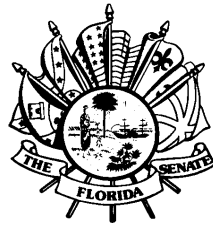

Adult Entertainment Establishments; revises prohibition against locating adult entertainment establishment within specified distance from school; requires that such establishment be approved by county or municipality & district school board. Amends 847.0134. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning and the Committee on Education reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 654 (2R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, Senator Fasano and others—

Firefighter & Police Pensions; authorizes DOR to create & maintain database for use by insurers that report & remit excise tax on property insurance premiums & on casualty insurers premiums; provides incentives to insurers for using database & penalties for failure to use database; defines term "extra benefits" re pension plans for firefighters; provides for meaning of term "extra benefits" re pension plans for municipal police officers, etc. Amends Chs. 175, 185. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, and the Committee on Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government reports the committee substitute favorably and withdrawn from the Committee on Appropriations with subcommittee recommendation

CS/CS/CS/SB's 672, SB 680 (2R) by the Committees on Comprehensive Planning, Banking and Insurance, Regulated Industries, Senators Constantine and Smith—

Emergency Elevator Access; (THIS BILL COMBINES S672,680) provides requirements re regional emergency elevator access; requires elevators in certain newly constructed or certain substantially improved buildings to be keyed alike within each of state emergency response regions; creates Elevator Safety Technical Advisory Council within Hotels & Restaurants Div. of DBPR; authorizes county or municipality to assess reasonable fee for inspections, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

SB 698 (2R) by Senator Smith—

Parole Commission; requires that, prior to meeting of Parole Commission, victim of crime be given documents & evidence re granting, denying, or revoking of inmate's parole; requires that inmate convicted of kidnapping whose parole release order has been vacated by court be reinterviewed at 5-year intervals following vacated release order, etc. Amends 947.06, .16, .174. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

CS/SB 714 (2R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, Senator Lawson and others—

Herbert F. Morgan Building; designates FAMU-FSU College of Engineering Building as "Herbert F. Morgan Building"; designates student life center at FSU as "Reubin O'D. Askew Student Life Center"; designates university residence hall at FSU as "Sherrill Williams Ragans Hall"; provides for erection of markers. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity

CS/SB 1086 (2R) by the Committee on Regulated Industries, Senator Geller and others—

Cardrooms; provides definition; authorizes cardroom operators to host high-stakes poker tournaments at certain pari-mutuel facilities; provides limitations. Amends 849.086. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries

CS/SB 1088 (2R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Cowin—

HMO/Provider Contracts/Health Care; requires that health maintenance organization disclose to provider schedule of fees for which said organization & provider of health care services have contracted, including any additional deviations; provides for application. Amends 641.315. Effective Date: 01/01/2005.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Health, Aging, and Long-Term Care, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance

CS/SB 1092 (2R) by the Committee on Health, Aging, and Long-Term Care and Senator Saunders—

Mammograms/Health Insurance Coverage; amends provisions re health insurance policy coverage for mammograms; deletes provisions expressing legislative intent that requirements for such coverage conform to specified practice parameters; repeals provision which requires that AHCA develop, endorse, & implement such parameters. Amends 627.6418, .6613; repeals 408.02. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health, Aging, and Long-Term Care, and the Committee on Banking and Insurance, reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 1094 (2R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Campbell—

Vehicle Insurance Costs/Biometrics; defines terms "biometrics" & "biometric time date technology"; provides presumption & revises procedure re use of biometric time date technology under personal injury protection benefits. Amends 627.732, .736. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance

SB 1116 (2R) by Senator Webster and others—

Health Care Delivery & Research; creates Florida Center for Universal Research to Eradicate Disease within Health Dept.; requires annual report to Governor & Legislature; expands long-term goals of James & Esther King Biomedical Research Program to include cure of specified diseases; creates Florida Cancer Research Cooperative; provides cooperative's mission & duties; creates Florida Public Health Foundation, Inc., etc. Amends 215.5602. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Health, Aging, and Long-Term Care

CS/SB 1122 (2R) by the Committee on Transportation, Senator Sebesta and others—

Andrew J. Aviles Trail; designates Old Gandy access road in Hillsborough Co. from Gandy Boulevard to Friendship Trail Bridge as "Andrew J. Aviles Trail"; directs DOT to erect suitable markers. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation

SB 1206 (2R) by Senator Webster—

Chop Shops/Airbags; includes airbags & airbag assemblies within definition of term "major component part" for purposes of provisions prohibiting operation of chop shop & authorizing seizure & forfeiture of parts & vehicles. Amends 812.16. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Criminal Justice and Transportation

CS/SB 1310 (2R) by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning and Senator Jones—

Developments of Regional Impact; requires that individual use & multiuse guidelines & standards be increased in specified areas if one land use of multiuse development is residential & amounts to not less than specified percentage of jurisdiction's residential threshold; revises provisions governing substantial deviation standards for date of buildout of development. Amends 380.06. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules and Calendar

CS/SB 1328 (2R) by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning and Senator Constantine—

Construction Practices Review; requires Florida Building Commission to review construction practices & building inspections in this state & to make recommendations for improvement of those practices & inspections; provides procedures for review; requires commission to report to Governor & legislative leaders. Effective Date: 07/01/2004.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries and the Committee on Comprehensive Planning reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 1342 (2R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity and Senator Constantine—

Elevator Safety Technical Council; creates council within Hotels & Restaurants Div. of DBPR; provides for membership of council; requires council to provide technical assistance to division; provides for appointments & terms of office; provides for payment of per diem & travel expenses; repeals provision re former Elevator Safety Technical Advisory Committee. Creates 399.1061; repeals 399.106. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity

SB 1406 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary—

Joint Legislative Committee/Art. V; repeals provision which created Joint Legislative Committee on Article V & charged committee with implementing Revision 7 to Article V of State Constitution. Repeals 11.75. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Judiciary and Governmental Oversight and Productivity

CS/SM 1504 (2R) by the Committee on Natural Resources, Senator Pruitt and others—

Indian River Lagoon Restoration Plan; urges United States Army Corps of Engineers to complete work on Indian River Lagoon Restoration Plan & forward it to Congress for authorization & urges federal officials to keep said plan on schedule & present it without further delay for Congressional authorization in 2004.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Natural Resources and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules and Calendar

CS/SB 1572 (2R) by the Committee on Children and Families and Senator Fasano—

Child Care Personnel Training; requires child care personnel to be trained in recognizing & preventing shaken baby syndrome, preventing sudden infant death syndrome, & understanding early childhood brain development. Amends 402.305. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children and Families

SM 1602 (2R) by Senator Wise—

U. S. Navy Warship/Charles Bennett; urges Congress to request that Secretary of the Navy name a future United States Navy warship the "USS Charles E. Bennett" in honor of United States Representative Bennett who died on September 6, 2003, at age of 92.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Military and Veterans' Affairs, Base Protection, and Spaceports, and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules and Calendar

CS/SB 1608 (2R) by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning—

Public Nuisances; clarifies uses of property that constitute public nuisance; specifies period that property may be closed; provides notice requirements; prescribes certain procedures before complaint may be filed with nuisance abatement board; provides that certain parties may be named as respondents in complaint; provides for closure of property only if use of property materially contributes to nuisance, etc. Amends 893.138. Effective Date: 10/01/2004.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning and the Committee on Judiciary reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 1620 (2R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice and others—

Firearms/Sale & Delivery; delays, until October 1, 2009, repeal of provisions requiring criminal history record check by FDLE prior to sale or delivery of firearm to person other than licensed importer, manufacturer, dealer, or collector. Amends 790.065. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice

SM 1888 (2R) by Senator Dockery—

Defense Appropriations Bill; commends Congress of United States for making our nation's defense its first priority in 2002, & is requested to continue this important tradition by passing & enacting Defense Appropriations Legislation before all other spending bills in 2004 & in future years.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Home Defense, Public Security, and Ports, and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules and Calendar

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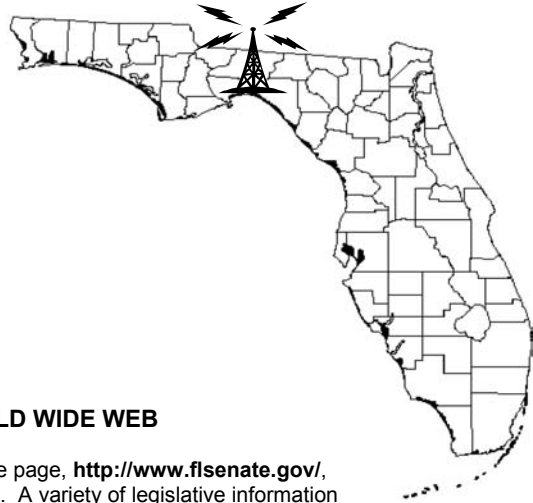
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
