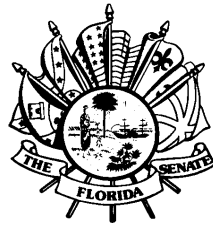

Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and the Committee on Criminal Justice reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 2566 (2R) by the Committee on Ethics and Elections and Senator Dockery—

Absentee Ballots; removes requirement that voter's signature on absentee ballot must be witnessed; revises Voter's Certificate & instructions to absent electors to remove requirement of attesting witness; removes requirement of signature of attesting witness for absentee ballot to be considered legal; amends provision re absentee ballots received from overseas voters, to conform, etc. Amends 101.64,.65,.68,.6921,.6923,.6952. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Ethics and Elections, and the Committee on Judiciary reports the committee substitute favorably, with one amendment

CS/SB 2576 (2R) by the Committee on Communication and Public Utilities , Senator Sebesta and others—

Highways/Roads/Utility Facility; provides that provisions governing circumstances under which road is deemed to be dedicated to public do not apply to public utility facility located on property otherwise subject to those provisions. Amends 95.361. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning

CS/SB 2646 (2R) by the Committee on Appropriations and Senator Webster—

Trust Funds/Terminations; terminates specified trust funds within Dept. of State, HSMV, & DCA; provides for disposition of balances in & revenues of TFs; abrogates provisions re termination of Welfare Transition TF within Workforce Innovation Agency; provides that certain contributions received in connection with driver's lic. application or motor vehicle registration are not income of revenue nature for purposes of service charge imposed on certain TFs, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations Subcommittee on Transportation and Economic Development, and withdrawn from the Committee on Appropriations with subcommittee recommendation

CS/SB 2694 (2R) by the Committee on Appropriations and Senator Pruitt—

Lake Okeechobee Protection Program; provides legislative findings & intent re implementation & funding of Lake Okeechobee Watershed Phosphorus Control Program & Lake Okeechobee Protection Program; provides for implementation & funding of Lake Okeechobee Protection Plan. Amends 373.4595. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Natural Resources and withdrawn from the Committee on Agriculture and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government and withdrawn from the Committee on Appropriations with subcommittee recommendation

SB 2714 (2R) by Senator Villalobos—

Radio Transmission; prohibits person from making radio transmission in this state unless person obtains license or exemption from licensure from Federal Communications Commission; prohibits unlicensed radio transmission that interferes with licensed public or commercial radio station; provides criminal penalties, etc. Creates 877.27; amends 16.56. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Communication and Public Utilities, and reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice

CS/SB 2720 (2R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity and Senator Atwater—

Public Accountancy; authorizes waiver of certain requirements in excess of baccalaureate degree for applicants for licensure as certified public accountant who meet certain prior employment criteria; requires completion of required continuing education in ethics prior to taking exam required for renewal of license; requires certain amount of continuing education to be in ethics; provides course requirements & requirements for course providers. Amends Ch. 473. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity

SB 2726 (2R) by Senator Smith—

Kermit Sigmon Trail/Gainesville; designates State Road 24 Trail from Newell Drive to Southwest 16th Avenue in Gainesville as "Kermit Sigmon Trail"; directs DOT to erect suitable markers. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation

CS/SB 2802 (2R) by the Committee on Natural Resources and Senator Dockery—

Permit Authority/Piers/Structures; prohibits DEP from delegating general permit authority to water management districts for construction, extension, or removal of piers or associated structures; reassigns to dept. authority to act on pending applications for permit; rescinds prior delegation of authority by dept. to districts. Amends 403.814. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Natural Resources

CS/CS/SB 2978 (2R) by the Committee on Appropriations, the Committee on Education and others—

Corporate Tax Credit Scholarship; prohibits certain private schools & other entities & certain students from participating in scholarship program; revises limitations on allocation of annual credits granted under program; requires Auditor General to review certain audits, request certain information, & report to Legislative Auditing Committee any findings of noncompliance; provides for Law Enforcement Dept. to retain & search fingerprint records, etc. Amends 220.187. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations Subcommittee on Education and withdrawn from the Committee on Appropriations with subcommittee recommendation

HB 1803 (2R) by the Committee on Health Care and others—

Women's Health Strategy; establishes Officer of Women's Health Strategy in Health Dept.; provides legislative intent; provides duties of said officer; requires annual report to Governor & Legislature with policy recommendations for implementing Women's Health Strategy; requires consideration of women's health issues & gender in state policy, planning, & budgeting; provides for responsibility & coordination. Amends 20.43; creates 381.04015. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

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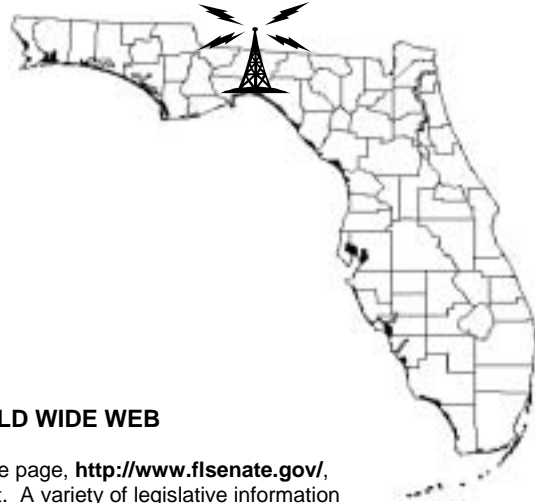
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
