CS/SJR 2392 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary, Senators Atwater and Smith—

Amendment or Revision/Voting; constitutional amendment to require that, effective for any proposed constitutional amendment or revision filed with Secretary of State after 12 p.m. on July 16, 2004, amendment or revision must be approved by at least three-fifths of electors of state voting on measure rather than by simple majority. Amends s. 5, Art. XI; creates s. 26, Art XII.

SB 2398 (3R) by Senators Atwater and Smith—

Special Election; provides for special election to be held on August 31, 2004, pursuant to Section 5, Article XI of State Constitution, for approval or rejection by electors of Florida of joint resolution amending Section 5, Article XI of State Constitution, re requirements for enacting proposed amendment to or revision of State Constitution; provides for publication of notice & for procedures. Effective Date: Upon becoming law if enacted by 3/4 vote of membership of each house of Legislature.

Read the second time and amended on March 31, 2004

SJR 2394 (3R) by Senators Atwater and Smith—

Deadline for Filing/Initiatives; constitutional amendment to require sponsor of constitutional amendment proposed by citizen initiative to file initiative petition with Secretary of State by February 1 of year of general election in order to have measure submitted to electors for approval or rejection at following November's gen. elec., & to require Fla. Supreme Court to render advisory opinion addressing validity of initiative petition, etc. Amends s. 10, Art. IV, s. 5, Art. XI.

Read the second time and amended on March 31, 2004

SB 2400 (3R) by Senators Atwater and Smith—

Special Election; provides for special election to be held on August 31, 2004, pursuant to Section 5, Article XI of State Constitution, for approval or rejection by electors of Florida of joint resolution amending Section 5, Article XI of State Constitution, re deadlines for filing initiative petitions & judicial determinations of validity; provides for publication of notice & for procedures. Effective Date: Upon becoming law if enacted by 3/4 vote of membership of each house of Legislature.

Read the second time and amended on March 31, 2004

CS/SJR 2396 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary, Senators Atwater and Smith—

Citizen Initiatives; constitutional amendment to provide that constitutional amendment or revision proposed by citizen initiative must alter, amend, or repeal existing article or amendment to State Constitution, address basic right of citizen of this state, or change basic structure of state government as established in Article II, III, IV, or V. Amends s. 3, Art. XI.

Read the second time on March 31, 2004

SB 2402 (3R) by Senators Atwater and Smith—

Special Election; provides for special election to be held on August 31, 2004, pursuant to Section 5, Article XI of State Constitution, for approval or rejection by electors of Florida of joint resolution amending Section 5, Article XI of State Constitution, re scope of constitutional amendments or revisions that may be proposed by citizen initiative; provides for publication of notice & for procedures. Effective Date: Upon becoming law if enacted by 3/4 vote of membership of each house of Legislature.

Read the second time and amended on March 31, 2004

HB 329 (3R) by Representative Harrell and others—

Open-Heart-Surgery/Cert.-of-Need; revises exemption from certificate-of-need requirements for certain open-heart-surgery programs to apply exemption to any hospital located within specified health service planning district or specified acute care subdistrict; provides criteria for qualifying for exemption; requires AHCA to report to Legislature re number of such exemptions requested & number granted or denied each year. Amends 408.036. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 2606 (SUB)** (Pruitt), read the second time and amended on March 31, 2004*

CS/CS/CS/SB 1190 (3R) by the Committees on Criminal Justice, Comprehensive Planning, Banking and Insurance, Senator Constantine and others—

Fire Prevention & Control; creates Fire & Emergency Incident Information Program in State Fire Marshal Div. of Financial Svcs. Dept.; establishes penalties for unauthorized use of fireworks or pyrotechnic devices in indoor facility; provides that State Fire Marshal Div. may adopt additional national fire standards to ensure safe working conditions for firefighters; requires each live-fire-training instructor to be state-certified by January 1, 2006, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on March 31, 2004

CS/CS/SB 532 (3R) by the Committees on Comprehensive Planning, Health, Aging, and Long-Term Care, Senator Crist and others—

Good Samaritan Act; includes certain persons who participate in emergency response activities under direction of or in connection with community emergency response team, local emergency management agency, Emergency Management Div. of DCA, or Federal Emergency Management Agency within act for purposes of immunity from civil liability under certain circumstances. Amends 768.13. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on March 31, 2004

HB 1335 (3R) by Representative Galvano—

Vehicle Emergency Lights/Wreckers; requires wreckers to display amber rotating or flashing lights in certain situations; requires drivers who are approaching wrecker performing recovery or loading on roadside to take certain precautions. Amends 316.2397,.126. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

*Substituted for **CS/SB 402 (SUB)** (Carlton) and read the second time on March 31, 2004*

HB 415 (3R) by Representative Bowen—

Waterway Markers; provides for placement of certain markers on waterways by specified governmental entities; provides exemption re appearance of said markers; provides that placement of specified markers on state submerged lands does not subject such lands to certain lease requirements. Amends 327.40. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 1404 (SUB)** (Alexander), read the second time and amended on March 31, 2004*

HB 1009 (3R) by Representative Hasner and others—

Prohibited Landlord Practices/Flags; prohibits landlords from prohibiting tenants from displaying certain United States flags regardless of certain rental agreement provisions; relieves landlords of liability for any damages caused by displaying flags; prohibits tenants from displaying flags in manner that infringes upon other tenants' property. Amends 83.67. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Substituted for **CS/SB 1682 (SUB)** (Geller) and read the second time on March 31, 2004*

CS/CS/SB 1232 (3R) by the Committees on Education, Children and Families, Senator Atwater and others—

Abused & Neglected Children/Educ.; creates provision re education of abused, neglected, & abandoned children; requires agreement between CFS Dept. & DOE; requires agreements between CFS Dept. & district school boards or other local educational entities; specifies provisions of such agreements; amends provision re access to student records; authorizes release of records to CFS Dept. or community-based care lead agency, etc. Creates 39.0016; amends 1002.22. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Read the second time on March 31, 2004

CS/SB 1818 (3R) by the Committee on Home Defense, Public Security, and Ports (Dockery)—

Trauma Regions; requires that boundaries of trauma regions administered by DOH be coterminous with boundaries of regional domestic security task forces established within FDLE; authorizes continuation of trauma services by certain agencies in accordance with established agreements & procedures; provides requirements for regional trauma system plan when trauma service area is located within boundaries of more than one trauma region. Amends 395.4015,.402. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Read the second time on March 31, 2004

HB 1183 (3R) by Representative Green and others—

Unemployment Comp./Military Spouses; provides eligibility for unemployment compensation benefits for spouses of member of military under certain circumstances beginning on date certain. Amends 443.101. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for SB 1606 (SUB) (Fasano) and read the second time on March 31, 2004

HB 529 (3R) by Representative Negron and others—

Deeds or Conveyances of Real Estate; revises criteria for granting certain estates, transferring & assigning certain interests, & vesting certain rights in certain deeds or conveyances of real estate; provides legislative intent; provides for retroactive application. Amends 689.07. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for SB 1986 (SUB) (Aronberg) and read the second time on March 31, 2004

CS/SB 2304 (3R) by the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator Haridopolos—

Construction Contracting; requires Architecture & Interior Design Board and Landscape Architecture Board to prescribe, by rule, one or more forms of seals for use by registered architect or interior designer & registered landscape architect who holds valid certificate of registration; deletes authority for certain certification without examination; provides additional requirements for pollutant storage systems specialty contractors, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Read the second time and amended on March 31, 2004

CS/SB 1392 (3R) by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning (Geller)—

Community Development Districts; provides for enforcement of deed restrictions in certain circumstances; provides for additional dissolution procedures; specifies procedures for selecting chair at initial landowners' meeting; requires notice of landowners' elections; authorizes supervisor of elections to designate seat numbers for resident supervisors of board; allows candidates option of paying filing fee to qualify for election, etc. Amends 190.012,.046,.006. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on March 31, 2004

CS/SB 2280 (3R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, Senator Atwater and others—

Annuity Investments by Seniors; provides purpose & definitions; specifies duties of insurers & insurance agents re making annuity investment recommendations to senior consumers; limits responsibility of insurers or insurance agents under certain circumstances; provides for enforcement by Insurance Regulation Office & Financial Services Dept.; provides exemption from application for variable annuities, etc. Creates 627.4554. Effective Date: 02/01/2005.

Read the second time on March 31, 2004

SB 1430 (3R) by Senator Crist—

Law Enforcement/Correctional Officer; authorizes advanced registered nurse practitioners to conduct required physical exams for law enforcement & correctional officers. Amends 943.13. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Read the second time on March 31, 2004

CS/SB 632 (3R) by the Committee on Appropriations and Senator Argenziano—

Jai Alai; redefines term "full schedule of live racing or games" for purposes of Pari-Mutuel Wagering chapter, to include jai alai permitholder that conducted certain number of live performances in specified time period; provides amount of license fees & taxes for jai alai permitholder that conducts fewer than 100 live performances in any fiscal year. Amends 550.002,.09511. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Read the second time and amended on March 31, 2004

CS/CS/SB 1160 (3R) by the Committee on Appropriations and the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity (Wise)—

Advisory Bodies & Commissions; provides legislative findings that it is in public interest to periodically review advisory bodies, commissions, boards, & other collegial bodies in executive branch; revises requirements for establishment & maintenance of executive collegial bodies; requires each executive agency to periodically report certain information & make recommendations to Executive Office of Governor concerning said bodies, etc. Amends 20.052. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Read the second time on March 31, 2004

SB 462 (3R) by the Committee on Health, Aging, and Long-Term Care (Saunders)—

Child Fatalities/Records/OGSR; (OPEN GOVERNMENT SUNSET REVIEW) saves exemptions which are provided for certain records & portions of meetings concerning child fatalities from repeal under OGSR Act; deletes exemption provided for certain records obtained by hospital or health care practitioner which relate to child fatalities; revises penalty applicable to unauthorized disclosure of confidential information concerning child fatalities, etc. Amends 383.410. Effective Date: 10/01/2004.

Read the second time on March 31, 2004

CS/CS/SB 1344 (3R) by the Committees on Regulated Industries, Health, Aging, and Long-Term Care and Senator Constantine—

Hospice Facilities/Fla. Bldg. Code; includes hospice facilities in Florida Building Code; deletes provisions requiring Elderly Affairs Dept. to adopt physical plant standards for hospice facilities; redefines term "hospice"; requires construction standards for hospice facilities to comply with said code; requires AHCA to provide technical assistance to Fla. Building Commission to update said code for hospice facilities. Amends 553.73, 400.601,.605; creates 400.6055. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Read the second time on March 31, 2004

CS/SB 280 (3R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Cowin and others—

Public Lodging Establishments; defines terms; prohibits distribution of handbills in public lodging establishment under certain circumstances; provides criminal penalties; provides requirements for posting sign that prohibits advertising or solicitation. Creates 509.144. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Read the second time on March 31, 2004

Road & Bridge Designations; designates Browning-Pearce Memorial Highway in St. Johns & Putnam Counties, Jerome A. Williams Memorial Highway in Putnam Co., James C. Futch Memorial Highway in Brevard & Osceola Counties; designates St. Johns River Bridge on I-4 at Seminole/Volusia County line as "St. Johns River Veterans Memorial Bridge"; directs DOT to erect suitable markers. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

CS/SB 552 (3R) by the Committee on Transportation, Senator Dawson and others—

L. E. Buie Bridge/Riviera Beach; designates Skypass Bridge in City of Riviera Beach as L. E. Buie Memorial Bridge; directs DOT to erect suitable markers. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on March 25, 2004

HB 33 (3R) by Representative Fiorentino and others—

Road Designations/Pasco/Putnam Cos.; designates Captain Charles "Bo" Harrison Memorial Highway in Pasco County; designates Jerome A. Williams Memorial Highway in Putnam County; directs DOT to erect suitable markers. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Substituted for **CS/SB 232 (SUB)** (Crist) and read the second time on March 25, 2004*

CS/SB 630 (3R) by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Argenziano—

Road & Bridge Designations; designates bridge located on I-75 at Lake Panasoffkee area exit in Sumter County as "Florida Veterans Memorial Bridge"; directs DOT to erect suitable markers; extends Fla. Arts Trail through Jefferson & Madison Counties; designates Arthur L. Andrews Bridge in Wakulla Co.; designates Forest Ranger Edward O. Peters Memorial Highway in Levy Co.; designates Skypass Bridge in City of Riviera Beach as "L. E. Buie Memorial Bridge". Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Regulatory Trust Fund; re-creates Regulatory Trust Fund within Financial Services Dept. without modification; carries forward current balances & continuing current sources & uses thereof. Effective Date: 11/04/2004.

Withdrawn from the Committee on Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations

SB 2650 (SO) by Senator Clary—

Lake Okeechobee Protection T.F.; creates Lake Okeechobee Protection Trust Fund within Agriculture & Consumer Services Dept; provides sources of funds & purposes; provides for annual carryforward of funds; provides for future review & termination or re-creation of trust fund. Creates 570.206. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Withdrawn from the Committee on Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations

SB 2500 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Pruitt)—

Appropriations; provides moneys for annual period beginning July 1, 2004, & ending June 30, 2005, to pay salaries, & other expenses, capital outlay - buildings, & other improvements, & for other specified purposes of various agencies of State government. Effective Date: 07/01/2004 or upon becoming law, whichever occurs later, except as otherwise provided.

Withdrawn from the Committee on Appropriations

SB 2502 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Pruitt)—

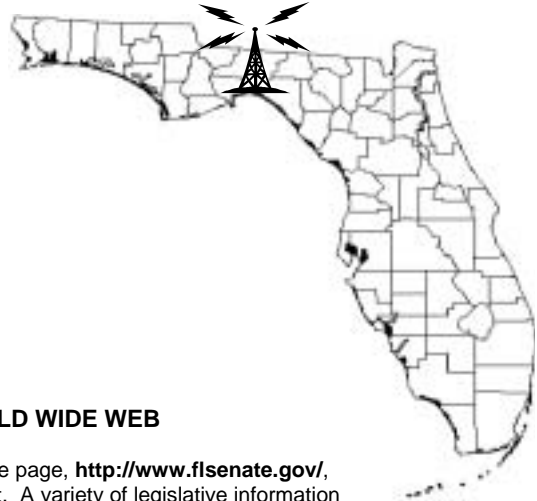
