HB 1051 (3R) by Representative Goodlette and others—

Lieutenant Governor/Vacancy; provides for filling of vacancy in office of Lieutenant Governor. Amends 14.055. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for **SB 2318 (SUB)** (Lee) and read the second time on April 25, 2003

HB 739 (3R) by Representative Kottkamp and others—

Governor Succession; revises provisions re succession to office of Governor; reenacts certain provision re succession as Acting Governor, to provide for same amendments to succession in office as provided for succession to office of Governor. Amends 14.055; reenacts 14.056. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for **SB 2318 (SUB)** (Lee), read the second time and amended on April 25, 2003

CS/SB 2260 (3R) by the Committee on Natural Resources and Senator Dockery—

Water Policy; deletes provision requiring legislative approval to abolish or combine basins existing within SWFWMD; redefines term "interdistrict transfer & use"; revises legislative intent re Surface Water Improvement & Management Act; revises criteria to be applied in determining priority of water bodies under surface water improvement & management plans & programs, etc. Amends Chs. 373, 259.101, 403.067, 1835, 1837. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on May 1, 2003

HB 221 (3R) by Representative Dean and others—

Citrus/Hernando Water Management; creates Citrus/Hernando Waterways Restoration Council; provides for membership, powers, & duties; provides for separate county task forces; provides for report to Legislature; provides for advisory group to council; requires Southwest Fla. Water Management Dist. to act as lead entity for purpose of providing staff & administrative support for council; provides for Citrus/Hernando Waterways restoration program. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for **SB 430 (SUB)** (Argenziano) and read the second time on May 1, 2003

CS/CS/SB 574 (3R) by the Committees on Comprehensive Planning, Regulated Industries and Senator Constantine—

Fla. Building Code; provides requirements re regional emergency elevator access; includes hospice facilities in Florida Building Code; authorizes counties & municipalities to impose certain fees & fines; deletes requirements to adopt physical plant standards for hospice; requires life-cycle, cost-analysis in selection of public school facilities, etc. Amends 399.106,.13, 633.171, 553.73, 400.605, 1013.45; creates 400.6055. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Read the second time and amended on May 1, 2003

CS/SB 2362 (3R) by the Committee on Commerce, Economic Opportunities, and Consumer Services, Senator Klein and others—

Florida Business Corporations Act; clarifies document execution provision re filing requirement, agent statement of resignation fee provision, & effective time & date of document provision; clarifies shareholder's preemptive rights provisions re certain securities; provides for shareholders' rights to appraisals, &limiting or eliminating appraisal rights under certain circumstances; prohibits certain corporate action challenges under certain circumstances, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 10/01/2003.

Read the second time and amended on May 1, 2003

HB 1035 (3R) by the Committee on State Administration and others—

Workers' Compensation/Pub. Rec.; provides exception to exemption for investigatory records re workers' compensation employer compliance; adds conforming & clarifying language; removes October 2, 2003, repeal thereof scheduled under OGSR Act of 1995. Amends 440.108. Effective Date: 10/01/2003.

Substituted for **CS/SB 284 (SUB)** (Posey) and read the second time on May 1, 2003

CS/SB 2688 (3R) by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning and Senator Jones—

Coastal Redevelopmental Project; defines term "local hazard mitigation strategy"; provides additional requirement in comprehensive plan concerning hazard mitigation; provides presumptions re whether extension of date of buildout or phase in areawide development plan constitutes substantial deviation; provides local planning authority for certain municipalities in certain charter counties, etc. Amends Ch. 163, 186.515, 288.975, 369.303, 380.06. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on May 1, 2003

Similar to HB 435 (HC) in Messages

HB 439 (3R) by Representative Rich and others-

Statewide Guardians Ad Litem Office; provides legislative intent; creates said office within Justice Administrative Commission; provides for appointment of executive director; provides for duties; provides oversight responsibility for local guardian ad litem & attorney ad litem programs; provides for transfer of attorney ad litem pilot program & funds & positions associated with Guardian Ad Litem Program to said office. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Substituted for **CS/SB 1974 (SUB)** (Campbell) and read the second time on May 1, 2003

SB 2586 (3R) by Senator Dockery and others—

Fish & Wildlife Conservation Comm.; deletes requirement that Fish & Wildlife Commission solicit advisory recommendations from Save the Manatee Committee: creates Boating & Waterways Office within commission & provides powers & duties of office; provides for transfer of moneys from Fuel Tax Collection Trust Fund to Marine Resources Conservation Trust Fund; provides for uses of funds transferred from Fuel Tax Collection TF, etc. Amends 20.331, 206.606, 370.0603,.12; creates 327.47. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Read the second time and amended on May 1, 2003

CS/SB 2566 (3R) by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning and Senator Atwater—

Local Government Accountability; revises duties of Legislative Auditing Committee & reporting requirements of Auditor General; provides for additional information to be provided to DMS in actuarial reports re retirement systems & plans & provides procedures therefor; exempts candidate from campaign requirements under specified conditions; revises provisions re authorization to issue refund bonds; provides that school districts must sell bonds, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on May 1, 2003

CS/CS/SB 2464 (3R) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, Regulated Industries and Senator Clary—

Engineering; revises examination requirements; revises terminology re legal entities involved in offering engineering services; revises terminology re legal entities involved in offering engineering services; provides for imposition of restitution as penalty for disciplinary violations; deletes certain management powers & duties of DBPR over Florida Engineers Management Corporation, etc. Amends 471.013,.015,.023,.033,.038. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Read the second time and amended on May 1, 2003

CS/SB 1578 (3R) by the Committee on Ethics and Elections, Senator Cowin and others—

Commission on Ethics/Lobbying/Member; restricts lobbying activities of members of said commission; provides exceptions. Amends 112.321. Effective Date: 10/01/2003.

Read the second time and amended on May 1, 2003

CS/SB 2758 (3R) by the Committee on Natural Resources and Senator Dockery—

Water Resources; requires local governments to include projected water use in comprehensive plans; provides for recovery of costs of alternative water supply facilities; revises limit on amount of revenue received by utility to qualify for staff assistance in changing rates or charges; provides for public workshop in development of regional water supply plans; includes consideration of population projections, etc. Amends Chs. 163, 367, 373, 403. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Read the second time on May 1, 2003

CS/SB 2492 (3R) by the Committee on Commerce, Economic Opportunities, and Consumer Services and Senator Garcia—

Economic Development; revises & clarifies powers of Enterprise Fla., Inc., to develop authorized technology development programs; establishes Florida Institute for Human & Machine Cognition, Inc., at University of West Fla. as not-for-profit corporation; provides that certain persons are exempt from prohibitions of section, re engineering law, under specified circumstances, etc. Amends Chs. 220, 288, 376, 445, 471, 1004. Effective Date: 07/01/2003 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on May 1, 2003

CS/SB 676 (3R) by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Sebesta—

Transportation; deletes reference to obsolete federal safety standard; provides for certain airports to abandon development-of-regional impact orders; provides for issuing citations for toll violations by first class mail; revises porivisons for exemption from specified notification requirements for commercial motor vehicles carrying hazardous materials; revises provisions for airport site approval & airport licensing, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on May 1, 2003

CS/SB 1956 (3R) by the Committee on Appropriations, Senator Constantine and others—

Growth Management; changes title to "Wekiva River Basin & Springs Protection & Planning Act"; creates integrated planning area for Wekiva River Basin; provides for rulemaking authority for St. Johns River Water Management District re springshed protection as it relates to implementing provisions of this act; provides legislative findings re loss of property values due to proximity of regional water reservoir, etc. Amends Chs. 369, 373, 163, 381. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Read the second time and amended on May 1, 2003

CS/SB 2460 (3R) by the Committee on Children and Families and Senator Campbell—

Independent Living Transition Svcs.; requires each ditrict of CFS Dept. to identify adolescent foster children with developmental disabilities or special mental health needs; requires program to provide former foster youth having disabilities with activities to learn life skills; revises eligibility requirements for participation in Road-to-Independence Scholarship Program & transitional support services, etc. Amends 409.1451. Effective Date: 10/01/2003.

Read the second time and amended on May 1, 2003

CS/SB 2186 (3R) by the Committee on Health, Aging, and Long-Term Care, Senator Argenziano and others—

Indigent Care Surtax/Small Counties; allows small counties having specified population to levy indigent care surtax; provides procedures; provides uses of surtax; provides maximum tax rate. Amends 212.055. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on May 1, 2003

CS/CS/SB 2654 (3R) by the Committees on Finance and Taxation, Transportation, Senator Hill and others—

Family First License Plate; creates Family First license plate; provides for distribution of annual use fees received from sale of such plates. Amends 320.08056,.08058. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Read the second time on May 1, 2003

CS/SB 2754 (3R) by the Committee on Natural Resources and Senator Dockery—

State Lands; revises requirements for appraisals when acquiring state lands; provides conditions under which state-owned lands may be considered nonconservation lands; revises requirements for land management plans for conservation lands be submitted to State Lands Div.; provides conditions under which certain lands may be made available for purchase under State's land surplusing process, etc. Amends Chs. 253, 259, 260, 373. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Read the second time and amended on May 1, 2003

SB 1538 (3R) by Senator Miller-

Public Student Asst. Grant Program; amends criteria for receiving grant from Florida Public Student Assistance Grant Program; amends criteria for determining minimum & maximum amounts that may be awarded. Amends 1009.50. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Read the second time and amended on May 1, 2003

HB 525 (3R) by Representative Gardiner and others—

Chamber of Commerce; provides definitions; prohibits certain business entities from using term "chamber of commerce" under certain circumstances; provides exceptions; provides penalty; specifies nonimposition of certain requirements; authorizes chambers of commerce to sue certain business entities to enjoin use of certain terms. Creates 501.972. Effective Date: 10/01/2003.

Substituted for **SB 1832 (SUB)** (Bennett) and read the second time on May 1, 2003

CS/SB 1522 (3R) by the Committee on Education and Senator Constantine—

Student's Education/Parent & Family; creates Family & School Partnership for Student Achievement Act; requires support for implementation by school district & school personnel; requires DOE to develop guidelines for parent guide to assist parents; provides additional notification requirements to parents of students with substantial reading deficiencies; amends provisions re incentives & bonuses under Dale Hickam Excellent Teaching Program, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Read the second time on May 1, 2003

CS/CS/SB 2266 (3R) by the Committees on Comprehensive Planning, Commerce, Economic Opportunities, and Consumer Services, Senator Siplin and others—

Sales Tax/Convention Centers; provides for distribution of portion of revenues from tax on sales, use, & other transactions to specified units of local government owning eligible convention centers; provides for certification of units of local government owning eligible convention centers by Tourism, Trade, & Economic Development Office; provides for use of proceeds distributed to units of local government under act; provides for audits by DOR, etc. Amends 212.20; creates 288.1171. Effective Date: Contingent.

Read the second time and amended on May 1, 2003

CS/SB 1374 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity and Senator Peaden—

Administrative Procedures; eliminates Internet publication pilot project; defines terms; provides that notices required to be published in Fla. Administrative Weekly by DEP & Board of Trustees of Internal Improvement TF shall be published on Internet website; directs Dept. of State to publish statement in Fla. Administrative Weekly that indicates Internet website address; provides for future repeal of section, etc. Amends 120.551. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on May 1, 2003

HB 1019 (3R) by the Committee on State Administration and others—

Minor/Videotaped Statement/Pub. Rec.; amends specified provision re public records exemption for any information in videotaped statement of minor who is alleged to be or who is victim of sexual battery, lewd acts, or other sexual misconduct which reveals minor's identity; makes editorial changes; adds clarifying language; removes October 2, 2003, repeal thereof scheduled under OGSR Act of 1995. Amends 119.07. Effective Date: 10/01/2003.

Substituted for **SB 1026 (SUB)** (Villalobos) and read the second time on May 1, 2003

CS/CS/SB 2264 (3R) by the Committees on Health, Aging, and Long-Term Care, Banking and Insurance and Senator Atwater—

Health Insurance; revises grounds for disapproval of health insurance policy forms; requires health under certain circumstances; amends specified provision re unfair discrimination; authorizes Insurance Regulation Office to adopt rules; specifies nonapplication of certain group health maintenance contract filing requirements to certain group health insurance policies; provides exceptions, etc. Amends 627.411.6515, 626.9541, 641.31. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Read the second time and amended on May 1, 2003

HB 1833 (3R) by the Committee on Transportation and others—

Secure Airports for Florida Act; creates "Secure Airports for Florida's Economy Act" or "SAFE Act"; creates SAFE Council to recommend transportation facility projects to Legislature; provides for master plan of goals & objectives & specific project recommendations; provides for project review by DOT, DCA, & Tourism, Trade, & Economic Development Office; provides for joint participation agreements to be executed by airport & DOT for projects, etc. Creates 332.14. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 2578 (SUB)** (Sebesta) and read the second time on May 1, 2003

CS/CS/SB 326 (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Regulated Industries , Senator Smith and others—

Alcoholic Beverage/Underage Employee; prohibits person licensed under Beverage Law, or agent, officer, or employee of such person, from providing alcoholic beverages to underage employee; prohibits licensee from permitting underage employee from consuming alcoholic beverages on licensed premises; reenacts specified provision re records of arrests of vendors or employees for certain violations of Beverage Law, to incorporate amendment, etc. Amends 562.11, 561.19; reenacts 561.706(3). Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Read the second time on May 1, 2003

HB 1591 (3R) by the Committee on State Administration and others—

State Employees/Pub. Rec.; narrows exemption for records re employee's participation in employee assistance program to provide that employee's personal identifying information contained in employee assistance program records is confidential &exempt; makes editorial changes; removes October 2, 2003, repeal therof scheduled pursuant to OGSR Act of 1995. Amends 110.1091. Effective Date: 10/01/2003.

Substituted for **SB 288 (SUB)** (Wise) and read the second time on May 1, 2003

SB 270 (3R) by Senator Dawson—

L. E. Buie Bridge/Riviera Beach; designates Skypass Bridge in City of Riviera Beach as "L. E. Buie Bridge"; directs DOT to erect suitable markers. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on May 1, 2003

HB 1883 (3R) by the Committee on Finance & Tax and others—

Financial Impact Statements; requires Secretary of State to submit certain proposed constitutional amendments to Financial Impact Estimating Conference; revises time period for Attorney General to petition Supreme Court for review of certain financial impact statements; creates said conference; provides duties of Dept. of State re printing & provides copies of initiative financial information statement, etc. Amends Ch. 100, 15.21, 16.061, 101.161, 216.136. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for **SB 1322 (SUB)** (Cowin), read the second time and amended on May 1, 2003

HB 1021 (3R) by the Committee on State Administration and others—

Housing Assistance Program/Pub. Rec.; narrows public records exemption for certain information re applicant for federal, state, or local housing assistance programs; removes exemption for bank account numbers, credit card numbers, & telephone numbers of applicants & participants in such programs; adds clarifying language; makes editorial changes; removes superfluous language; removes 10/02/2003, repeal thereof scheduled pursuant to OGSR Act of 1995. Amends 119.07. Effective Date: 10/01/2003.

Substituted for **CS/SB 290 (SUB)** (Wise), read the second time and amended on May 1, 2003

SB 2284 (3R) by Senator Bennett—

Insurance; redefines term "employer"; provides that certain businesses may form group for purposes of workers' compensation; prohibits contractor or subcontractor from withholding payment to certain subcontractors, sub-subcontractors, or materialmen under certain insurance policies under certain circumstances; provides conditions, etc. Amends 440.02, 725.06. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on May 1, 2003

CS/SB 2316 (SO) by the Committee on Communication and Public Utilities and Senator Atwater—

Water Supplies; provides for development of water conservation guidance manual by DEP; provides for purpose & contents of manual & requirements with respect thereto; requires DEP to adopt manual by rule by specified date; requires public water supply utilities to develop water conservation programs based upon options contained in manual; authorizes DEP to grant variances from mining reclamation activities, etc. Amends Chs. 373, 403, 378.212,.404. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Natural Resources and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Communication and Public Utilities, and withdrawn from the Committees on Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government and Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 1020 (SO) by the Committees on Judiciary, Criminal Justice and Senator Campbell—

Court Procedures; amends certain provisions re various court procedures & various admin. & judicial proceedings; provides that any judge setting or granting bail shall set separate bail amount for each charge or offense; provides for standard conditions of pretrial release without trial judge stating such conditions on record; provides that judge at first appearance may not reduce bail set by another judge issuing arrest warrant, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2003 and with pending amendment # 5 (760104) by Senator Lawson

CS/CS/SB 1770 (SO) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, Education and Senator Clary—

Human & Machine Cognition/Pub. Rec.; creates exemption from public records requirements for specified materials, actual & potential trade secrets, information identifying donors to Fla. Institute of Human & Machine Cognition; provides for specified access to certain information by governmental entities; creates exemption from public meetings requirements for meetings of governing board of not-for-profit corporation at which exempt records are discussed, etc. Effective Date: Contingent.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, and withdrawn from the Committees on Judiciary, Appropriations Subcommittee on Education, Appropriations, and Rules and Calendar

Similar to HB 491 (HC) in Messages

CS/SB 2054 (SO) by the Committee on Children and Families, Senator Lynn and others—

Community-based Care; deletes requirement for contracts for legal services in certain counties; deletes requirement for plan; requires Governor's approval of dept.'s methodology for transferring funds; modifies schedule by which community-based care will be implemented; changes eligibility requirements for participation in community partnership matching grant program, etc. Amends 409.1671,.16745,.175. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Withdrawn from the Committee on Comprehensive Planning and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children and Families, and withdrawn from the Committees on Judiciary, Banking and Insurance, Governmental Oversight and Productivity, Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services, and Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 572 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Health, Aging, and Long-Term Care and Senator Fasano—

Dental Licensure Examinations; allows certain dental students to take examination required for practicing dentistry in this state; allows certain dental students to take regional licensure examinations under specified conditions; restricts applicability of examination results; requires approval by Board of Dentistry & provides prerequisites to such approval; authorizes position.

Amends 466.006; creates 466.0065. Effective Date: 07/01/2003.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health, Aging, and Long-Term Care, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services, and withdrawn from the Committee on Appropriations with subcommittee recommendation

CS/SB 2560 (SO) by the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator Diaz de la Portilla—

Professions/Occupations/Regulation; repeals specified provisions re regulation of talent agencies; provides for DBPR to continue outstanding legal proceedings. Repeals 468.401-.415. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries and withdrawn from the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government, and Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 700 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Children and Families, Senator Lynn and others—

Children & Family Services Dept.; creates Fla. Substance Abuse & Mental Health Board, Inc., which shall be administratively housed within CFS Dept.; directs other agencies to cooperate in development of evaluation & report; authorizes CFS Dept. to adopt by rule new payment methodologies & to eliminate unit-based methodologies for mental health & substance abuse services; establishes data system requirements, etc. Amends Ch. 394, 20.19, 409.912. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children and Families, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services, and withdrawn from the Committee on Appropriations with subcommittee recommendation and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules and Calendar

SB 2794 (SO) by Senator Pruitt—

Wildflower Trust Fund; creates Wildflower Trust Fund; provides for sources of funds & purposes; provides for annual carryforward of funds; provides for future review & termination or re-creation of trust fund. Effective Date: Contingent.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations Subcommittee on Transportation and Economic Development, and withdrawn from the Committee on Appropriations with subcommittee recommendation

CS/SB 1176 (SO) by the Committee on Finance and Taxation and Senator Campbell—


