian, Robert Keith Bowman, Jr., son of Towanna Denise Hopkins, & Willie Lee Hopkins, individually; authorizes & directs Fla. Board of Regents, University of South Florida, & USF Health Sciences Center Insurance Company to compensate them for injuries & damages, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on February 14, 2002

CS/SB 10 (3R) by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care and Senator Villalobos—

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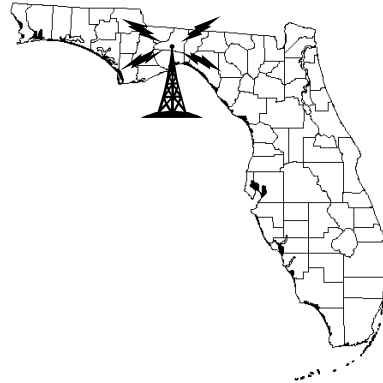
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
