Community College/Baccalaureate; redesignates specified community colleges to conform to changes made by act; provides requirements for board of trustees of community college authorized to grant baccalaureate degrees; requires that said board of each community college adopt policy ensuring that faculty who teach upper-division courses that are component part of baccalaureate program adhere to specified classroom contact hours as set forth in law, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Amends 627.736. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance

CS/SB 2496 (2R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity and Senator Fasano—

Military Installations/Pub. Rec.; creates exemption from public records requirements for specified records re military installations &military missions subject to U.S. Dept. of Defense Base Realignment & Closure 2005 process & agreements & proposals to relocate or realign military units & missions which are held by Governor's Advisory Council on Base Realignment & Closure, Enterprise Florida, Inc., or Tourism, Trade, & Economic Development Office, etc. Creates 288.982. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Military and Veterans' Affairs, Base Protection, and Spaceports, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules and Calendar CS/CS/SB 2520 (2R) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, Military and Veterans' Affairs, Base Protection, and Spaceports and Senator Jones—

Fla. Wrek-reation Diving Trail Act; provides popular name of Great Florida Wrek-reation Diving Trail Act; creates Florida MARAD & U.S. Navy Vessel Placement Commission within Tourism, Trade, & Economic Development Office; provides membership, organization, administrative support, & duties of commission; provides that commission is subject to public records & public meetings requirements; requires commission to request & receive interagency comments, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably, with two amendments, by the Committee on Natural Resources and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Military and Veterans' Affairs, Base Protection, and Spaceports, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity

CS/SB 2562 (2R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Dockery—

Money Transmitters; defines term "unsafe & unsound practice" for purposes of Money Transmitters' Code to include failure to comply with specified provisions of Federal Regulations Code re money & finance; includes business by electronic transfer in business that registrants who sell or issue payment instruments or transmit funds may conduct, etc. Amends 560.103,.109,.114,.129,.208. Effective Date: Upon becoming law

Lake Okeechobee Protection Program; provides legislative findings & intent re implementation & funding of Lake Okeechobee Watershed Phosphorus Control Program & Lake Okeechobee Protection Program; provides for implementation & funding of Lake Okeechobee Protection Plan. Amends 373.4595. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

CS/SB 2696 (2R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Atwater—

Insurance/Public Construction; defines terms; limits authority of certain public agencies to purchase owner-controlled insurance programs for public construction projects; establishes purchase requirements; requires insurers issuing commercial general liability policies to offer coverage for completed operations liability for certain contractors to extent that coverage is not provided under owner-controlled insurance program, etc. Creates 255.0517, 627.441. Effective Date: 10/01/2004.

SB 2714 (2R) by Senator Villalobos—

Radio Transmission; prohibits person from making radio transmission in this state unless person obtains license or exemption from licensure from Federal Communications Commission; prohibits unlicensed radio transmission that interferes with licensed public or commercial radio station; provides criminal penalties, etc. Creates 877.27; amends 16.56. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

CS/SB 2720 (2R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity and Senator Atwater—

Public Accountancy; authorizes waiver of certain requirements in excess of baccalaureate degree for applicants for licensure as certified public accountant who meet certain prior employment criteria; requires completion of required continuing education in ethics prior to taking exam required for renewal of license; requires certain amount of continuing education to be in ethics; provides course requirements & requirements for course providers. Amends Ch. 473. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

SB 2726 (2R) by Senator Smith-

Kermit Sigmon Trail/Gainesville; designates State Road 24 Trail from Newell Drive to Southwest 16th Avenue in Gainesville as "Kermit Sigmon Trail"; directs DOT to erect suitable markers. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation

CS/SB 2736 (2R) by the Committee on Finance and Taxation and Senator Lawson—

Taking of Fish & Shellfish; increases fee for trap number required for commercial crawfish trapping; provides for use of portion of fee; clarifies that crawfish traps are included in trap retrieval program of Fish & Wildlife Conservation Commission; assesses crawfish trap owners retrieval fee assessed other trap owners; provides for waiver of retrieval fee under certain circumstances; provides for use of revenues from retrieval fees, etc. Amends 370.14,.143. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Natural Resources and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Finance and Taxation, and withdrawn from the Committees on Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government and Appropriations

CS/SB 2802 (2R) by the Committee on Natural Resources and Senator Dockery—

Permit Authority/Piers/Structures; prohibits DEP from delegating general permit authority to water management districts for construction, extension, or removal of piers or associated structures; reassigns to dept. authority to act on pending applications for permit; rescinds prior delegation of authority by dept. to districts. Amends 403.814. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Natural Resources

CS/CS/SB 2822 (2R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Agriculture and Senator Argenziano—

Private Investigative Services; increases minimum age required for certain licensees; revises agency insurance requirements & limits such requirements to security agencies; requires Agric. & Consumer Services Dept. to establish by rule criteria for approval of continuing education courses & providers & for more for certificates of completion; provides examination fees for private investigators & private investigator interns, etc. Amends Ch. 493. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Agriculture and the Committee on Finance and Taxation, reports the committee substitute favorably and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government and withdrawn from the Committee on Appropriations with subcommittee recommendation

CS/CS/SB 2978 (2R) by the Committee on Appropriations, the Committee on Education and others—

Corporate Tax Credit Scholarship; prohibits certain private schools & other entities & certain students from participating in scholarship program; revises limitations on allocation of annual credits granted under program; requires Auditor General to review certain audits, request certain information, & report to Legislative Auditing Committee any findings of noncompliance; provides for Law Enforcement Dept. to retain & search fingerprint records, etc. Amends 220.187. Effective Date: Upon becoming law

CS/CS/SB 3036 (2R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Education, Senator Carlton and others—

Early Childhood Education; creates Fla. Prekindergarten Education Program; implements s. 1(b) & (c), Art. IX of State Constitution; authorizes parents to enroll their children in program delivered by child development provider, summer program delivered by public school, or school-year program delivered by public school; requires DOE to adopt statewide kindergarten screening; requires certain students to take statewide screening, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

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
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
