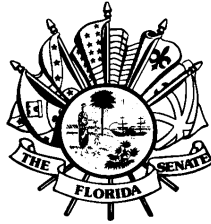

BILLS ON THE CALENDAR

SPECIAL ORDER CALENDAR AS DETERMINED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES AND CALENDAR FOR WEDNESDAY, MARCH 26, 2003

SB 1488 (SO) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and others—

Governmental Reorganization; revises various statutory provisions re Cabinet & members of Cabinet, which provisions were affected by amendment of Article IV, Section 4 of State Constitution; provides that, in tie vote of Governor & Cabinet, the side on which Governor voted will be considered prevailing side in absence of contrary statutory intent; provides for selection of members of Fla. Commission on the Status of Women, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

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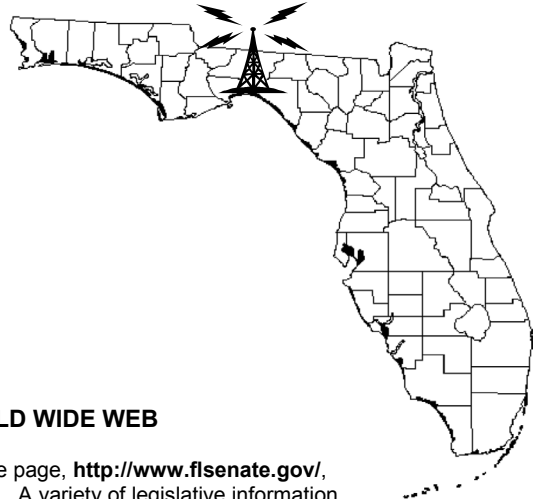
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
