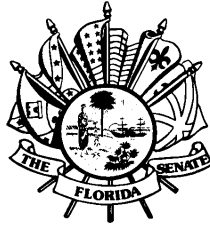

BILLS ON THIRD READING

GENERAL BILLS

CS/HB 811 (3R) by the Council for Ready Infrastructure, the Committee on Select Committee on Security (PRC), Representative Bense and others—

Seaport Security Infrastructure; adds seaport security infrastructure measures to list of projects eligible for funding by grant under Fla. Seaport Transportation & Economic Development Program; exempts such measures from certain matching fund requirements; provides for expiration of such provisions; authorizes seaports to request specified changes in purpose of work program projects; provides for allocation & use of specified federal funds. Amends 311.07. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for CS/SB 972 (SUB) (Brown-Waite) and read the second time on March 6, 2002

CS/SB 1002 (3R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator King and others—

Cruelty to Animals; provides additional acts which constitute cruelty to animal; provides that any person convicted of specified acts which constitute cruelty to animal, where finder of fact determines that violation includes knowing & intentional torture or torment of animal, shall, in addition to any other sentence imposed, be ordered to complete anger management treatment program, etc. Amends 828.12; reenacts various FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on March 6, 2002

SB 2070 (3R) by Senator Sullivan and others—

Universities & Community Colleges; revises membership of state university boards of trustees; provides requirements for university student governments; provides requirements re adoption of internal procedures; provides for review of internal procedure disapproved by university president; revises membership of Board of Trustees of New College of Fla.; repeals provision re suspension & removal of elected student government officials, etc. Amends Chs. 229, 240; repeals 240.136. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read the second time on March 6, 2002

CS/SB 94 (3R) by the Committee on Appropriations and Senator Miller—

Schools/Reading Instruction; provides legislative intent re required reading instruction; requires each public elementary school to develop & implement programs for reading & literacy development in kindergarten through grade 4; establishes program to encourage training of teachers in reading development; provides guidelines for selecting reading programs; provides criteria that reading programs must satisfy, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read the second time and amended on March 6, 2002

SB 1914 (3R) by Senator Klein and others—

Student Financial Assistance; amends provisions re Florida Public Student Assistance Grant Program; authorizes grants to part-time degree-seeking students; revises provisions re maximum amount of grants. Amends 240.409. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on March 6, 2002

CS/SB 1806 (3R) by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care and Senator Silver—

Fla. Center for Nursing Trust Fund; provides exemption to service charges for said fund; creates Florida Center for Nursing Trust Fund; provides for sources of funds & purposes; provides for annual carryforward of funds; provides for future review & termination or re-creation of trust fund. Amends 215.22; creates 464.0198. Effective Date: Contingent.

Read the second time on March 6, 2002

SB 592 (3R) by Senator Peaden—

Adoption Assistance; provides authority for CFS Dept. to enter into interstate agreements with other participating states for medical & other necessary services for special-needs children; establishes procedures for interstate delivery of adoption assistance & related services & benefits; provides for rules; prohibits expansion of state's financial commitment. Creates 409.406,.407. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read the second time on March 6, 2002

CS/SB 1276 (3R) by the Committee on Appropriations and Senator Silver—

Fla. Health & Human Services Access; creates "Florida Health & Human Services Access Act"; provides legislative findings & intent re access to state-funded health services; requires AHCA to establish as pilot project comprehensive health & human services eligibility access system; authorizes agency to request federal waivers; establishes Health Care Access Steering Committee; authorizes planning, development, & implementation of Florida 211 Network, etc. Amends Chs. 408, 430, 409.912. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on March 6, 2002

CS/CS/SB 596 (3R) by the Committee on Appropriations and the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care—

Long-term Care; provides legislative findings & intent re needs of state's elderly population; requires AHCA & Elderly Affairs Dept. to submit plan to Governor & Legislature for reducing nursing-home-bed days funded under Medicaid program; requires AHCA to establish nursing facility preadmission screening program through interagency agreement with Elderly Affairs Dept.; establishes Long-Term-Care Policy Office within said dept, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read the second time and amended on March 6, 2002

CS/CS/SB 484 (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Health, Aging and Long-Term Care and Senator Silver—

Subacute Pediatric Transitional Care; requires AHCA to conduct study of health care services provided to medically fragile or medical-technology-dependent children; requires AHCA to conduct pilot program for subacute pediatric transitional care center; requires agency to amend Medicaid state plan & seek federal waivers as necessary; provides requirements for admission, transfer, & discharge of child to center, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2002.

Read the second time and amended on March 6, 2002

SB 1536 (3R) by Senator Sebesta—

Supervisors of Elections; provides for nonpartisan election of supervisors of elections; requires candidates for supervisor of elections to pay qualifying fee, subscribe to oath, & file certain items to qualify; provides procedures for candidates for supervisor of elections to qualify by alternative method; provides for form of ballot for candidates for supervisor of elections; provides for write-in candidates for supervisor of elections, etc. Amends Chs. 98, 101, 105. Effective Date: 01/01/2003.

Read the second time on March 6, 2002

CS/SB 1500 (3R) by the Committee on Children and Families, Senator Mitchell and others—

Parents' & Children's Day; renames "Children's Day" as "Parents' & Children's Day"; changes designated day for celebration of Parents' & Children's Day. Amends 683.17. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read the second time on March 6, 2002

SB 716 (3R) by Senator Peaden—

Domestic Violence Program; requires CFS Dept. to operate domestic violence program; specifies program purposes; repeals provision re "Prevention of Domestic & Sexual Violence Program"; specifies amount of funds available for use by CFS Dept. & FDLE; repeals provisions re funding for Prevention of Domestic & Sexual Violence Program. Amends 39.903, 938.01; repeals 741.466. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read the second time and amended on March 6, 2002

CS/SB 276 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity and Senator Crist—

Nursing Homes; revises membership & terms of office of Governor's Panel on Excellence in Long-Term Care; provides for selection of panel chairperson; provides conditions under which prohibition against payment of referral fees by assisted living facilities does not apply; authorizes AHCA to adopt rules; provides that certain penalties for patient brokering do not apply under such conditions. Amends 400.235, .4195, 817.505. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on March 6, 2002

SB 146 (3R) by Senator Dyer—

Communicable Diseases/Prevention; requires Health Dept. to adopt certain standards applicable to all public-sector employers; requires compilation & maintenance of certain information by department for use by employers. Amends 381.003. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read the second time on March 6, 2002

CS/SB 374 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity and Senator Brown-Waite—

Citrus/Hernando Waterways/SWFWMD; creates Citrus/Hernando Waterways Restoration Council; provides for membership, powers, & duties; provides for separate county task forces; provides for report to Legislature; provides for advisory group to council; requires SWFWMD to act as lead entity for purpose of providing staff & administrative support for council; provides for Citrus/Hernando Waterways restoration program. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on March 6, 2002

CS/CS/SB 694 (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Regulated Industries and Senator Geller—

Condominiums & Cooperatives; redefines terms "mortgage" & "foreclosure proceedings"; revises provisions re declarations for creation of condominium; revises provisions re bylaws; revises provisions re material alterations of common elements or association real property operated by multicondominium association; provides for master association meetings; provides powers of Fla. Land Sales, Condo., & Mobile Homes Div. over master associations, etc. Amends Ch. 718, 702.09. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read the second time and amended on March 6, 2002

CS/SB 426 (3R) by the Committee on Finance and Taxation and Senator Campbell—

Tax Administration; eliminates requirement that corporation file intangibles tax return when no tax is due; repeals provision re tax on stock certificates; provides for maximum tax that must be paid on unsecured obligations; authorizes DOR to require report to be submitted when filing sales & use tax return that claims certain credits, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 01/01/2003 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on March 6, 2002

CS/SB 462 (3R) by the Committee on Finance and Taxation and Senator Pruitt—

Excise Tax on Documents; provides for maximum tax that must be paid on unsecured obligations; conforms cross-references. Amends 201.08. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read the second time on March 6, 2002

CS/HJR 317 (3R) by the Committee on Local Government & Veterans Affairs (SGC), Representative Gibson and others—

Homestead Property/Elderly Housing; constitutional amendment to allow counties to exempt from taxation increase in assessed value of homestead property resulting from constructing living quarters for parent or grandparent of property owner or owner's spouse who is 62 years old or older; limits amount of such exemption to increase in assessed value resulting from such construction or 20% of total assessed value of property as improved, whichever is less. Amends s. 4, Art. VII.

Substituted for CS/SJR 504 (SUB) (Brown-Waite) and read the second time on March 6, 2002

CS/CS/HB 313 (3R) by the Council for Smarter Government, the Committee on Local Government & Veterans Affairs (SGC), Representative Gibson and others—

Homestead Exemption/Elderly Housing; provides for reduction in assessment for constructed or reconstructed living quarters for parents or grandparents of homestead property owners or of their spouses; provides limitations; provides application procedures; provides penalties for making willfully false statement in application; provides for adjustment of assessed value of property when property owner is no longer eligible for reduction in assessment. Creates 193.703. Effective Date: Contingent.

Substituted for CS/SB 506 (SUB) (Brown-Waite) and read the second time on March 6, 2002

CS/SB 2014 (3R) by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs and Senator Futch—

Homestead Exemption/Persons 65/Older; amends provision which allows counties & municipalities to grant such exemption; provides requirements re taxpayer's statement of household income & supporting documents; revises submission date for such documents; authorizes random audits of such statements; provides requirements re release of tax information to property appraiser; provides penalties & provides for lien for improperly taking such exemption, etc. Amends 196.075. Effective Date: 01/01/2003.

Read the second time on March 6, 2002

SJR 1284 (3R) by Senator Latvala—

Public Records/Public Meetings; constitutional amendment to require that laws providing exemptions from public records or public meetings requirements must, after effective date of this amendment, be passed by two-thirds vote of each house of Legislature. Amends s. 24, Art. I.

Read the second time and amended on March 6, 2002

CS/SB 178 (3R) by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Miller—

Parking Permits/Disabled/Photographs; provides for photographs on parking permits for disabled persons; transfers issuance of such permits to driver's license office within HSMV; authorizes tax collectors to issue such permits if they have capability of processing digital image of applicant; conforms provisions. Amends 316.1955.,1964, 318.18, 320.08035.,084.,0842.,0843.,0848, 322.051.,181, 526.141, 553.5041. Effective Date: 10/01/2002.

Read the second time on March 6, 2002

CS/SB 1306 (3R) by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Sebesta—

Road Designations; designates portion of I-275 in Pinellas Co. as "St. Petersburg Parkway"; dedicates new Rose Bay bridges between Cities of New Smyrna Beach & Pt. Orange to honor U.S. military POW's & MIA's; designates portion of State Road 16 as "Correctional Officers Memorial Highway"; designates portion of Interstate 75 as "Purple Heart Memorial Highway"; designates "Borinquen Boulevard" in Miami-Dade Co.; directs DOT to erect suitable markers, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on March 6, 2002

SB 138 (3R) by Senator Burt—

Criminal Street Gang Activity; revises procedure under which court may sentence person to enhanced sentence when person is convicted of or adjudicated delinquent for committing offense for purpose of benefiting, promoting, or furthering interests of criminal street gang; deletes requirement that court make such finding at sentencing; deletes requirement that such finding be made by preponderance of evidence, etc. Amends 874.04; reenacts 921.0024(1)(b). Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read the second time on March 6, 2002

CS/SB 952 (3R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Sanderson—

Elderly/Disabled Adults/Exploitation; revises statute of limitations for prosecutions for abuse, aggravated abuse, or neglect of elderly person or disabled adult; specifies statute of limitations for prosecutions for exploitation of elderly person or disabled adult. Amends 775.15. Effective Date: 10/01/2002.

Read the second time on March 6, 2002

CS/SB 1026 (3R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Crist—

Crimes Against Minors; revises elements of crimes of kidnapping minor child & false imprisonment of minor child; revises elements of crime of luring or enticing minor child for unlawful purpose; provides for prosecuting offender who has not been previously convicted of violation involving sexual battery or lewd or lascivious offense against minor; increases penalty imposed for offense of luring or enticing minor child for unlawful purpose, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 10/01/2002.

Read the second time on March 6, 2002

SB 98 (3R) by Senator Silver—

Regional Cultural Facilities; authorizes Cultural Affairs Div. of Dept. of State to accept & administer funds to provide grants for acquiring, renovating, or constructing said facilities; requires Fla. Arts Council to review grant applications; requires council to submit annual list to Secretary of State; requires updating of information submitted by applicant which is carried over from prior year; provides standards for matching state funds, etc. Creates 265.702. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read the second time on March 6, 2002

SB 274 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity—

Public Records; removes photographic film reproductions of specified vouchers or checks paid by State Treasurer & preserved as records of office of Treasurer from classification as permanent records; establishes state policy re public records; requires governmental agencies to consider certain factors in designing or acquiring electronic recordkeeping systems; authorizes agencies to charge fee for public records copies stored in systems, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read the second time and amended on March 6, 2002

CS/SB 420 (3R) by the Committee on Commerce and Economic Opportunities and Senator Burt—

Consumer Services; prohibits employment agencies & assistance referral services from charging advance fees & not providing promised services; defines terms "seller" & "person selling hearing aid"; provides legislative intent that courts should order restitution in cases of unlicensed contracting; prohibits credit service organizations from accepting money in advance of performing services, etc. Creates 468.90, 501.162; amends Ch. 817, 484.0512, 489.128, .532. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read the second time on March 6, 2002

CS/SB 1212 (3R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Crist—

Imposition of Death Sentence; provides that only criminals who were 18 years of age or older at time crime was committed may be sentenced to death; amends certain provision to conform. Creates 921.1415; amends 775.082. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on March 6, 2002

SB 140 (3R) by Senator Burt—

Public Records/Criminal Use; provides that it is misdemeanor of first degree to use public record, or information obtained from public record, to facilitate commission of misdemeanor of first degree; provides that it is felony of third degree to use public record, or information obtained from public record, to facilitate commission of felony; amends provision re offense severity ranking chart of Criminal Punishment Code, etc. Creates 817.569; amends 921.0022. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read the second time on March 6, 2002

SB 1636 (3R) by Senator Crist—

Prisoner Defined/Corrections Code; redefines term "prisoner" for purposes of state corrections code. Amends 944.02. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read the second time and amended on March 6, 2002

SB 1832 (3R) by Senator Peaden—

Powered Shopping Carts/Negligence; provides that specified assistive technology devices shall not be considered dangerous instrumentalities; defines "powered shopping cart". Creates 768.093. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on March 6, 2002

SB 932 (3R) by Senator Burt—

Vehicles/Intersections; clarifies provisions governing vehicles approaching or entering intersections. Amends 316.121. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read the second time and amended on March 6, 2002

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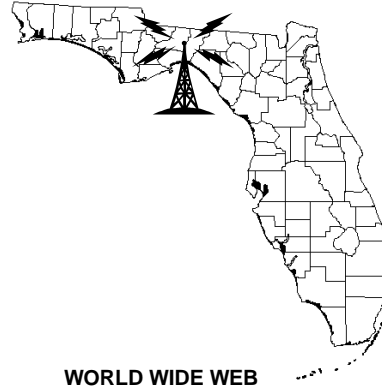
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
