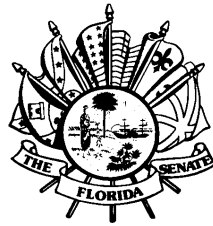

Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

SB 22 (2R) by Senator Hill—

Relief/Kelly & Taylor/Hillsborough; provides for relief of Alana Kelly & Richard F. Taylor, Sr.; compensates them for death of their son, Richard F. Taylor, Jr., caused by negligence of Hillsborough County School Board employee; provides for attorney's fees & costs. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Recommended favorably by The Special Master on Claim Bills and reported favorably by the Committee on Education and reported favorably by the Committee on Finance and Taxation

SB 110 (2R) by Senator Bennett—

Water & Wastewater Systems/Rates; authorizes Fla. Public Service Commission to approve rates allowing utilities to recover full costs of alternative water supply facilities; increases limitation on gross annual revenues under which water or wastewater utility may qualify to obtain staff assistance from said commission in changing rates & charges. Amends 367.081, .0814. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

SB 220 (2R) by Senator Crist—

Official State Flagship; designates official state flagship. Creates 15.0465. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Military and Veterans' Affairs, Base Protection, and Spaceports, and reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity

CS/SB 222 (2R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Crist—

Service of Process; deletes requirement to use certified mail in service of subpoena on witness in specified types of cases; prohibits finding of contempt for failure to appear in response to subpoena that is not certified; provides alternative methods of service on corporation; requires servers of process to provide certain info. on return of service; authorizes party who had distress writ issued to deliver it to sheriff in another county, etc. Amends Ch. 48, 83.13. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and the Committee on Judiciary reports the committee substitute favorably, with two amendments

SB 258 (2R) by Senator Fasano—

Bingo Games; authorizes use of electronics or other technology in lieu of vocal verification for bingo games. Amends 849.0931. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries

CS/SB 262 (2R) by the Committee on Military and Veterans' Affairs, Base Protection, and Spaceports and Senator Fasano—

Tourism; revises membership of Florida Commission on Tourism; revises membership of board of directors of Florida Tourism Industry Marketing Corporation, to conform. Amends 288.1223,.1226. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Commerce, Economic Opportunities, and Consumer Services, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Military and Veterans' Affairs, Base Protection, and Spaceports

SB 282 (2R) by Senator Posey—

Negotiable Instruments; provides additional circumstance under which person not in possession of lost, destroyed, or stolen negotiable instrument may enforce such instrument. Amends 673.3091. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Banking and Insurance, Judiciary, and Commerce, Economic Opportunities, and Consumer Services

SB 296 (2R) by Senator Fasano—

State Liens/Literary Accts./Felon; provides for definitions concerning sale of literary accounts & memorabilia by & on behalf of convicted felon; provides for lien in favor of state on proceeds or profits of sale of literary accounts, materials, & memorabilia payable to or accruing to convicted felon, representative of such felon, or profiteer of felony; provides for distribution of proceeds or profits of such sale, etc. Amends 944.512, 960.291. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Criminal Justice

SB 326 (2R) by Senator Saunders—

Culpable Negligence/DUI; provides that it is first-degree misdemeanor for person to commit culpable negligence by driving vehicle under influence of alcohol or drugs while accompanied in vehicle by person younger than specified age. Amends 784.05. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Criminal Justice and Judiciary

CS/SB 344 (2R) by the Committee on Health, Aging, and Long-Term Care and Senator Saunders—

Massage Therapy Regulation; exempts certain settings where massage therapy is rendered from licensure & inspection requirements for massage establishments. Amends 480.034. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health, Aging, and Long-Term Care, and the Committee on Finance and Taxation, reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 612 (2R) by the Committee on Military and Veterans' Affairs, Base Protection, and Spaceports, Senator Fasano and others—

U.S. Flags/Public School Classroom; requires that flag of United States be displayed in each classroom; provides for purchase or donation of such flags. Amends 1000.06. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Military and Veterans' Affairs, Base Protection, and Spaceports

CS/CS/SB 618 (2R) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, Ethics and Elections, Senator Cowin and others—

Early Voting; requires supervisors of elections to allow electors to vote early; provides requirements for location & number of early voting facilities; specifies period & hours of operation; requires supervisors of elections to provide notice of early voting; provides for periodic examination of equipment during early voting; authorizes Dept. of State to adopt emergency rules for 2004 election cycle, etc. Amends 101.657,.5612,.5613,.62; creates 101.659. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

SB 698 (2R) by Senator Smith—

Parole Commission; requires that, prior to meeting of Parole Commission, victim of crime be given documents & evidence re granting, denying, or revoking of inmate's parole; requires that inmate convicted of kidnapping whose parole release order has been vacated by court be reinterviewed at 5-year intervals following vacated release order, etc. Amends 947.06,.16,.174. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

CS/SB 714 (2R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, Senator Lawson and others—

Herbert F. Morgan Building; designates FAMU-FSU College of Engineering Building as "Herbert F. Morgan Building"; designates student life center at FSU as "Reubin O'D. Askew Student Life Center"; designates university residence hall at FSU as "Sherrill Williams Ragans Hall"; provides for erection of markers. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity

CS/SB 1070 (2R) by the Committee on Communication and Public Utilities and Senator Bennett—

Natural Gas Companies; provides that provisions which govern actions in eminent domain, apply to natural gas transmission pipeline companies that are subject to regulation under federal Natural Gas Act. Amends 361.05. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Communication and Public Utilities, and the Committees on Judiciary and Comprehensive Planning report the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 1086 (2R) by the Committee on Regulated Industries, Senator Geller and others—

Cardrooms; provides definition; authorizes cardroom operators to host high-stakes poker tournaments at certain pari-mutuel facilities; provides limitations. Amends 849.086. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries

CS/SB 1088 (2R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Cowin—

HMO/Provider Contracts/Health Care; requires that health maintenance organization disclose to provider schedule of fees for which said organization & provider of health care services have contracted, including any additional deviations; provides for application. Amends 641.315. Effective Date: 01/01/2005.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Health, Aging, and Long-Term Care, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance

CS/SB 1092 (2R) by the Committee on Health, Aging, and Long-Term Care and Senator Saunders—

Mammograms/Health Insurance Coverage; amends provisions re health insurance policy coverage for mammograms; deletes provisions expressing legislative intent that requirements for such coverage conform to specified practice parameters; repeals provision which requires that AHCA develop, endorse, & implement such parameters. Amends 627.6418, 6613; repeals 408.02. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

CS/SB 1096 (2R) by the Committee on Military and Veterans' Affairs, Base Protection, and Spaceports, Senator Fasano and others—

Korean War Veterans/HS Diploma; amends certain prerequisites to allow award of standard high school diploma to honorably discharged veterans of Korean War who did not complete necessary graduation requirements. Amends 1003.43. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

SB 1116 (2R) by Senator Webster and others—

Health Care Delivery & Research; creates Florida Center for Universal Research to Eradicate Disease within Health Dept.; requires annual report to Governor & Legislature; expands long-term goals of James & Esther King Biomedical Research Program to include cure of specified diseases; creates Florida Cancer Research Cooperative; provides cooperative's mission & duties; creates Florida Public Health Foundation, Inc., etc. Amends 215.5602. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Health, Aging, and Long-Term Care

CS/SB 1122 (2R) by the Committee on Transportation, Senator Sebesta and others—

Andrew J. Aviles Trail; designates Old Gandy access road in Hillsborough Co. from Gandy Boulevard to Friendship Trail Bridge as "Andrew J. Aviles Trail"; directs DOT to erect suitable markers. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation

CS/SB 1124 (2R) by the Committee on Health, Aging, and Long-Term Care, Senator Peaden and others—

Dermatological Services; requires dermatologist to directly supervise person who is not licensed to practice medicine or certified to practice advanced level nursing while that person performs specified services; defines terms; requires dermatologist to directly supervise person who is not licensed to practice osteopathic medicine or certified to practice advanced level nursing while that person performs specified services; defines terms. Creates 458.3245, 459.0126. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health, Aging, and Long-Term Care

SB 1206 (2R) by Senator Webster—

Chop Shops/Airbags; includes airbags & airbag assemblies within definition of term "major component part" for purposes of provisions prohibiting operation of chop shop & authorizing seizure & forfeiture of parts & vehicles. Amends 812.16. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Criminal Justice and Transportation

CS/SB 1364 (2R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity and Senator Fasano—

Governor's Medal of Merit; authorizes Governor to present Governor's Medal of Merit to resident of this state who has rendered exceptional meritorious service or who is serving, or who has been honorably discharged from service, in the United States Armed Forces, Florida National Guard, or United States Reserve Forces & , while on active duty, rendered exceptional meritorious service; limits presentation to one medal per individual, etc. Amends 250.10. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Military and Veterans' Affairs, Base Protection, and Spaceports, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity

SB 1532 (2R) by Senator Lee—

Official Florida Statutes; adopts Florida Statutes 2004 & designates portions thereof that are to constitute official law of state; provides that Florida Statutes 2004 shall be effective immediately upon publication; provides that general laws enacted during August 12-13, 2003, Special Session & prior thereto & not included in Florida Statutes 2004 are repealed, etc. Amends 11.2421, .2422, .2424, .2425. Effective Date: 60 days after sine die.

SB 1534 (2R) by Senator Lee—

Florida Statutes; deletes provisions that have expired, have become obsolete, have had their effect, have served their purpose, or have been impliedly repealed or superseded; replaces incorrect cross-references & citations; corrects grammatical, typographical, & like errors; removes inconsistencies, redundancies, & unnecessary repetition in statutes; improves clarity of statutes & facilitates their correct interpretation, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 60 days after sine die.

SB 1536 (2R) by Senator Lee—

Florida Statutes; repeals specified provisions, all of which provisions have become inoperative by noncurrent repeal or expiration & , pursuant to s. 11.242(5)(b) & (i), may be omitted from Florida Statutes 2004 only through reviser's bill duly enacted by Legislature; repeals specified provision to confirm October 2, 2003, repeal of exemption in accordance with Open Government Sunset Review Act of 1995. Repeals FS. Effective Date: 60 days after sine die.

SB 1538 (2R) by Senator Lee—

Florida Statutes; amends specified provisions to conform to directive in s. 1, ch. 93-199, Laws of Florida, to remove gender-specific references applicable to human beings from Florida Statutes without substantive change in legal effect. Amends 627.6515, 766.1015. Effective Date: 60 days after sine die.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Rules and Calendar

CS/SB 2002 (2R) by the Committee on Appropriations, Senator Peaden and others—

Health Care Initiatives; authorizes Health Dept. to issue chiropractic medicine faculty certificate for certain faculty who have accepted appointment at publicly funded state university or college; authorizes chiropractic medicine degree program at FSU; renames Fla. Alzheimer's Center & Research Institute as Johnnie B. Byrd, Sr., Alzheimer's Center & Research Institute; designates Life Sciences Bldg. at FSU as "James E. 'Jim' King, Jr., Building", etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

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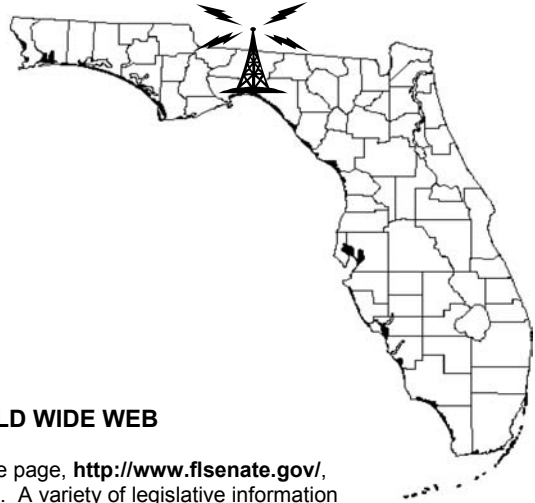
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
