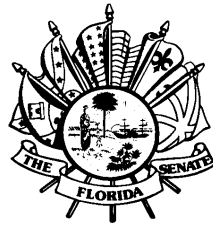

Hospice License Plate; creates said license plate; provides for distribution of annual use fees received from sale of such plates. Amends 320.08056, .08058. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

CS/SB 1210 (2R) by the Committee on Military and Veterans' Affairs, Base Protection, and Spaceports and Senator Fasano—

Tourism; increases membership of Fla. CS/SB 2310 (2R) by the Committee on Health, Aging, and Long-Term Care and Senator Crist—

On-Line Pharmacy; requires on-line pharmacy to have written prescription from practitioner licensed by this state before selling or dispensing controlled substance to person residing in this state; provides for facsimile transmission & verification of such prescription; requires on-line pharmacies to obtain permit to operate under certain part of Florida Drug & Cosmetic Act, etc. Creates 465.0158; amends 499.01,.081. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

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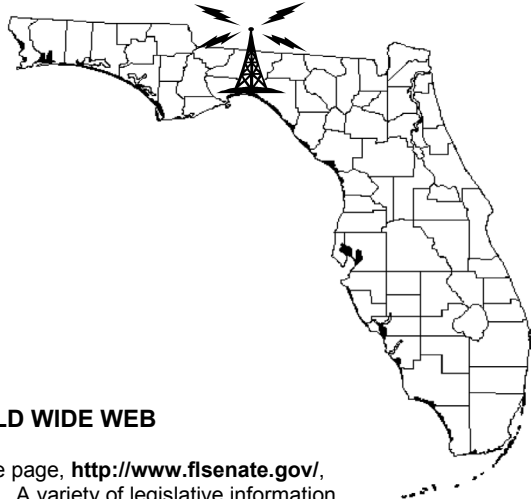
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
