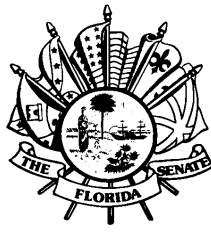

CS/SB 114 (2R) by the Committee on Ethics and Elections, Senator Constantine and others—

Advertising Campaign Exposure Act; cites as "Florida Advertising Campaign Exposure Act"; redefines term "communications media"; extends time for unopposed candidates to purchase "thank you" advertising; extends date for unopposed candidates to file termination report, to conform; modifies reporting requirements for miscellaneous advertisements intended to influence public policy; prescribes prohibitions, exemptions & penalties, etc. Amends 106.011, .11, .141, .1437. Effective Date: 01/01/2004.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Ethics and Elections

CS/SB 160 (2R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Wise and others—

Controlled Substances; specifies that for purposes of certain industrial uses, 1,4-Butanediol & gamma-butyrolactone (GBL) are excepted from schedule of controlled substances when in possession of authorized manufacturer or distributor or person possessing finished product; clarifies hours during which it is unlawful to sell, manufacture, deliver, or possess controlled substance within specified distance of child care facility or specified schools, etc. Amends Ch. 893. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

CS/SB 192 (2R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity and Senator Lynn—

Library Records/Confidentiality; revises provisions re confidentiality of public library registration & circulation records to authorize disclosure of information to parent or guardian of library patron under age 16, for purpose of collecting fines or recovering overdue books or other materials. Amends 257.261. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity

CS/SB 198 (2R) by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning and Senator Miller—

Adult Entertainment Establishments; revises prohibition against locating adult entertainment establishment within specified distance from school; requires that such establishment be approved by county or municipality & district school board. Amends 847.0134. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning and the Committee on Education reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 242 (2R) by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Saunders—

License Revocation/HSMV; requires law enforcement agencies to notify HSMV of any traffic fatality or commission of offense that requires mandatory revocation of license upon conviction. Amends 322.27. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and the Committee on Criminal Justice reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 258 (2R) by Senator Geller—

Local Govt/Expenses/Electronic Pymt.; authorizes local governments to pay certain expenses by means of electronic funds transfer. Amends 215.85. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning and reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance

CS/SB 260 (2R) by the Committee on Military and Veterans' Affairs, Base Protection, and Spaceports and Senator Fasano—

Condominiums/Armed Services Flags; allows unit owners to fly armed services flags on designated days & patriotic holidays. Amends 718.113. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Military and Veterans' Affairs, Base Protection, and Spaceports

CS/SB 460 (2R) by the Committee on Health, Aging, and Long-Term Care, Senator Pruitt and others—

Certificate-of-Need/Heart Surgery; provides exemption from certificate-of-need requirements for certain open-heart-surgery programs; provides criteria for qualifying for exemption; requires AHCA to report to Legislature; provides for expiration of exemption. Amends 408.036. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health, Aging, and Long-Term Care, and withdrawn from the Committees on Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services, and Appropriations

CS/SB 472 (2R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, Senator Smith and others—

Mining Activities; redefines term "construction materials mining activities"; provides that Administrative Hearings Div. has exclusive jurisdiction over certain claims for damages re use of explosives in connection with construction materials mining activities; provides for filing fees except in cases of indigence; designates trust fund for deposit of filing fees; provides procedures for mediation & for formal hearings, etc. Amends 552.30; creates 552.32-.44. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance

SB 482 (2R) by Senator Lynn and others—

Termination of Rental Agreements; removes provisions requiring payment of liquidated damages to landlord under certain circumstances upon termination of rental agreement by members of United States Armed Forces. Amends 83.682. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Military and Veterans' Affairs, Base Protection, and Spaceports, and reported favorably, with two amendments, by the Committee on Judiciary

SB 524 (2R) by Senator Campbell—

Rules of Evidence; specifies circumstances in which claims of error re evidence admitted or excluded at trial are preserved for appeal; provides for circumstances in which evidence accompanied by certification or declaration made by records custodian or another qualified person does not require extrinsic evidence of authenticity as condition precedent to admissibility, etc. Amends 90.104,.803,.902. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity

SB 530 (2R) by Senator Smith—

Nick Oelrich Gift of Life Act; creates said act; amends provision re anatomical gifts to prohibit modification of donor's intent; provides that donor document is legally binding; authorizes specified persons to furnish donor's medical records upon request; revises procedures by which terms of anatomical gift may be amended or gift may be revoked. Amends 765.512,.516. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Health, Aging, and Long-Term Care, and reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary

CS/SB 570 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Fasano—

U.S. Armed Forces/Rights of Members; requires insurer to refund entire unearned premium of motor vehicle insurance to any member of United States Armed Forces who cancels policy under certain circumstances. Amends 627.7283. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Military and Veterans' Affairs, Base Protection, and Spaceports, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary

SB 634 (2R) by Senator Argenziano and others—

Big Bend Historic Paddling Trail; extends Big Bend Historic Saltwater Paddling Trail from Suwannee River to Yankeetown. Amends 260.016. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Natural Resources

SB 662 (2R) by Senator Bennett—

Water & Wastewater System/Rates; authorizes Fla. Public Service Commission to approve rates allowing utilities to recover full costs of alternative water supply facilities; increases limitation on gross annual revenues under which water or wastewater utility may qualify to obtain staff assistance from said commission in changing rates & charges. Amends 367.081,.0814. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Communication and Public Utilities

SB 1046 (2R) by Senator Villalobos—

Operation of Motorcycles/Firefighter; provides that certain prohibitions concerning operation of motorcycles do not apply to firefighters in performance of their official duties. Amends 316.209. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation

SB 1488 (2R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and others—

Governmental Reorganization; revises various statutory provisions re Cabinet & members of Cabinet, which provisions were affected by amendment of Article IV, Section 4 of State Constitution; provides that, in tie vote of Governor & Cabinet, the side on which Governor voted will be considered prevailing side in absence of contrary statutory intent; provides for selection of members of Fla. Commission on the Status of Women, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, and withdrawn from the Committee on Comprehensive Planning

SB 1568 (2R) by Senator Jones—

Acute Care Hospitals; provides for certain acute care hospitals in high growth counties to add additional beds, without approval of AHCA; provides for notice. Amends 408.043. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Health, Aging, and Long-Term Care

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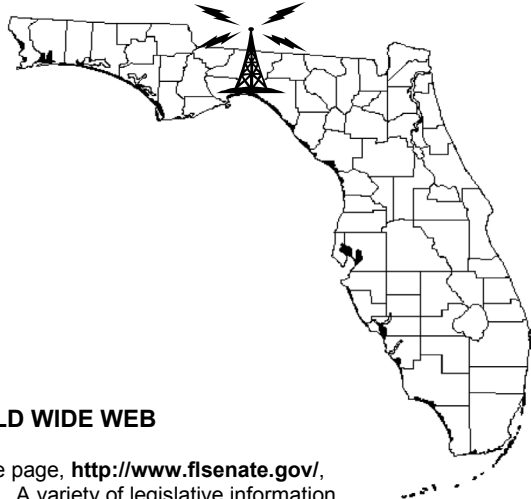
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
