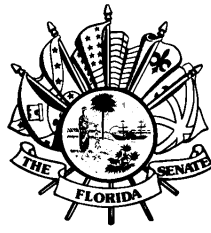

BILLS ON THIRD READING

ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITIES POLICY AND CALENDAR COMMITTEE [EPCC] GROUPING

CS/SB's 2730, SB 1596 (3R) by the Committee on Regulated Industries, Senators Joyner and Constantine—

Residential Tenancies; (THIS BILL COMBINES S2730 & S1596) allows landlord to terminate rental agreement & recover liquidated damages or charge tenant early termination fee for breach of agreement, or both, under certain circumstances; requires tenant to indicate acceptance of early termination fee or liquidated-damages provision in rental agreement in order for provision to take effect; provides limit on combined total of damages & fee, etc. Amends 83.43,.595. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 20, 2007

CS/SB 1900 (3R) by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Baker—

Specialty License Plates; discontinues annual use fee for Girl Scout license plate; increases annual use fee for Sea Turtle & Fla. Sheriffs Youth Ranches license plate; establishes annual use fees for Fla. NASCAR, Corrections Foundation, Protect Fla. Springs, & Trees Are Cool license plates; authorizes use of specified percentage of proceeds from sale of Fla. Educational license plate for marketing & promotion expenses, etc. Amends Ch. 320. Effective Date: 10/01/2007 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on April 20, 2007

LAW AND JUSTICE POLICY AND CALENDAR COMMITTEE [LPCC] GROUPING

CS/HB 449 (3R) by the Safety & Security Council, Representative Snyder and others—

Criminal Offenses/State of Emergency; provides enhanced penalties for burglaries of authorized emergency vehicles; provides enhanced penalties for specified burglaries that are committed during state of emergency declared by Governor & facilitated by conditions arising from emergency; provides enhanced penalties for theft of certain property stolen during state of emergency declared by Governor & facilitated by conditions arising from emergency, etc. Amends 810.02, 812.014, 921.0022. Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

*Substituted for **CS/SB 214 (SUB)** (Aronberg) and read the second time on April 25, 2007*

RESPONSIBLE REGULATION POLICY AND CALENDAR COMMITTEE [RPCC] GROUPING

CS/CS/CS/SB 2054 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Communications and Public Utilities, Environmental Preservation and Conservation and the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation (Saunders)—

Environmental Protection; creates penalties for violation of rules adopted under State Parks & Preserves chapter & for specified activities within boundaries of state park; provides statewide consistency for water quality standards in NFWFMD; ratifies wetland rule & amends it to include certain plant species approved by Environmental Reg. Comm.; provides for revision of water pollution operation permits, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

Read the second time and amended on April 25, 2007

HB 549 (3R) by Representative Traviesa and others—

Power Plants/Integrated Gasification; revises definitions re certain power plants to include integrated gasification combined cycle power plants; requires PSC to implement rules re integrated gasification combined cycle power plant cost recovery; requires report; requires consideration of renewable energy sources & technologies & conservation measures in power plant siting determinations, etc. Amends 366.93, 403.502, .519. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

**ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITIES POLICY AND
CALENDAR COMMITTEE [EPCC] GROUPING**

CS/SB 1206 (3R) by the Committee on Commerce and Senator Atwater—

Warranty Responsibility/MV Dealers; provides that reasonable compensation for work, including labor & parts, is same under warranty as under other circumstances unless motor vehicle manufacturer, distributor, or importer demonstrates that charges are proper; prohibits motor vehicle manufacturer, distributor, or importer from imposing charge on motor vehicle dealer for warranty work & certain products. Amends 320.696. Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

Read the second time on April 26, 2007

CS/CS/CS/SB 2434 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Finance and Tax, Regulated Industries and Senator Geller—

Electronic Gaming Machines; provides powers & duties of DOL pertaining to video lottery games; prohibits certain persons from playing video lottery games; provides compulsive gambling programs; deletes requirement that Pari-mutuel Wagering Div. annually adjust amount of bond supplied by slot machine licensee; increases number of slot machines licensee may make available for play, etc. Amends Chs. 24, 551, 212.02, 849.15. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 26, 2007

CS/CS/SB's 352, SB 240 (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Banking and Insurance, Senators Margolis, Bullard and others—

Real Property Fraud; (THIS BILL COMBINES S352 & S240) defines term "mortgage lending process"; specifies elements of offense of real property fraud; provides that such offense is third-degree felony; provides for venue re committed offense; provides penalties. Creates 817.545. Effective Date: 10/01/2007.

Read the second time on April 26, 2007

CS/CS/SB 1880 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Banking and Insurance, Senator Posey and others—

Motor Vehicle Insurance; requires DFS & Insurance Regulation Office to conduct comprehensive review of Fla. Motor Vehicle No-Fault Law; requires state attorneys in certain judicial circuits to provide information to department concerning violations of said law; abrogates repeal of Fla. Motor Vehicle No-Fault Law as provided for in that section; reenacts specified provisions re Fla. Motor Vehicle No-Fault Law, & provides for future review, etc. Reenacts various ss. of Ch. 627. Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

Read the second time and amended on April 26, 2007

CS/CS/SB 482 (3R) by the Committees on Finance and Tax, Health Policy and Senator Fasano—

Motor Vehicle Registration Forms; revises provisions re voluntary check-off on motor vehicle registration & renewal application forms to distribute funds to Miami Heart Research Institute, Inc.; authorizes voluntary checkoff on motor vehicle registration & renewal application forms to distribute \$1 to Children's Hearing Help Fund. Amends 320.02. Effective Date: 10/01/2007.

Read the second time and amended on April 26, 2007

*Identical to **CS/HB 615 (HC)** in the Committees on Transportation, Health Policy, Finance and Tax, and Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations*

CS/SB 670 (3R) by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Fasano—

Pedestrian Safety in Crosswalks; requires driver to stop at certain intersections to allow pedestrian to cross roadway when pedestrian is either in crosswalk or steps into crosswalk; provides penalties. Amends 316.075, .130. Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

Read the second time on April 26, 2007

CS/CS/SB's 1038, SB 218 (3R) by the Committees on Finance and Tax, Regulated Industries, Senators Jones, Geller and others—

Slot Machine Gaming; (THIS BILL COMBINES CS/S1038 & S218) redefines term "slot machine revenues"; provides procedures for temporary occupational licenses; exempts slot machine manufacturers & distributors, certain educational facilities, the division, & FDLE from certain prohibitions against possessing slot machines at place other than licensee's facility under certain circumstances; increases hours that slot machine gaming areas may be open, etc. Amends Ch. 551, 849.15. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 26, 2007

CS/SB 1844 (3R) by the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator Ring—

Homeowner's Associations; provides that parcel owner is liable for all assessments on parcel; provides for payment of interest & late fees on unpaid assessments; prioritizes application of any payment received; prohibits placement of restriction statement on payment; provides for filing of claim of lien for unpaid assessments; provides for foreclosure of lien; provides for notice to owner; provides for qualifying offer from owner. Creates 720.3085. Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

Read the second time and amended on April 26, 2007

CS/CS/SB 902 (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Regulated Industries and Senator Jones—

Community Associations; provides for revival of certain covenants that have lapsed; prohibits local governments from limiting access of certain persons to beaches adjacent to or adjoining condominium property; requires association to provide certain information to prospective purchasers or lienholders; provides for architectural control covenants & parcel owner improvements; revises provisions re dispute resolution, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2007 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time on April 26, 2007

SB 134 (3R) by Senator Bullard—

Cardrooms/Dominoes; provides for cardrooms to conduct games of dominoes; revises definitions; defines term "dominoes". Amends 849.086. Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

Read the second time on April 26, 2007

CS/CS/CS/SB's 752, CS/SB 1192 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Finance and Tax, Regulated Industries, Senators Geller and Fasano—

Cardrooms; (THIS BILL COMBINES CS/CS/S752 & CS/S1192) defines term "tournament"; clarifies that provisions authorizing cardrooms do not authorize video poker or certain other games or machines; revises license fees; revises hours of operation; authorizes award of certain prizes; revises betting limits; authorizes tournaments; provides tournament requirements; authorizes additional positions. Amends 849.086. Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

Read the second time and amended on April 26, 2007

SB 1562 (3R) by Senator Saunders—

All-terrain Vehicles; authorizes local government to limit use of all-terrain vehicles to designated unpaved roadways under certain conditions. Amends 316.2123. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 26, 2007

CS/HB 707 (3R) by the Economic Expansion & Infrastructure Council, Representative Taylor and others—

Lights on Motor Vehicles; revises provisions restricting use of certain colored lights; provides for lights on vehicles owned or leased by private security agencies; removes reference to watch, guard, & patrol agencies licensed under specified provisions. Amends 316.2397. Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

*Substituted for **SB 1780 (SUB)** (Baker) and read the second time on April 26, 2007*

CS/CS/SB 612 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Commerce, Senator Crist and others—

Wrecker Services; provides for regulatory oversight of wrecker services by DOACS; creates Wrecker Operator Advisory Council within DOACS; directs council to prepare recommendations re education & training & present recommendations to Legislature and Commissioner of Agriculture; requires wrecker companies to register annually with DOACS; authorizes counties & municipalities to enact ordinances governing wrecker operators, etc. Amends & Reenacts FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2007 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time on April 26, 2007

CS/SB 314 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Geller—

Condominiums; substantially revises provisions re termination of condominium form of ownership of property; provides grounds for termination; waives certain notice requirements following natural disasters; provides requirements for plan of termination; provides procedure for contesting plan of termination; provides rules for distribution of property & sale proceeds; allows creation of another condominium by trustee, etc. Amends 718.117. Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

Read the second time on April 26, 2007

SB 320 (3R) by Senator King—

Trespass/Posted Land/Railroads; provides that property that is owned or leased by railroad or railway company does not have to satisfy definition of "posted land" in order to obtain benefits of specified provisions in certain circumstances; reenacts provision re trespass on property other than structure or conveyance, for purpose of incorporating amendment in reference thereto. Amends 810.011; reenacts 810.09(1)(a). Effective Date: 10/01/2007.

Read the second time on April 26, 2007

*Similar to **HB 9 (HC)** in the Committees on Transportation and Criminal Justice*

CS/SB 1722 (3R) by the Committee on Transportation, Senator Baker and others—

Motor Vehicle Dealers; revises provisions for grounds for denial, suspension, or revocation of license of motor vehicle manufacturer, factory branch, distributor, or importer licensed by HSMV to enter into franchise agreements with dealers; revises procedures for determination that discontinuation, cancellation, or nonrenewal of franchise agreement by applicant or licensee is unfair, etc. Amends 320.64,.641. Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

Read the second time on April 26, 2007

*Similar to **CS/HB 815 (HC)** in the Committees on Transportation and Commerce*

CS/SB 2180 (3R) by the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator Bennett—

Trespass/Construction Site; defines term "construction site" for specified purposes; revises provisions re trespassing on construction site; provides for signage to notify public of covered construction site; revises definition of terms "authorized person" or "person authorized". Amends 810.011,.09. Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

Read the second time and amended on April 26, 2007

*Similar to **CS/HB 1185 (HC)** in the Committees on Regulated Industries and Criminal Justice*

CS/CS/SB 920 (3R) by the Committees on Higher Education, Regulated Industries and Senator Wise—

Cosmetology; revises registration & licensure requirements re cosmetology services; redefines "cosmetology" to include hair technician, esthetician, & nail technician services; defines terms "cosmetology intern" & "internship sponsor", etc. Amends Ch. 477; creates 477.0131,.0231; repeals 477.0201. Effective Date: 07/01/2008 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time on April 26, 2007

CS/CS/CS/SB 2488 (3R) by the Committees on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Commerce, Transportation, Senator Haridopolos and others—

RV Manufacturers/Distributors/Dealers/Importers; provides requirements for manufacturer/dealer agreement; provides requirements & procedures for termination, cancellation, or nonrenewal of manufacturer/dealer agreement by manufacturer or dealer; provides for change in ownership by dealer; provides for dealer to name family member as successor in case of retirement, incapacitation, or death of dealer, etc. Creates 320.3201-.3211; amends 320.8225. Effective Date: 10/01/2007.

Read the second time on April 26, 2007

*Similar to **HB 7205 (HC)** in the Committees on Transportation, Commerce, and Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations*

RESPONSIBLE REGULATION POLICY AND CALENDAR COMMITTEE [RPCC] GROUPING

CS/CS/HB 529 (3R) by the Policy & Budget Council, the Jobs & Entrepreneurship Council, Representative Traviesa and others—

Cable TV/Video Service Franchises; cites act as "Consumer Choice Act of 2007"; prohibits counties & municipalities from negotiating terms & conditions re cable & video services; deletes authorization for counties & municipalities to award cable service franchises & restriction that cable service companies not operate without such franchise; designates Dept. of State as authorizing authority; requires DOACS to receive customer service complaints, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Substituted for **CS/CS/CS/SB 998 (SUB)** (Bennett), read the second time and amended on April 26, 2007*

CS/CS/CS/SB 1980 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Governmental Operations, Environmental Preservation and Conservation and the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation (Saunders)—

Wildlife Management & Saltwater Fisheries; increases annual use fee for Sea Turtle specialty license plate; deletes suspension of stone crab endorsements for first violations; prohibits unauthorized possession of blue crab trap gear or removal of said trap contents & provides penalties therefor; clarifies provisions regulating spiny lobsters; requires FWC to adopt & publish rule establishing due process procedures, etc. Amends Chs. 320, 370, 372, 861, 20; reenacts 380.511(1)(c). Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

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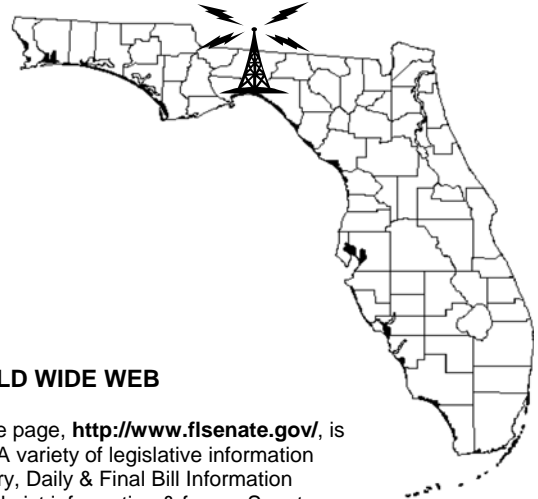
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
