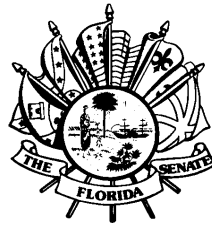

Construction Contracting; requires Landscape Architecture Bd. to prescribe, by rule, one or more forms of seal for use by registered landscape architect who holds valid certificate of registration; authorizes Class A or Class B air-conditioning contractors to disconnect or reconnect liquefied petroleum gas line changeouts; deletes prohibition against mechanical contractors or plumbing contractors performing work on liquefied petroleum gas lines, etc. Amends Chs. 481, 489. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

SB 2726 (2R) by Senator Smith—

Kermit Sigmon Trail/Gainesville; designates State Road 24 Trail from Newell Drive to Southwest 16th Avenue in Gainesville as "Kermit Sigmon Trail"; directs DOT to erect suitable markers. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

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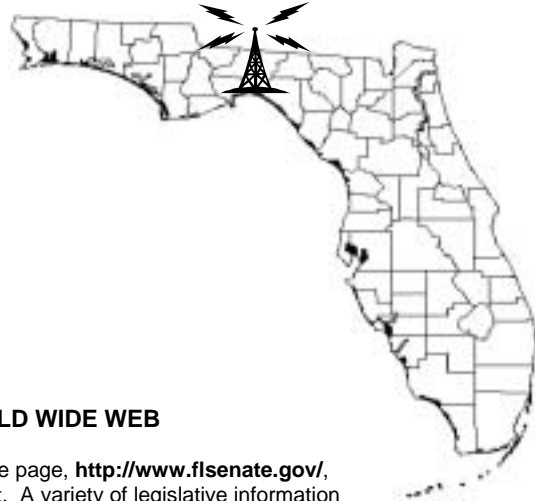
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
